Who may volunteer:

- ✓ All ARRT registrants (Imaging Assistant and Limited Technician coming soon!)
- ✓ Those who pass an ethics review and are Board of Trustees approved
- ✓ Currently working in the field
 - *May be eligible for a special project if not currently working in the field*

Educators:

- May volunteer when exam content is NOT being reviewed.
 - Examples:
 1. Practice Analysis committee for disciplines they teach courses for
 2. Any committees for disciplines they work in at least 20% of the time, but do not teach courses for (e.g., you teach radiography courses during the week, but work PRN in CT on the weekends)

Registrants:

- May volunteer for any discipline they hold certification for AND work at least 20% of the time
- This also applies to those in management or administrative positions

Individuals who have recently passed the exam have particularly important insights and are ***strongly encouraged*** to volunteer

Conflicts of Interest:

- Complete a Disclosure Statement when creating a profile and annually, thereafter
 - When in doubt, fill it out! Please document anything that may be a potential conflict

Types of Committees:

- Item writing – attend a 2-day virtual workshop to learn how to write exam questions
- Exam – one or two 2-day meetings per year, virtual or in-person, to review exam questions
- Practice Analysis – three 1 or 2-day meetings in one year to create new discipline documents
- Standard Setting – one 2-day meeting to make a recommendation for the number of questions a registrant needs to get correct to pass the exam

***A \$250 honorarium is paid for each full day of meeting participation
