ABOUT WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Western Australia — it's big, beautiful and billions of years old.

Around the size of Western Europe, WA accounts for one-third of the Australian continent. It boasts over 12,500 kilometres of coastline (20,000 including islands), the world's oldest minerals and a host of natural wonders found nowhere else on Earth.

Of the State's population of 2.7 million people, around three-quarters live in the Perth region. With more than 3,000 hours of sunshine per year, Perth is Australia's sunniest capital city. The city's spectacular natural surroundings are rivalled only by its vibrant city life.

WA's Aboriginal history dates back more than 60,000 years — making it one of the world's oldest living cultures. Almost a third of Western Australians are born overseas and 15 per cent of the population speaks a language other than English at home.

Dreamlike experiences and natural wonders await you in every region of this grand and diverse State, and the varied climate — Mediterranean conditions in the south through to the northern tropics — means you'll always find summer somewhere in WA.



PERTH

Sitting pretty on the banks of the Swan River / Derbarl Yerrigan, Australia's sunniest capital city effortlessly blends urban cool with raw natural beauty. Its heart is bustling with bars, restaurants, hotels, shopping and cultural spaces, and is also home to one of the world's most beautiful inner-city parks. Within 30 minutes of the city centre, visitors can be exploring Western Australia's oldest wine region, experiencing a dreamy Indian Ocean sunset, cycling around an island paradise or exploring Perth's port city of Fremantle / Walyalup.

Perth's sparkling new attractions

An array of new public spaces and revitalised buildings have activated Perth / Boorloo CBD and surrounds. The vibrant waterfront precinct of Elizabeth Quay boasts riverfront views, alfresco and rooftop dining, public art and playgrounds, and luxury hotels. Linking Perth CBD to Northbridge, Yagan Square connects people to place and is a celebration of WA's heritage. A recent multi-million-dollar redevelopment has seen it transform into Stories, a five-storey hospitality mecca with multiple venues catering to all ages. Not to be missed is the spectacular WA Museum Boola Bardip, located in the Perth Cultural Centre. Across the Swan River, connected by the Matagarup Bridge, is the multiple award-winning and worldclass 60,000 seat Optus Stadium, which hosts major sporting events and concerts throughout the year.

A stellar line-up of city beaches

Home to 19 pristine metropolitan beaches, it's easy to find your own piece of paradise to enjoy one of Western Australia's famous coastal sunsets — whether that be from the sand, a picnic area, or one of the coast's many dining options. From Bathers Beach in Fremantle to iconic Cottesloe Beach and popular City Beach — both just 20 minutes from the CBD — Perth really is unlike any other capital city on Earth. Its dazzling stretch of endless sand, crystal-clear blue waters, coastal trails, dune vegetation and sustainable development approach is unparalleled. While taking an ocean dip and relaxing on the sand may be the ideal beach activity for some, the more adventurous can enjoy a range of water sport tours such as jet skiing, sea kayaking, kite surfing, parasailing, and catamaran hire, plus sunset cruises.

Wining and dining

Head into Perth's city centre and its urban hubs of Northbridge, Leederville, Mount Lawley, Victoria Park, Subiaco and South Perth, plus the port city of Fremantle, for an ever-expanding range of small bars, restaurants, breweries and distilleries across rooftops, laneways, heritage-listed buildings and new venues. Just a 30-minute drive from the CBD, or a cruise along the Swan River, will take you to WA's oldest wine region, the Swan Valley. Tantalise your taste buds at over 40 world-class wineries, breweries, cideries, distilleries and gourmet artisan producers. Venture into the Perth Hills to pick fruit from grower's orchards year-round. Celebrate Perth's love affair with the coast by enjoying local seafood and sipping on a cool beverage whilst the sun sets over the Indian Ocean at one of the many coastal dining options.

An island playground

Famous for its laid-back atmosphere and home to 63 beautiful beaches and 20 bays, Rottnest Island / Wadjemup is a unique island paradise located just a short ferry ride from the mainland. Explore the island by scenic flight, segway, skydive, hop-on hop-off bus, walking tour, water taxi or kayak; grab a snorkel or join a tour to discover the abundance of spectacular marine life, and meet the world's friendliest animal — the quokka. The A Class Reserve is a car free zone, and hiring a bicycle is the best way to get around. The island has recently welcomed several new experiences for summer, including the new and refurbished accommodation option, The Lodge Wadjemup, which opened earlier this year.

An eclectic port city

Discover maritime history, a World Heritage-listed prison, café culture, lively bars and hundred-year-old markets in the port city of Fremantle — located less than 30-minutes from Perth CBD. Known as 'Freo' to the locals, here you can explore narrow streets lined with historic buildings, enjoy fresh seafood at the Fremantle Fishing Boat Harbour, sample local brews at one of the many breweries and choose from a variety of funky cafes, boutique bars and top restaurants. Join a guided walking tour or a rickshaw through the streets to discover the city's colourful maritime history, bohemian culture and vibrant street art.

Natural attractions

Overlooking the Swan River and Perth city skyline, the stunning Kings Park and Botanic Garden / Kaarta Komba is one of the largest inner-city parks in the world. At 400 hectares, it's bigger than Central Park in New York, and is home to more than 3,000 species of the State's native flora. Tour its botanic gardens and spring wildflowers solo, or on a guided tour. Alternatively, discover the park's rich culture and history with an Aboriginal guide. Within an hour of Perth's CBD, you can swim with wild dolphins at Rockingham, cruise the estuary and canals in Mandurah / Mandjoogoordap, discover crystal caves in Yanchep National Park or hike the trails in the Perth Hills. A little further afield, take an early morning drive to the Avon Valley for hot air ballooning over farmlands, native bush and fields of flowers.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA'S SOUTH WEST

Here you'll find world-class food and wine, beautiful beaches, surfing, cave systems, tall timber forests, whale-watching, wildflowers, hiking and biking trails, and the famous Margaret River wine region on Wadandi Noongar country. As one of only 36 bio-diversity hotspots on Earth, the South West has thousands of plant species found nowhere else in the world.

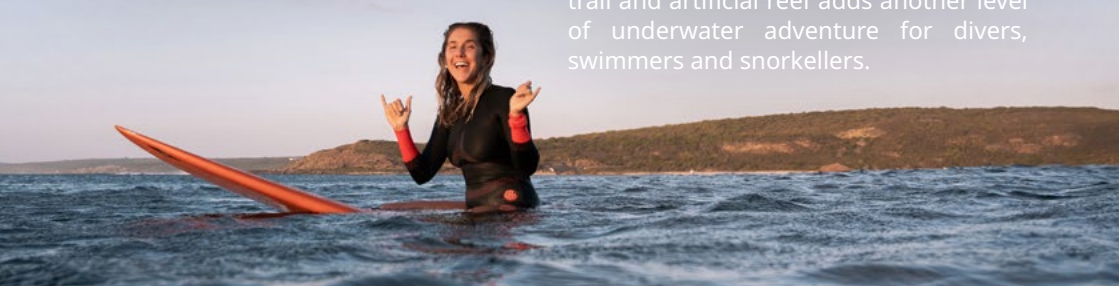
Check out:

World-class wine and fresh local produce

Home to six distinct wine regions including world-famous Margaret River with over 100 cellar doors. Many of the region's wineries have restaurants on site, serving up some of Australia's best 'paddock to plate' fresh produce from the South West. Enjoy fresh marron, trout, venison, chocolates, cheeses, cherries, boutique craft beers and ciders, as well as the rare black truffle — more of them are produced in Manjimup than anywhere else in Australia. Now in its second year, the Pair'd Margaret River Region event will celebrate the culinary delights of the region, coupled with local wines, in November 2025.

Surfing, swimming, snorkelling

The South West is renowned for its spectacular coastlines, sheltered lagoons, consistent surf, effervescent blue lakes, and magnificent swimming beaches. Follow in the footsteps of some of the world's best surfers who flock to the aptly named Surfers Point for the annual Margaret River Pro. For more tranquil conditions, you'll find some of Australia's top swimming spots at Dunsborough, Eagle Bay, Denmark and Albany / Kinjarling. Witness the wonders beneath the water through shipwreck diving or stay dry at the eight metre deep Underwater Observatory, located at the end of the 1.8 kilometre Busselton Jetty. The new underwater sculpture trail and artificial reef adds another level of underwater adventure for divers, swimmers and snorkellers.

