Education Requirements for candidates following the Primary Eligibility Pathway

- Earn an associate's degree or higher from an institution accredited by a mechanism recognized by ARRT. (a list can be found at arrt.org)
 - If the degree was earned outside of the United States, the transcript ***also*** needs to be evaluated by an academic credential evaluation service. The service must be a member of AICE, CED, and/or NACES. *The degree evaluation is NOT a substitute for accreditation.
- Complete an ARRT-verified educational program in the same discipline as the credential being pursued.

Requalification

All candidates needing to regain eligibility must meet all initial requirements again including completion of an ARRT-verified educational program and holding the required academic degree.

Because most institutions cannot issue the same degree twice, you'll want to work with your institutional leadership and accreditors to evaluate options for developing a requalification program or track. Students must receive a formal award (such as a certificate) that appears on their transcript showing successful completion of all program requirements.

Common Errors Seen on Online Accounts and Applications

- Incorrect social security number entered
- Incorrect spelling of first or last name
- Incorrect discipline entered
- Answering "Yes" to exam accommodations in error
- Not paying attention to timelines
