The Los Angeles County Governance Reform Task Force (GRTF) is publishing this notice to inform the public of the process and questions that will be used to interview candidates for appointment to the Los Angeles County Ethics Commission. The same interview format and initial questions will be used for each candidate to help ensure a consistent and transparent process. Interviews will be conducted during a public GRTF meeting and recorded.

Interview Process

Candidate interviews will be conducted in alphabetical order by last name. Because the exact start time for each individual interview cannot be determined in advance, candidates are asked to remain available throughout the duration of the interview agenda item. Candidates will be called for their interviews in order.

Each candidate interview will last approximately 20 minutes and will consist of two parts:

Part 1: Opening Remarks and Responses to Four Questions (5 minutes)

Each candidate will have a total of five minutes to address the four questions listed below as part of their opening remarks.

Part 2: GRTF Member Q&A (15 minutes)

Following each candidate's opening remarks, GRTF members will have an opportunity to ask additional questions. Candidates will have up to one minute to respond to each follow-up question.

Interview Questions

During opening remarks, each candidate will be asked to address the following four questions:

1. Why do you want to serve on the Los Angeles County Ethics Commission, and what do you hope to contribute?
2. What skills, experience, and perspective would you bring to the Commission?
3. The Ethics Commission and the Office of Ethics Compliance it oversees are being established for the first time this year. What do you see as the Commission's most important responsibilities in its first year, and how would you approach your role as a Commissioner in helping to establish these new institutions?
4. What else would you like the Task Force to know?