Culture, arts and history

Learn more about Aboriginal customs and the history of the South West's first inhabitants by visiting a number of Aboriginal centres, art galleries and tours across the region. Whether it's foraging for traditional bush foods and medicine with the Wiilman people in Harvey / Korijekup, discovering ancient traditions with the Menang people, or experiencing the magic of a live didgeridoo performance inside an underground cave on Wadandi Country. You'll also find exceptional South West artistic talent including painters, sculptors, furniture makers, jewellery designers and hand-blown glass artists. Head to the coastal city of Albany to explore the state's whaling history, as well as the multi award-winning National Anzac Centre for a deeply personal connection with Australia's ANZAC history.

Towering timbers

The South West is also home to giant jarrah, karri, marri and tuart trees, and you can experience a bird's eye view of these towering timbers in the Valley of the Giants. Located between Denmark and Walpole, the world-first 600 metre Tree Top Walk is suspended 40 metres above the forest floor on Menang Noongar country. In the Margaret River Region, the towering karri trees in Boranup Forest offer one of the most dreamy drive trail experiences in the region, while you can soar through the trees on a high ropes and ziplining course in Pemberton.

Wildlife and adventure

Get hiking along the spectacular coastal Cape to Cape Track, the bushland Bibbulmun Track, or out to the Porongurup Range's Granite Skywalk. Take off on two wheels along the Munda Biddi off-road cycling experience, as well as other world-class mountain biking trails through Collie, Margaret River and Nannup. Or head underground at Ngilgi, Mammoth, Lake and Jewel caves to explore mesmerising labyrinths decorated with limestone crystal formations. Above ground at Ngilgi Cave, the Ancient Lands Experience takes visitors on a journey to discover 600 million years of stories associated with the land and its people, on Wadandi Noongar Country. From January to April, take an orca tour from Bremer Bay to see the southern hemisphere's largest orca pod, or visit Koombana Bay to swim with dolphins. Between June and November, witness the annual migration of humpback, southern right and blue whales from the South West's shores, or hop on a whale watching cruise and get up close to these gentle giants. Witness the surging power of the Southern Ocean at The Gap in Torndirrup National Park near Albany and experience the views of one of Australia's most exposed coasts through the nearby Natural Bridge.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA'S GOLDEN OUTBACK

Discover historic townships, spectacular desert wilderness, quirky outback charm, gold-rush history and the Southern Ocean's perfect white beaches.

Check out:

White beaches, islands and rainbow lakes

Esperance / Kepa Kurl is home to not only Australia's whitest beach, but also one of the best beaches in the world — Lucky Bay in Cape Le Grand National Park. For the full outdoor experience, follow the coastal walk trails or set up at some of Australia's most picturesque beachside campsites, and be wowed around every corner along the 40-kilometre Great Ocean Drive. Take a scenic flight over the hundreds of islands in the Recherche Archipelago and be mesmerised by the snow-white sands and dreamy blue hues. Catching the eye of photographers are the rainbow lakes near Esperance, a collection of salt lakes, quite often bubble-gum pink, but change colour regularly — and are a fascinating sight from above.

Australia's largest outdoor gallery

The striking salt flats of Lake Ballard form the backdrop of Inside Australia — a truly unique installation of 51 life-sized steel statues by acclaimed sculptor Antony Gormley, inspired by residents of the nearby town of Menzies on Wongutha country.

Outback station stays

Immerse yourself in the rural life and landscapes of WA, escape the daily hustle and experience country living on a working station or farm. Accommodation ranges from luxury rooms in grand station homesteads to rustic shearing quarters and camping facilities on huge cattle stations. Visit during wildflower season — from July to October — when the rugged outback plains burst into a kaleidoscope of colour.

Wildflowers and wave walking

Wave Rock / Katter Kich, near Hyden on Ballardong country, is a remarkable 110 metre, multi-coloured granite cliff that resembles a huge wave about to crash into the bush. There's also Hippo's Yawn (which resembles a hippo yawning), the Humps, and Mulka's Cave with its collection of Aboriginal rock art. In spring, you'll be surrounded by beautiful blankets of wildflowers in full bloom, with 60 per cent of the species unique to WA.

The unexpected

Journey along the Golden Quest Discovery Trail from Perth to Coolgardie and Laverton, on Wongutha country, to discover fascinating gold-rush history. Highlights include legendary country pubs, the fascinating Gwalia ghost town and Kalgoorlie's / Karlkurla famous Super Pit, one of the world's largest open-cut mines. Experience a touching tribute to man's best friend at the Corrigin Dog Cemetery, country quirkiness along the Tin Horse Highway — a collection of 70 equine artworks in and around Kulin, wheat silos adorned with giant, colourful murals and the world's longest golf course — the 1,365-kilometre Nullarbor Links.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA'S CORAL COAST

Home to incredible marine life, endless stretches of white sandy beaches and the warm waters of the turquoise Indian Ocean. This region covers 1,100 kilometres from Cervantes to Exmouth and boasts two UNESCO World Heritage-listed sites; Ningaloo Marine Park / Nynggulu and Shark Bay / Gathaagudu — all linked via the Coral Coast Highway stretching from Perth to Exmouth.

Experience:

Snorkelling at Ningaloo Reef

Where the outback meets the reef, step off the beach and into the underwater wonderland of the World Heritage-listed Ningaloo Reef /Nynggulu. An absolute must do when visiting Exmouth, Coral Bay or the ocean-side pastoral stations north of Carnarvon. Dive into the pristine turquoise waters to discover more than 500 species of tropical fish and 300 species of colourful coral in one of the most biologically diverse marine environments on the planet.

Swimming with gentle giants

Join a whale shark tour from Exmouth or Coral Bay for the ultimate bucket list wildlife encounter — swimming with the world's largest fish. Whale sharks visit Ningaloo / Nynggulu from March until end of July; then from July to October you can swim with gentle humpback whales as they cruise through. Year round, you can also swim with acrobatic manta rays from Coral Bay, while keeping an eye out for green and loggerhead turtles.

Friendly dolphins and a World Heritage-listed Area

One of the world's most reliable places for witnessing wild dolphins — the curious bottlenose dolphins at Monkey Mia have been playing on the shores of Malgana country for more than 40 years. While in the Shark Bay World Heritage Area, you can also spot sea turtles and dugongs, admire the world's oldest and largest living fossils — Hamelin Pool's stromatolites — and fish, snorkel and dive. Don't miss a trip into Francois Peron National Park, where striking red desert cliffs meet the turquoise sea.

Wildflowers and pink waters

Head inland to explore some of WA's most magnificent wildflower country, particularly between July and October when carpets of blooms paint the landscapes in a kaleidoscope of colour. While spotting some of WA's 12,000 wildflower species, check out the dreamy colours at Hutt Lagoon (Pink Lake) near Port Gregory, where the water can be red, bubble-gum pink or lilac, depending on the conditions. The lagoon is located between other Coral Coast highlights — the seaside city of Geraldton / Jaminu and its diving, snorkelling and fishing drawcard and the Houtman Abrolhos Islands National Park.

Extraordinary rock formations

Experience an otherworldly landscape of incredible limestone spires rising eerily from the sand at the Pinnacles in Nambung National Park. Further up the coast, discover the seaside town of Kalbarri / Wurdimarlu, surrounded by dramatic coastal cliffs and the incredible river gorges in Kalbarri National Park. Step out onto the 100-metre-high Kalbarri Skywalk / Kaju Yatka for breath-taking and uninterrupted views beyond the rim of the Murchison River Gorge. Follow the many walking trails and take a photo through the famous Nature's Window, hike along the dramatic red sandstone gorges or canoe along the flowing river to experience the depths and heights of the 400 million year-old landscapes.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA'S NORTH WEST

A billion years in the making, the North West is one of the world's last true wilderness areas. Here you'll find ancient gorges, thundering waterfalls, remote stretches of coastal paradise and rich Aboriginal culture and history.

Check out:

Otherworldly wonders

Discover Australia's only Horizontal Waterfalls / Garaanngaddim, created when massive tidal movements squeeze through narrow cliff passages. Aerial tours from Broome / Rubibi and Derby enable you to circle the phenomenon from above, alongside other scenic wonders of the Buccaneer Archipelago, where turquoise blue water contrasts with rugged red cliffs. Land nearby on a seaplane and witness the power of these sacred falls, then stay overnight on a houseboat. Discover incredible natural wonders such as the world-famous sunsets at Cable Beach / Walmanyjun, ancient dinosaur footprints, some of the biggest tides in the world and the natural phenomenon of the Staircase to the Moon.

