Breathe: LA County's Guaranteed Income Program

Original Pilot Background

- 1,000 residents to receive \$1,000 a month for 3 years and launched in 2022
- Partnering with University of Pennsylvania and UCLA to study participants' health and well-being
- Equity Explorer Tool identified communities with the highest need
- Secured waivers to protect an estimated \$5 million in CalWORKs & CalFresh benefits for participants

Breathe Expansions

- The first expansion of Breathe in 2023 provided \$1,000 a month for 2 years to 200 former foster youth
- The second expansion of Breathe, launching in October of 2024, will provide \$500 a month for 18-months to over 2,000 foster youth in care between the ages of 18 and 21

Original Application Process

- More than 50 drop-in centers were set up at community agencies across the County
- Apply using smartphones, tablets, computers, drop-in centers, or over the phone
- Application offered in 21 written languages and
 30 oral indigenous languages



Enrollment

- All First Payments Made between June 15th and August 15th
- All 1,000 Participants are Now Enrolled







Expected Participant Outcomes

- Financially more stable and better able to weather economic swings
- Experiencing lower levels of stress, anxiety, and depression
- Having the time to complete deferred schooling or skills training
- Reducing disparities in income and employment

Next Steps

- Joining the national discussion on rethinking how we help people and help them take advantage of key opportunities
- Developing a meta evaluation for LA County GI programs



LA County's Additional Guaranteed Income Programs

Breathe Expansion - Former LA County DCFS Foster Youth

- Expanded Breathe with 200 LA County former foster youth in August and September 2023
- Each youth is receiving \$1,000 per month for 2 years

DPSS TAYportunity

- Provides \$1,000 to 300 youth enrolled in the General Relief program for 3 years
- Offers voluntary financial and employment coaching through their TAYportunity program

DPH Abundant Birth - Los Angeles

• Will provide \$807 m onthly stipends for 18 m onths to 400 pregnant people in LA County at risk of experiencing the most adverse birth outcomes
