# Established

More than 40 Years of Aiding School Districts

Established in December 1980, the Legal Assistance Fund is administered by a board of trustees made up of officers of the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB), the Texas Association of School Administrators, and the Texas Council of School Attorneys.

The Fund is designed to assist in litigation involving or affecting member school districts. The general purpose of the Fund is to help school districts defend challenges on issues that have a statewide effect on public schools.



# Assistance

Help to Member School Districts with Briefs and Funding

More than three-fourths of all Texas school districts currently participate in the Legal Assistance Fund. To become members of the Fund, school districts make an annual contribution as follows:

- \$200 (ADA 1,599 or less)
- \$350 (ADA 1,600–5,000)
- \$500 (ADA more than 5,000)

In cases of statewide significance, the Fund provides assistance in the form of *amicus curiae*, or “friend of the court,” briefs and occasional financial assistance. The Fund is not structured to provide boards with day-to-day, routine legal assistance, and membership in the Fund will not replace the need for school boards to retain their regular counsel.

Success Stories


Since its inception, the Fund has filed hundreds of *amicus curiae* briefs on diverse topics affecting public schools. Highly qualified school attorneys from across the state write the Fund’s briefs. These briefs have undoubtedly played an important role in the outcome of many significant court cases affecting public schools. Examples include the following:

- IDEA Child Find (federal court)
- Public Information Act (state court)
- School district liability for student sexual harassment (federal court)
- Employee immunity for student injuries (Texas Supreme Court)
- School district liability for student-to-student violence (federal court)