The pearling capital of Australia

A laidback tropical oasis and the western gateway to the Kimberley, Broome is one of the world's finest producers of Australian South Sea pearls. Broome's unique pearling history dates to the late 1800s, when workers from Indonesia, Malaysia, China, Japan and Europe flocked to the town for the prized *Pinctada maxima* oyster and its mother of pearl shell. Today Broome is one of the world's finest producers of Australian South Sea pearls. Its fascinating history coupled with the culture of the local Aboriginal people offer a truly unique melting pot of Aboriginal and Asian heritage. Pearl farm tours offer an insight into the history and process of modern pearl farming or visit the pearl showrooms in historic Chinatown and take home your own piece of pearl jewellery. Celebrate Broome's unique multicultural and pearling history at the annual Shinju Matsuri (festival of the pearl), held during August and September each year.

Aboriginal experiences

The North West offers a range of profound Aboriginal tours to experience the world's oldest living culture. Join an Aboriginal guide to explore ancient rock art galleries, forage for bush tucker, go mud crabbing, spear fishing and listen to Dreamtime stories. Located throughout the Kimberley and Pilbara regions, in towns and remote desert communities, are several Aboriginal art galleries providing opportunities for cultural expression and economic independence. North of Broome, the Dampier Peninsula has the highest concentration of Aboriginal tourism offerings in Australia. In the Pilbara region, join an Aboriginal guide on the Burrup Peninsula, in the newly UNESCO World Heritage-listed Murujuga National Park, to witness the most prolific rock art engraving (petroglyph) site in the world. The North West is also home to Australia's first Camping with Custodians sites, offering self-drive visitors the chance to interact with local communities while staying at campsites run by Aboriginal people on Aboriginal lands.

Unforgettable outback adventures

Get off the beaten track at two of WA's most spectacular national parks. At Karijini National Park, in the Pilbara region, ancient rocks have been shaped into mountains and escarpments, awe-inspiring gorges and tree-lined watercourses. Stay in the heart of the park at Karijini Eco Retreat's luxury tents. The World Heritage-listed Purnululu National Park near Kununurra in the east of the Kimberley is home to one of the world's most striking geological features, the Bungle Bungle Range. The striped, beehive-like mounds are breathtaking from the air. Stay nearby to explore hidden gorges and pools at APT Bungle Bungle Wilderness Lodge or Bungle Bungle Savannah Lodge.

Remote resorts and Kimberley cruising

Escape the well-known and well-trodden, and truly get away from it all at one of the Kimberley's remote luxury resorts. Australia's most remote luxury lodge experience, Berkeley River Lodge can only be reached by air, Kimberley Coastal Camp is the ultimate wilderness adventure only accessible by helicopter or float plane, El Questro Homestead is cantilevered atop Chamberlain Gorge, and — true to its name — Faraway Bay is so remote you won't even find it on a map. For the ultimate wilderness adventure, experience the luxury of a Kimberley expedition cruise and discover the wild untamed beauty of the Kimberley coast. Cruise by sheer rugged cliffs, meander through secluded gorges, get up close to cascading waterfalls, soar over ancient landscape by helicopter or enjoy incredible fishing in pristine waters — then retreat to the comfort of your own private suite.

The hub of the eastern Kimberley

Kununurra / Goonoonoorang on Miriwoong country is the perfect backdrop for an outback adventure and the gateway town to exploring the eastern region of the Kimberley. Base yourself here and join one of the many tours to experience the region's awe-inspiring attractions including the Bungle Bungle Range in Purnululu National Park, Mitchell Falls / Punamii-unpuu, El Questro and the mighty Lake Argyle. Start your epic Gibb River Road journey here, or venture around the town to discover vast, stunning landscapes, remarkable waterways and waterfalls, lush farmland, Aboriginal art galleries and Western Australia's oldest operating distillery.

WHAT'S NEW FOR 2025

Australia's largest state continues to welcome a mix of dreamlike new projects, products and experiences. Read on to discover what's new for 2025, and what's to come in Western Australia for 2026.

BIGGER DREAM STAYS

In Fremantle / Walyalup, a five-star boutique luxury accommodation offering opened in September 2025. **Garde** is a newbuild hotel, located within the historically significant and World Heritage-listed Fremantle Prison heritage precinct. It will offer 83 luxury rooms and suites, along with event and function spaces, and a new bar and restaurant — Anglesea. The current Warders Hotel has rebranded to Garde, signalling the enduring connection between both properties and marking the new chapter.

SMALLER DREAM STAYS

Denmark in WA's Great Southern is the latest location for **Heyscape Tiny Cabin's** premium cabin experience, with three cabins available to book and more set to open in the next few months, including larger cabins accommodating families and groups. The cabins are ideally located on Raintree — a regenerative farm home to award-winning paddock to plate restaurant The Dam and a cannabis botanical distillery. The cabins offer stunning views of William Bay National Park, home to Greens Pool and Elephant Rocks; and links to the Bibbulmun Track and Munda Biddi cycling track.

In the World Heritage-listed Ningaloo / Nyinggulu region, the **Ningaloo Coral Bay** holiday village in Coral Bay recently welcomed the opening of four Bayview Villas. The self-contained three-bedroom villas all feature private decks and balconies. Adding to this will be 16 two-bedroom villas, which are expected to be completed this summer.

After the hugely successful 2021 redevelopment, **RAC Esperance Holiday Park** has expanded again to offer more accommodation options in the coastal town of Esperance / Kepa Kurl. The \$9.5 million project was completed in December 2024, offering a range of new accommodation options, including up to 21 one, two and three bedroom cabins, plus powered caravan sites; along with barbecue facilities, open areas, increased ablution and laundry facilities. The work includes the refurbishment of the Blue Waters Lodge — a four-bedroom, four-bathroom house originally built in 1947.

ROTTNEST ISLAND DEVELOPMENTS

The Lodge Wadjemup, the much-anticipated new accommodation offering on Perth's / Boorloo's idyllic Rottnest Island / Wadjemup, opened for bookings in early 2025. Offering both affordable and premium accommodation options, the hotel comprises 63 refurbished rooms and 46 newly constructed Poolhouse rooms, bringing the total inventory to 109 rooms. The rooms, as well as a pool, conference space and Gathering Ground are now open and welcoming guests. The development also includes the opening of two on-site hospitality venues — Mediterranean-inspired all day dining venue Sunsets Rottnest, and the Pelican kiosk.

Also new to Rottnest Island is **HAVZA**, offering a contemporary Mediterranean dining experience on the shores of one of the island's most popular beaches, The Basin. There's also new guided cycling tours with **Laura the Explorer**, uncovering the island's natural beauty, rich history, wildlife and local culture.

CHEERS TO THAT

One of Perth's original craft breweries and a much-loved Fremantle / Walyalup institution will be expanding from its traditional roots to the city's sparkling Elizabeth Quay in late 2025. **Little Creatures** will be situated at Nine The Esplanade — a new-build multi-level commercial building, offering more than 500 square metres of internal dining, brewing, and taproom space, plus a large alfresco space with waterfront views.

Magic Apple Wholefoods has opened its doors at one of Perth's most notable seaside addresses in Cottesloe. It's the reimagining of a long-forgotten local wholefoods brand into a modern hospitality concept embracing the clean eating and wellness movements. Cottesloe will be the flagship site, with a company-owned, national rollout of the restaurant planned over the next two years. Owned by prominent Perth restauranter George Kailis from Kailis Hospitality Group, the venue is located just down the road from its other flagship venue — and one of the hottest new openings in Perth for 2024 — seaside brasserie and grill, **Gibney**.

In the Margaret River Region, a winery restaurant has added to the region's world-class epicurean offering. **Miss Chows Margaret River** opened at Edwards Estate winery, bringing a contemporary urban dining experience to the region, with modern Asian dishes paired with local wines and set amongst the rolling vineyards.

LAND, ISLAND AND WATER ADVENTURES

Wellington National Park near the town of Collie in the South West is now home to WA's largest network of mountain bike trails, with almost 100 kilometres of national park trails for riders to explore in Collie's **Wambenger Trails** network, which links Wellington Dam, Honeymoon Pool, Mount Lennard and the spectacular Collie River Valley. To support these trails, Collie-based tour company **Adventure Connections** has opened a Tours and Hire Hub in Wellington National Park. The hub offers a range of guided e-bike, hiking and kayak tours, as well as equipment hire and mountain bike shuttle services into and around the park.

