59-B. Healthcare for Contracted Employees

Recommendation as submitted by Supervisors Hahn and Solis: Direct the Chief Executive Officer, with the Directors of Health Services and Internal Services, and County Counsel, to continue to implement all of the directives as required in Board Order No. 5 of April 4, 2023 entitled, "Equitable Access to Healthcare for Contracted Employees," and require all established, existing, renewed, and extended Proposition A contracts for security, environmental, including janitorial, and food services at County Hospitals managed by the Department of Health Services to require 100% employer-paid healthcare premiums for employees who work 30 hours or more per week at the minimum actuarial value of the Gold Plan, with this requirement, once adopted, to be implemented no later than March 31, 2024, or sooner; and authorize the Director of Health Services, to negotiate and execute amendments to existing Proposition A contracts for security, environmental, including janitorial, and food services, to add the above requirements to the contract, and increase the contract rates, or maximum County obligation, if any, as necessary to ensure there is no service interruption, with the new requirements under the amendment to begin on a negotiated date, or within 30 days after amendment execution, and report back to the Board in writing in 45 days, and then monthly, on the implementation of the above mentioned directives, including the status of the policy implemented on December 31, 2023 and the status of the above directives. 59-C. Support Faith-Based Organizations and Nonprofit Colleges Interested in Developing Affordable Housing

Recommendation as submitted by Supervisors Solis and Horvath:

Host a summit for faith-based organizations (FBOs) and nonprofit colleges based in unincorporated Los Angeles County to help guide those interested in utilizing Senate Bill 4 (Weiner), the Affordable Housing on Faith and Higher Education Lands Act of 2023, to build affordable housing on their underutilized land;

Provide linkages with technical assistance providers to support FBOs and nonprofit colleges interested in building affordable housing on their properties; and