The **Houtman Abrolhos Islands** off the coast of Geraldton / Jambinu continues to receive significant funding to develop the national park into a world-class sustainable tourism development. Recent upgrades include the installation of new public jetties on East Wallabi and Rat Islands, and infrastructure such as boardwalks, shelters, toilets, walk trails and visitor interpretation. A range of disability-friendly infrastructure and equipment is also available. A light plane passenger lift allows wheelchair users to visit the island, and a beach wheelchair, beach matting and a water scooter for snorkelling are available for hire.

Kimberley Spirit has commenced offering multi-day experiences onboard the 'ultimate Flotel' — Nyawoorn in the 2025 season. Based at Lake Kununurra, the houseboat hosts guests on unforgettable cruising journeys through the remote Kimberley gorges and allows avid stargazers to experience the awe-inspiring beauty of the Kimberley night sky.

For those seeking a bit of zen, **The Hike Collective** has launched an exclusive experience at Perth Zoo. The tour begins with a gentle walk through the rainforest, followed by a 45-minute beginner-friendly yoga session in the calming zoo setting, finishing with another walk through the African savannah and Australian bushland, meeting some of the much-loved locals.





GREAT SOUTHERN WONDERS AND WINERIES

WA's Great Southern continues to welcome a range of new tourism experiences to the region. **Scenic Helicopters** in Albany / Kinjarling has launched a number of new tours. The Breaksea Island & Eclipse Island Discovery Tour takes guests across the stunning Torndirrup Peninsula, landing on Breaksea Island to discover the fascinating WWI history. The Great Southern Helicopter Winery Experience is an exclusive wine-tasting helicopter tour, landing at three premier wineries; and The Wine Connoisseur: Frankland River offers a truly bespoke wine tasting experience of the region.

Also adding to the winery experiences, **Castle Rock Estate** in the Porongurups has just launched three wine tourism experiences, with wine flights and guided vineyard tours on offer.

For those seeking adventure experiences, **South Peak Adventure** will start offering guided treks on a technically challenging and unmarked trail over the rugged mountain peaks between Bluff Knoll and Ellen Peake in the Stirling Range National Park in early 2025. **WOW Wilderness EcoAdventures** has also launched in 2025 offering guided, small group, full day hiking, packrafting and mountain biking tours in the Walpole Wilderness.

A NEW WORLD HERITAGE-LISTED PARK

Western Australia is now home to the Australia's newest UNESCO World Heritage site, with the **Murujuga Cultural Landscape** inscribed on the World Heritage List on 11 July 2025. Located on the Dampier Archipelago and Burrup Peninsula in WA's Pilbara, Murujuga is one of the most significant cultural landscapes on Earth. Its richly layered red rock escarpments are home to an estimated two million petroglyphs, dating back more than 50,000 years. These ancient stone carvings document the connection between First Nations Peoples and Country through time: stories of land, sea, ceremony, family, and spirit etched into stone. Murujuga is Australia's 21st UNESCO World Heritage site and the second to be recognised for its Aboriginal cultural values. At the heart of Murujuga is the Ngarda-Ngarli, the five language groups that are custodians, who continue to care for this land and sea country. This UNESCO listing recognises not just the extraordinary rock art, but the ongoing living traditions of the Ngarda-Ngarli, their spiritual connection to place, and cultural knowledge passed through generations.

South West in the town of Harvey / Korijekup, **Boola Bidi Dreaming Centre** has started offering guided walking tours of the region, showcasing bush medicine and the local flora and fauna with stunning views over Harvey Dam to the east and the coast to the west.

CRUISING NEWS

Eclipse Expeditions is a boutique cruise charter that started offering multi-day tours of the Kimberley for the 2024 season, and sailed into the Margaret River Region for the first time for the 2024/25 summer. On the new South West Safari guests will sail through crystal waters, hike the Cape to Cape Track, and experience world-class wineries onboard a brand-new vessel — a sailing catamaran equipped with four ensuite queen cabins, a main deck and sun lounge.

"For a few hours, I get to be someone's best mate and a big part of their adventure and show them the best of my local city, it's just such a joy."



DESTINATION PERTH

TONY HOWELL | EXECUTIVE CHEF, SEAWEST

Chef Tony Howell served luxurious meals at iconic Cape Lodge in Margaret River for 20 years, placing it into Conde Nast Traveller's top 20 hotel restaurants worldwide, three times.

Today, Tony is a consultant executive chef, including for Sea West, a company offering seafood cruises in Mandurah, Dunsborough, Rottnest Island and Broome.

Growing up in Perth's beachy Scarborough, the ocean is a constant in Tony's life. At Sea West, he delights in visitors experiencing quintessential West Aussie moments; meeting dolphins in Mandurah before feasting on crabs, tasting pearl meat off Broome at sunset, or catching lobsters (called 'crays') near Rottnest Island.

"Pulling up the crays at the side of the boat and eating them—that's an experience not many people get to have."

Although he travels for work, Tony relishes returning to Margaret River.

"Driving down to 'Margies', I get this relaxed feeling in my shoulders," he says. "When I get there, I'm chilled out, there are kangaroos in my backyard eating my veggies — it's just amazing."



AUSTRALIA'S SOUTH WEST

JOSH WHITELAND | KOOMAL DREAMING

It's not every day you hear the sounds of a didgeridoo wafting out of an ancient limestone cave system. But 15 years ago, some tourists did, and when they followed the sound, they found Josh Whiteland.

"In the early days, I was playing in Ngilgi Cave because for me, it's quite spiritual and very grounding in there, it wasn't for tourism," the Wadandi man explains.

The tourists' appreciation led Josh to start multi award-winning Koomal Dreaming, a tour company in the Margaret River region.

Josh got his start in tourism 23 years ago at an Aboriginal cultural centre, before starting Koomal Dreaming, the name inspired by the Wadandi word for brushtail possum, Josh's totem.

"Tourism is a great vehicle to continue to share and practice culture, while working on country," Josh says.

Today, Josh delivers moving didgeridoo performances inside Ngilgi Cave, and introduces bush foods, and fire-making. He proudly guides guests through the new Ancient Lands Experience above Ngilgi Cave, featuring Aboriginal interpretive material that Josh helped develop.



AUSTRALIA'S SOUTH WEST

SEAN BLOCKSIDGE | MARGARET RIVER DISCOVERY CO.

Sean Blocksidge of Margaret River Discovery Co. is passionate about connecting visitors to the sights, sounds, and sips of the southwest. He particularly relishes introducing tourists to the actual Margaret River.

"Floating down the Margaret River in a canoe is massage for the soul," Sean says. "A truly magical experience, drifting by towering eucalyptus forest."

Sean started his career in hospitality management and wine tourism, but in 2008 he answered the call of the wild and started his nature and wine tours.

Sean's Discovery Tour caters for just six guests. It incorporates a hike on the spectacular Cape to Cape coastal track, four-wheel-driving, paddling the dreamy river, and an exclusive winery experience, touching on local Aboriginal and surf culture.

Margaret River Discovery Co is Eco Tourism certified, and rated the best tour in Western Australia on Trip Advisor's 2023 Travellers Choice Awards. But despite the success, expansion does not appeal.

"The dream for my business is to keep it small and personalised, and more deeply connect people to what makes Margaret River wine so special," Sean says.



AUSTRALIA'S CORAL COAST

DARREN 'CAPES' CAPEWELL

| WULA GURA NYINDA ECO CULTURAL ADVENTURES

Shark Bay is a place of striking contrasts, where red sand dunes meet aqua seas. It's World Heritage-listed for its nature, but Darren 'Capes' Capewell says this is also a spiritual place.

Capes is descended from the Nhanda and Malgana people, who have thrived here for 35,000 years. His tour business is Wula Gura Nyinda Eco Cultural Adventures, meaning 'you come this way', a traditional term for sharing stories. Tours include walks on country, kayaking, a didgeridoo night dreaming tour, and overnight camping.

"We want to introduce people to country so they understand the responsibility of looking after country," Capes says. "And our tourism business allows us to do that."

Next year, Capes plans to introduce two-day walking tours, through Francois Peron National Park and on Dirk Hartog Island, giving visitors an even greater connection to Shark Bay.

"We don't see nature, we feel it," Capes explains. "You're born with the gift to be able to have an emotional connection to the planet."



AUSTRALIA'S CORAL COAST

EDWINA SHALLCROSS | BULLARA STATION

When Edwina Shallcross married Tim, joining the Bullara Station family, she already had red dust in her veins, having grown up on a station near Cue.

Out of necessity, Bullara, near Exmouth, diversified into station stays in 2010.

"I still remember our first guest," Edwina recalls. "Like a puppy, I sprinted down the driveway and tapped on his windows and asked him to have a cup of tea. He declined, but handed me a \$50 note, and I thought, 'Wow, I can do this again.'"

Bullara Station Stay now offers accommodation and camping options, damper tasting, burger nights and unforgettable sunsets.

"This landscape, it's just so vast, unfiltered and raw. The scale of the night skies makes you feel how insignificant you are."

A local Aboriginal elder recently gave Edwina goosebumps when she explained Bullara has always been a meeting place.

"There's something bigger than all of us that makes this place unique, I feel it when I drive over the grid," she says.



AUSTRALIA'S NORTH WEST

JOSH MELVILLE

| GOURMET CAMP OVEN EXPERIENCE

Josh's passion for cooking started at the age of 10, as the self-appointed head chef in his family home. Though his love for cooking stemmed more from a firm belief that the chef doesn't do the dishes.

Fast forward to today, and New Zealand-born Josh has been able to combine his love for cooking with the magical wonders of the Kimberley region.

The inspiration for the camp oven experience struck Josh while running 4WD tours at Lake Argyle Resort, near Kununurra, and discovering several camp oven pits at a former stockman's camp.

"I researched camp oven cooking experiences around the country, and none of them were exclusive and intimate. I discovered the potential to offer visitors an iconically Australian blend of fine dining and outdoor adventure" Josh says.

Now, alongside his wife Tamsyn (the two met at Lake Argyle Resort), Josh has the privilege of rolling out the red carpet under a starlit Kimberley sky, taking guests on a four-course Ord Valley culinary journey with the ultimate outback chandeliers. And to show off his full bag of tricks, he even performs an acoustic guitar solo as guests cackle fireside, making memories and new friends.



AUSTRALIA'S GOLDEN OUTBACK

JAIMEN HUDSON | ESPERANCE ISLAND CRUISES

Jaimen Hudson's company Esperance Island Cruises tours the wild coastline and islands around dreamy Esperance, and despite being born here, Jaimen knows it's remarkable.

"It's the contrast of colours between the turquoise water, the white sand and granite rocks, and then you've got sealions, dolphins, and eagles flying around," Jaimen says. "We take people to the most untouched, beautiful coastal part of the world, and I'm not joking."

Jaimen also shares Esperance's marine wonderland through his drone imagery.

Multiple accolades acknowledge his work, including West Australian Young Achiever of the Year, a finalist for Young Australian of the Year and Esperance Tourism Business of the Year.

A wheelchair user himself, Jaimen strives to make tourism accessible. His wheelchair accessible vessel is complemented by an accessible four-wheel-drive van, and soon, two accessible holiday apartments will be built.

"It's really important to me to make sure that everyone gets to use our product, not just people in a wheelchair, and not just able-bodied people," he says.



AUSTRALIA'S GOLDEN OUTBACK

FRANCES POLLOCK | WOOLEEN STATION

Frances grew up in Victoria and moved to Western Australia to chase her dreams of working in the tourism industry, landing with her feet firmly in the red earth of Wooleen Station.

Alongside her husband David, they took over the outback cattle station with the ambition to offer guests an experience of reconnection — with the land, food production, sustainable practices and themselves.

With a deep passion for conservation and sustainability, Frances has a strong vision for the future.

“Our dream is to continue restoring the Wooleen landscape to benefit all who use it and enjoy it. Plants, animals and humans. Our dream is to continue to explore ways to produce food in a healthy and sustainable fashion that gives back, rather than takes away,” says Frances.

Restoring the country takes time, which is also one of the joys of staying at Wooleen and immersing into station life at The Homestead Stay.

CORAL COAST HIGHWAY

The Coral Coast Highway is one of the world's most colourful and spectacular road trips, extending across 1,200 kilometres of stunning coastline from Perth / Boorloo to Exmouth / Warnangoora and adjoining two UNESCO World Heritage-listed regions, Ningaloo Marine Park and Shark Bay / Gathaagudu.

This unique self-drive adventure takes you to otherworldly landscapes, ocean wonders and World Heritage-listed treasures. From the surreal pink hues of Hutt Lagoon (Pink Lake), to the exhilarating marine wonderland of the world's largest fringing coral reef, this really is the road trip of your dreams.

The Coral Coast region is famous for its uninterrupted stretches of white sandy beaches, untouched coral reefs just metres from the shore, breathtaking gorges, rugged coastlines, a dazzling array of colourful wildflowers, and bucket-list marine life adventures including swimming with whale sharks, humpback whales and manta rays.

NATURAL EXPERIENCES

Western Australia's national parks, State forests and marine parks provide visitors with the opportunity to interact with some of the world's most diverse and unique flora, fauna and landscapes. Here's your Western Australia Dream List of nature-based experiences.

NINGALOO REEF

Easily accessible from shore, you don't need to travel by boat to snorkel this World Heritage-listed underwater wonderland. The world's largest fringing mainland reef is home to brilliantly coloured coral and tropical fish, sea turtles and manta rays, plus one of the world's top shore dives at Exmouth's / Warnangoora's Navy Pier. Whale sharks and humpback whales visit each year, and visitors are able to swim with these gentle giants of the ocean, with tours operating out of Coral Bay and Exmouth.

PURNULULU NATIONAL PARK

In the Kimberley, another World Heritage-listed gem, Purnululu National Park on Gija and Jaru country, is home to the otherworldly Bungle Bungle Range — a cluster of 350-million-year-old giant, beehive-like striped mounds. Scenic flights offer breathtaking views, and you can explore the park's long narrow chasms and hidden gorges on foot, keeping an eye out for native animals and 130 unique bird species.

SHARK BAY

Awarded World Heritage status for its outstanding natural beauty, biological diversity, fascinating ecology and unique insights into the Earth's history, Shark Bay / Gathaagudu and surrounding Malgana Country is where you'll find one of the world's largest dugong populations, the world's largest plant in the seagrass meadows, and Monkey Mia's friendly dolphins. You can experience pristine waters and one of only two beaches in the world formed entirely of tiny white shells, or time travel with the oldest living fossils — the stromatolites at Hamelin

Pool. Francois Peron National Park is a colourful wilderness adventure, where red desert cliffs meet the turquoise sea.

VALLEY OF THE GIANTS

Experience some of the tallest trees on Earth at canopy level — 40 metres above ground — at the Valley of the Giants Treetop Walk, near Walpole in the South West. One of the first walk trails of its kind in the world, the 600-metre walkway extends through the majestic and ancient red tingle forest where you may be able to spot western grey kangaroos, bandicoots, woylies and quokkas.

KARIJINI NATIONAL PARK

Two billion years in the making, Karijini on Banyjima, Kurrama and Innawonga Country in the North West is home to massive gorges, crystal-clear rock pools and waterfalls, as well as rock wallabies, red kangaroos, echidnas, and huge termite mounds. Explore tunnels of marbled rock, clamber over boulders, squeeze through narrow tunnels, paddle through waterways and descend deep into ancient chasms; then stay overnight at the Karijini Eco Retreat.

STOP AND SEE THE WILDFLOWERS

It's a staggering sight to behold — over 12,000 species of wildflowers in bloom, more than half of which are found nowhere else on Earth. The wildflower season lasts for six months, commencing in June in the north and sweeping down the State to finish with a flurry on the south coast in November.



KALBARRI NATIONAL PARK

More than 183,000 hectares of outback adventures, dramatic gorges and dazzling seasonal wildflowers make Kalbarri National Park one of WA's most popular places to visit. Its magnificent deep red and white banded gorges have been created over 400 million years from the flow of the Murchison River, and to experience these from a dramatic perspective, step out onto the 100-metre high Kalbarri Skywalk / Kaju Yatka. Experience stunning vistas of the Murchison River Gorge, as it extends 17 and 25 metres beyond the gorge rim at the Inyaka Wookai Watju (West Loop).

KINGS PARK AND BOTANIC GARDEN

One of the world's largest inner-city parks, this 400-hectare expanse of bushland, parks and botanical gardens is a short walk or bus ride from central Perth / Boorloo. From its family-friendly play areas amongst nature, to an art gallery, restaurants, monuments, outdoor concerts, theatre and movies in summer; it's easy to see why Kings Park

and Botanic Garden / Kaarta Koomba is the most popular visitor destination in WA. Read more about why Kings Park is the king of all parks [here](#).

THE PINNACLES

The lunar-like Pinnacles form one of Australia's most unique and otherworldly natural landscapes. Formed over millions of years, thousands of tall limestone spires rise eerily from the yellow desert sands of Nambung National Park, changing colours in different lights.

FITZGERALD RIVER NATIONAL PARK

One of only a handful of UNESCO Biosphere Reserves, this 300,000 hectare national park is WA's own lost world — three-quarters of its 1,800 species of plants are found nowhere else on Earth, and share the environment with 84 bird species, 22 mammal species and more than 50 reptile and frog species. Located on the south coast, it is a perfect spot for bushwalking, wildflower spotting, canoeing, fishing and whale watching.

HORIZONTAL FALLS

Talbot Bay in the Kimberley is home to Australia's only horizontal waterfalls, created when massive tidal movements squeeze water through narrow cliff passages. Aerial tours from Broome / Rubibi and Derby enable you to circle the Horizontal Falls / Garaan-ngaddim phenomenon from above, alongside other scenic wonders of the Buccaneer Archipelago, where turquoise blue water contrasts with rugged red cliffs. You can also land and witness the power of the sacred falls up close on a boat tour, with the option of staying overnight on a houseboat.

ANCIENT CAVES

In the Margaret River Region, an extraordinary network of more than 100 limestone caves lay beneath the surface of the Leeuwin Naturaliste Ridge on Wardandi Noongar Country. Venture underground on a guided or self-guided tour and marvel at the reflections of Lake Cave's permanent lake, be dwarfed in Jewel Cave's enormous chambers and

go at your own pace inside Mammoth Cave. At Ngilgi Cave, marvel at the incredible stalactites and stalagmites, learn about the cave's fascinating history, be mesmerised by a didgeridoo performance from an Aboriginal guide, and discover 600 million years of stories associated with the land and its people at the new Ancient Lands Experience.

SURF WAVE ROCK

Wave Rock / Katter Kich, near Hyden on Ballardong country, is a remarkable 110-metre-long, multi-coloured granite cliff that rises 15 metres from the ground and resembles a huge wave about to crash into the bush. Otherworldly encounters continue at nearby Mulka's Cave with its incredible collection of Aboriginal rock art.

SWAN RIVER

Sitting pretty on its banks, Perth's Swan River / Derbarl Yerrigan is one of WA's most celebrated and historic natural assets. Throughout the year, visitors and locals alike will walk, cycle, jog or picnic along its shores. River cruises, ferry rides, fast boats and waterbike tours allow you to experience the city from a different perspective. Cruise the calm waters to the port city of Fremantle / Walyalup on a scenic lunch tour, or head to its upper reaches to sample the delights of the Swan Valley — WA's oldest wine region and the only one in Australia that can be accessed via river from a capital city.

CAPE RANGE NATIONAL PARK

Where the outback meets the reef, Cape Range National Park is a spectacular landscape of rugged limestone ranges, breathtaking deep canyons and 60 kilometres of pristine turquoise beaches that are home to the underwater wonders of World Heritage-listed Ningaloo Reef / Nynggulu. Wildflowers and wildlife are abundant, with over 630 species of plants and more than 100 species of land birds and native marsupials. Cruise along Yardie Creek on a boat tour and spot rock wallabies, or take a hike along Shothole Canyon or Charles Knife Canyon for spectacular scenic views.

WATERFALL WONDERS

The replenishing tropical summer rains send waterfalls thundering and cascading throughout the ancient wilderness landscapes of the Kimberley region, creating inviting rock pools and enchanting oases of plant and animal life. The best time of year to witness these waterfall wonders is in the early months, with several spring-fed falls that flow year-round. Favourites include the spectacular four tiered Mitchell Falls / Punamii-unpuu, the thundering King George Falls, the terraced Kings Cascade that fan out across the rocks, and popular Bell Gorge / Dalmanyi which can be accessed along the Gibb River Road. Scenic flights offer awe-inspiring aerial views, or take a heli-hike to experience them up close. For the ultimate waterfall experience, a Kimberley expedition cruise is a must.

WILDLIFE ENCOUNTERS

From marine life to marsupials, Western Australia boasts an incredible range of unique and unforgettable wildlife experiences. Swim face to fin with the world's biggest fish, sunbathe with kangaroos on the beach, frolic with wild dolphins and manta rays, or meet the world's friendliest animal. Here's your Western Australia Dream List of epic wildlife encounters.

SWIM WITH GENTLE GIANTS

Exhilarating marine experiences await at World Heritage-listed Ningaloo Reef / Nyngulu — one of only a handful of places on Earth where you can swim with the world's biggest fish, the whale shark, and the majestic humpback whale. Whale sharks visit Ningaloo each year between March and July. Tours from Exmouth / Warnangoora and Coral Bay will take you into the reef's turquoise waters for an unforgettable encounter with these gentle giants. Humpback whale interaction tours run from July to October, while up-close tours with another big and beautiful Ningaloo local, the manta ray, operate year-round.

MEET THE WORLD'S HAPPIEST ANIMAL

Just off the coast of Perth / Boorloo lies Rottnest Island / Wadjemup, an island playground for visitors and locals, and home to the world's happiest animal — the friendly quokka. Found only in Western Australia, these cute marsupials roam care-free on the car free island and Class A Reserve. Known for pulling a cute grin for the camera, these photogenic furry animals have become a social media sensation in recent years — just be sure to follow quokka etiquette when getting that winning shot.

GET UP CLOSE WITH WILD DOLPHINS

Perth Wildlife Encounters in Rockingham (45 minutes from Perth) and the redeveloped Dolphin Discovery Centre in Bunbury (two hours south of Perth) — offer the chance to swim with wild bottlenose dolphins. The playful and curious animals may choose to approach the boat and swimmers, providing a unique, up-close encounter. Monkey Mia (850 kilometres north of Perth), on Malgana Country, is famous for friendly bottlenose dolphins that regularly visit the shore, while further north in Broome / Rubibi, boat tours enable visitors to see Australia's largest known population of the rare snubfin dolphin.

ONE OF THE WORLD'S LONGEST WHALE WATCHING SEASONS

WA is home to the 'humpback highway', as 30,000 gentle giants move up and down the west coast during the Southern Hemisphere's largest whale migration. WA has one of the world's longest whale watching seasons — from May to December — and a range of tours and coastal lookouts will help you spot humpbacks, southern right and even blue whales. September to late-November is the prime time for whale tours off Perth (Fremantle, Hillarys and Rottnest Island), while other hotspots include Albany / Kinjarling, the Margaret River Region (Augusta, Dunsborough and Busselton), Broome / Rubibi, Geraldton / Jambinu, Exmouth, Denham, Kalbarri / Wurdimarlu and Esperance / Kepa Kurl.



ORCA EXPEDITIONS

On Western Australia's south coast, the Bremer Canyon's marine-rich pocket attracts hundreds of orcas (killer whales) between January and April. Tours operate from Bremer Bay with Naturaliste Charters and Whale Watch WA providing guests the opportunity to see a plethora of marine life, including other whales, seals, seabirds and giant squid. Learn about the fascinating research into the orcas and join the researchers in observing and photographing the highly social family groups and larger pods.

TURTLE NESTING ALONG NINGALOO

The World Heritage-listed Ningaloo Marine Park / Nynggulu is one of the world's major breeding areas for sea turtles. From November to March, both green and loggerhead turtles will make their arduous journey up the beach to lay their eggs, with hatchlings emerging about six weeks later around dusk, dawn or through the night; making their dash to the sea. Visit the Jurabi Turtle Centre for a guided turtle spotting tour to find females making their way up the beach, or turtle hatchlings emerging from their nests.

SWIMMING WITH PLAYFUL SEA LIONS

WA continues to deliver with incredible wildlife encounters, thanks to a licensed swimming with sea lions trial recently approved at Shoalwater Islands Marine Park in Rockingham, less than an hour from Perth / Boorloo, and Jurien Bay Marine Park on the Coral Coast. Four tour operators have been chosen to take part in the trial, including Perth Wildlife Encounters for Shoalwater Islands Marine Park; and Turquoise Safaris, Jurien Bay Oceanic Experience and Lobster Shack for Jurien Bay Marine Park — providing guests with an unforgettable experience with these playful Australian sea lions.

KANGAROOS ON BEACHES AND OTHER WILDLIFE ENCOUNTERS

An easy day-trip from Perth / Boorloo takes you to Shoalwater Marine Park in Rockingham, home to seabirds and the rare Australian sea lion. Jurien Bay Marine Park, a three-hour drive north of Perth, is another marine life hotspot, while south at Hamelin Bay near Augusta, you can get close to smooth stingrays, black stingrays and eagle rays in the shallow water. Within Cape Le Grand National

Park / Mandoowernup on WA's south-east coast, Lucky Bay's local kangaroos like to sunbathe on the white sand of the recently voted World's Best Beach, while nearby Woody Island is a haven for New Zealand fur seals, Australian sea lions, sea eagles and dolphins. In the State's far north, an experienced guide can help you spot mighty saltwater crocodiles and their freshwater cousins from a safe distance in the Kimberley.

NUMBAT SPOTTING IN DRYANDRA WOODLAND NATIONAL PARK

Western Australia's newest national park, located near the town of Narrogin in the Wheatbelt region, Dryandra Woodland is one of the best places for spotting the native numbat. It is also home to more than 100 species of birds and 24 mammals, including some of Australia's rarest and most vulnerable wildlife such as woylies, brushtail wallabies, chuditch, and quenda.

KIMBERLEY BIRD SPOTTING

In the Kimberley region, excellent bird spotting opportunities await birding enthusiasts year-round. Broome's / Rubibi's Roebuck Bay / Yawuru Nagulagun in the North West is regarded as one of the best spots in Australia to view shore birds, with an estimated 175,000 birds roosting and feeding there every year before returning to their arctic breeding grounds. More than 325 species are recorded in the region, with all of their distinct habitats found relatively close to Broome town. In Kununurra / Goonoonoorrang and the eastern Kimberley region, keep an eye out for dancing Brolgas, the water-walking Comb-crested Jacanas, Magpie geese and Australia's indigenous stork, the Jabiru.

EATING AND DRINKING

Western Australia's exceptional food and drink, including its nine wine regions, top restaurants, fresh produce and culinary events, can be found across the State from top to bottom. Here's your Western Australia Dream List of eating and drinking experiences.

WORLD LEADING WINES

From Perth / Boorloo to the rugged Southern Ocean coast, WA is home to nine wine regions, which can all be explored on a range of guided wine tours.

Regarded as Australia's premium wine region, the Margaret River Region is renowned worldwide for producing top quality, award-winning wines, amongst some of the most scenic vineyard country on Earth. The region's first commercial vineyards were planted more than 50 years ago, with Chardonnay and Cabernet Sauvignon the heroes of the region. Along WA's scenic south coast, Albany / Kinjarling, Denmark, Frankland River, Mount Barker and Porongurup are highlights of the Great Southern wine region, which is particularly well known for its exceptional Riesling and Cabernet Sauvignon.

The Geographe wine region is also starting to turn heads, with a number of boutique wineries popping up in the charming sub-regions of Ferguson Valley, Donnybrook, Capel and Harvey — producing excellent Shiraz, Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon.

In amongst towering karri forests, the towns of Manjimup and Pemberton in the Southern Forests wine region are renowned for Pinot Noir, and more recently sparkling wines.

At more than 185 years old, the picturesque Swan Valley is the State's oldest wine growing region. Just 25 minutes from Perth city centre, it's the

closest wine region to any capital city in Australia and can be accessed on a cruise along the Swan River / Derbal Yerrigan. Specialty premium wines produced in the Swan Valley include Chenin Blanc, Verdelho, Shiraz and fortified wine.

A short journey from the city will also take you to the Perth Hills, where local families and progressive vintners produce stand-out Shiraz and Viognier, and the Peel wine region, known for its Chenin Blanc, Chardonnay and Cabernet Sauvignon.

TRUFFLES — A RARE DELICACY

Black truffle is one of the world's most expensive food items, and 70 per cent of the Australian supply comes from Western Australia's tranquil Southern Forests around Manjimup and Pemberton, some 300 kilometres south of Perth. As well as sampling the rare delicacy and learning about its painstaking cultivation, you can watch the Australian Truffle Traders and Truffle Hill's specially trained dogs in action, sniffing out the underground delights on a truffle hunt tour from June to August. In an exciting first for the Margaret River Region, truffle hunting experiences launched this winter at the Margaret River Truffle Farm.



GRAZE YOUR WAY THROUGH PERTH'S RESTAURANTS

Perth's / Boorloo's world-class dining scene offers a diverse and delicious range of signature restaurants showcasing the best of WA's fresh and abundant produce from across the State. With an influx of new hotels over the past 10 years comes the opening of fine-dining restaurants across the city including Miss Mi at Novotel Perth, Hearth at The Ritz-Carlton Perth, Nobu at Crown Perth, Santini Bar & Grill at QT Perth, Garum at The Westin, and Wildflower at COMO The Treasury. Local hospitality heroes are also creating a buzz across the city, with new and trending dining options such as Alba, Papi Katsu, Fallow, Edward & Ida's, Yiamas, Light Years, Nieuw Ruin, Cassia, Moon and Mary, newly opened Anglesea and Vin Populi.

SAMPLE SUCCULENT SEAFOOD

WA seafood and freshwater fish are among the finest and freshest you'll ever try. Be sure to sample Geraldton / Jambinu and Rottnest Island's / Wadjemup's western rock lobster; South West marron, yabby and trout; North West barramundi; Exmouth / Warnangoora prawns; Shark Bay / Gathaagudu scallops; Mandurah / Mandjoogoordap crab; Fremantle / Walyalup octopus; Albany / Kinjarling

akoya oysters, and; Broome / Rubibi pearl meat. Add in a sunset view and a cool boutique beer or a crisp local wine, and it's a true west coast experience. You can learn about the State's rock lobster industry in Geraldton and Cervantes, or hook your own catch of the day on deep sea, game or beach fishing adventures all along the coast. For a unique seafood experience on the water, Sea West offers luxury dining cruises across the State, from pulling up live western rock lobster off the coast of Rottnest, eating blue swimmer crab in Mandurah, experiencing the tastes of the South West in the bays of Dunsborough, to harvesting live pearl oysters and sampling rare pearl meat on the Kimberley Coast in Broome.

GET CRAFTY WITH LOCAL BEERS

Fremantle is the birthplace of Australia's flourishing craft beer scene, with the first big-flavour, small production brews poured at the Sail and Anchor bar. It's also where Gage Roads Brewing decided to open its first public facing venue. Now a popular icon at Fremantle's Victoria Quay, the 100-metre-long venue resides in the historic A Shed building. Check out other unique and seasonal craft beers at Fremantle's Little Creatures, Running with Thieves, or Beerpourium. Closer to the city, head for Blasta Brewing Co.,

Bright Tank, Longneck, Phat Brewing or Little Creatures at The Camfield. The Island at Elizabeth Quay and Pirate Life are also two fantastic options located right in the CBD, and a scenic drive up the coast will take you to the Indian Ocean Brewing Company. You can also see how local beers and cider are bringing extra flavour and attitude to traditional wine regions such as the Swan Valley (Bailey Brewing Co, Valley Social or Mash, for example) and the Margaret River Region (Wild Hop Brewery, Beer Farm or Shelter Brewing Company, to name a few). Western Australia is home to more than 60 craft breweries across the length of the State, from the Spinifex Ale House in Broome down to Lucky Bay Brewing in Esperance / Kepa Kurl, so there's a few for beer lovers to work through!

FEAST FROM WA'S FOOD BOWLS

Western Australia's fertile soils and perfect climate make it a haven for horticulturalists, and you can experience 'the State on a plate' at gourmet events or straight from the farm. In the Kimberley, tours of Lake Argyle reveal the massive reservoir's role in the Ord River's vast irrigated patchwork, which is a hub for everything from chickpeas and corn to melons and mangoes. Further south, head to the Coral Coast town of

Carnarvon to tour banana plantations and meet the farmers behind tropical fruits and vegetables. In WA's South West, Genuinely Southern Forests offers food and farm tours around Manjimup and Pemberton to sample a smorgasbord of fresh produce such as apples, avocado, cherries, lime and honey, as well as marron and beef. In Perth, venture into the Perth Hills to pick and purchase fruit from grower's orchards year-round.

LAZE LIKE A LOCAL AT A SUNDAY SESSION

Wrap up the weekend the WA way by relaxing with mates on a Sunday afternoon with food, a tipple or two and live music at a waterfront or alfresco style pub. Perth's top spots for a Sunday Session (or 'sesh' if you want to sound like a local) include the Cottesloe Beach Hotel in Cottesloe, The Standard in Northbridge, Gage Roads Brewery, Bathers Beach House and The Left Bank in Fremantle and The Breakwater at Hillarys. Enjoying a meal and a drink while watching the sun set over the Indian Ocean is a WA institution.

JOIN THE NATURAL WINE MOVEMENT

Perth is welcoming an increase in boutique bars and restaurants offering naturally produced and minimal intervention wines, with favourites such as Wines of While in Northbridge and Madalena's in South Fremantle. The range of national and internationally sourced varieties are complemented by the growing number of Western Australian wineries producing organic and naturally produced varieties, such as Blind Corner, L.A.S Vino, Cullen and Dormilona in the Margaret River Region, Express Wine Makers in the Great Southern and Swan Valley Wines in the Swan Valley.

REGIONAL AND URBAN DISTILLERIES

Regional small batch distilleries can be found all across Western Australia, from Kununurra / Goonoonoorang in the north to Esperance / Kepa Kurl in the south, each producing their own distinctive character and style. Kununurra in the Kimberley is home to WA's oldest operating legal still — The Hoochery Distillery, famous for its Ord River Rum (and rum cakes!). In Broome / Rubibi, Moontide Distillery produces gins and spirits using native ingredients, and produces the first gin in the world to use pearl oyster as a botanical. In the Coral Coast town of Geraldton / Jambinu, Illegal Tender Rum Co. produces premium rum using only dark brown cane sugar. At Giniversity in the Margaret River Region, visitors can make their own gin with local native botanicals, and Limeburners near

Albany / Kinjarling in the Great Southern region produces single malt whisky using premium Western Australian grain and pure Albany water from limestone aquifers. In Esperance on the south-east coast, Esperance Distillery Co. produces gin distilled with native botanicals that showcase the floral diversity of Esperance and the Fitzgerald Biosphere. In Perth / Boorloo you can discover some of the best urban distilleries on walking or bus tours, with Spirit of Little Things, Whipper Snapper Distiller, Republic of Fremantle some city favourites.

BUSH TUCKER EXPERIENCES

Aboriginal people have been living by the seasons for thousands of years, practicing sustainable hunting and gathering methods and using local foods for medicinal, nutritional and cultural significance. Aboriginal cultural tours will allow you to discover 'nature's supermarket' in each region of Western Australia. Forage for native bushfoods in Perth on Whadjuk Country, learn traditional fishing methods in the South West on Wardandi Country, and dig for honey ants — the sweetest of bushfoods — in the Golden Outback on Wongatha Country. On the Dampier Peninsula in the Kimberley, the local Bardi people will teach you traditional spear fishing techniques and mud-crab hunting in the mangroves, before you cook the catch on the beach.

A GENEROUS SERVING OF UNFORGETTABLE EVENTS

The State's bounty of fresh local produce is celebrated throughout the year with a number of regional foodie events. In the Margaret River Region, multi-day festivals such as Cabin Fever and Pair'd Margaret River Region x Range Rover celebrate the region's food and wine offerings, and in the nearby Ferguson Valley Lost & Found showcases the up-and-coming wine region. In the south-east corner, Taste Great Southern unearths the incredible variety of produce. In the Coral Coast, sample fresh seafood at Shore Leave Festival in Geraldton. Broome's Shinju Matsuri celebrates the pearling town's rich multicultural history, and the Ord Valley Muster shines a spotlight on the tropical agriculture in Kununurra's Ord River Irrigation Scheme. In Perth, the annual Mandurah Crab Fest showcases the native blue manna crab that the Mandurah / Mandjoogoordap region is well-known for.

ART AND CULTURE

Home to modern museums and galleries, captivating street art, outdoor murals, heritage buildings and the world's oldest living culture — Western Australia's unique art and cultural offerings are reflected in its sheer diversity of natural landscapes and cultural heritage. Here's your Western Australia Dream List of art and culture experiences.

PERTH CULTURAL CENTRE

Meaning 'many stories' in local Noongar language, the WA Museum Boola Bardip is a landmark building for the Perth Cultural Centre, showcasing the State's extraordinary people, places, cultures and stories through state-of-the-art technology and innovative exhibits. The museum celebrates Western Australia's rich Aboriginal heritage and landscapes and takes a unique people first approach to its curation, with the stories and perspectives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people taking centre stage in its exhibitions. Located where Perth City / Boorloo meets Northbridge, the Perth Cultural Centre precinct also includes the Art Gallery of WA, State Library of WA, The Blue Room theatre, PICA (Perth Institute of Contemporary Arts) and the State Theatre Centre of WA — a vibrant hub for all things art and culture.

CONNECT WITH ABORIGINAL CULTURE

For more than 60,000 years, Western Australia's Aboriginal people have lived in harmony with nature, sourcing food, shelter and medicine from the land. Experience their rich cultural heritage as one of the oldest surviving cultures on Earth on one of the many authentic Aboriginal tours operating across the State. From the ancient lands of the Kimberley to the cave systems of the South West and stunning coastlines of the Golden Outback — discover ancient stories, forage for traditional bush tucker, and experience the celebrations of traditional music and dance. Explore Aboriginal art galleries throughout

regional Western Australia that showcase the traditional and contemporary works of local, national and international Aboriginal artists; or join an Aboriginal guide to discover ancient rock art galleries, and the largest collection of petroglyphs (rock engravings) in the world.

URBAN STREET ART

Tucked down laneways and splashed across buildings, Perth's / Boorloo's captivating street art offers a vibrant glimpse into the heart and soul of the city. New works are appearing regularly across the city as the urban art scene evolves, and in recent years, the city has gained worldwide attention with internationally renowned street artists painting the walls of some of the city's iconic and lesser-known buildings. Join a walking tour in Perth, Northbridge or Fremantle / Walyalup to discover the artist stories behind some of these incredible works.

HERITAGE BUILDINGS

Travel back in time with a visit to Western Australia's iconic heritage buildings; immersing yourself in the State's gold rush, colonial and pearling histories. Architecture buffs will delight in Perth's historical buildings which sit alongside modern brutalist architecture. Visit the iconic State Buildings, a collection of former heritage government buildings that have been reimagined and reinvigorated as a vibrant civic hub of retail and dining offerings; home to one of Perth's top luxury hotels, COMO The Treasury. Discover historic tales at the Round House in Fremantle — the area's

first-ever building, take a step back into Western Australia's gold rush history through the grand monuments and architecture in Kalgoorlie / Karlkurla, or visit Broome's / Rubibi's Chinatown for an insight into the town's rich pearling history.

OUTDOOR GALLERIES AND MURALS

The striking salt flats of Lake Ballard near the Golden Outback town of Menzies form the backdrop of Inside Australia — one of Australia's largest outdoor galleries. This truly unique installation of 51 life-sized steel statues by acclaimed sculptor Antony Gormley celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2023. In a celebration of regional Western Australia, FORM's Public Silo Trail takes art out of galleries, transforming country infrastructure into sites of world-class mural art. Emblazoned across colossal grain silos, transformer boxes and iconic farming infrastructure at seven locations from Perth through the Golden Outback and South West regions, the epic works showcase monumental depictions of each town's community and what makes it unique. In the town of Collie, marvel at the world's biggest dam mural at Wellington Dam. The 8,000 square metre mega-mural Reflections, represents how the waterways are culturally significant to both locals and visitors.

REGIONAL MUSEUMS

In regional towns across Western Australia, many fascinating museums preserve the stories, history and artefacts of our rich culture, landscapes and past. Discover hidden treasures and tales from the cultured to the kitsch and everything in between. Head upstairs above a Chinese restaurant in Broome to discover a personal collection of pearling history, experience Aboriginal culture at centres like Bilya Koort Boodja in Northam, or marvel at Australia's largest private collection of shells and coral in the Margaret River Region.

A WORLD HERITAGE-LISTED PRISON

One of Western Australia's most fascinating and significant cultural heritage sites and tourist attractions, Fremantle Prison is the State's only World Heritage-listed building. Built by convicts in the 1850's, the prison was used as a place of incarceration for 136 years before being decommissioned as an operating maximum security gaol in 1991. Now an iconic tourist attraction, visitors can 'step inside and do time' with Fremantle Prison's experienced guides on a range of tours highlighting convict and prison life, daring escapes and colourful characters; or descend 20 metres below the prison to discover the labyrinth of tunnels.

FREMANTLE'S MARITIME STORIES

The port city of Fremantle / Walyalup is also home to a rich maritime history — which can be discovered at the WA Maritime Museum, ideally located at Fremantle's historic Victoria Quay. The museum houses several unique galleries that explore the moments, voyages and vessels; plus the artefacts, people and stories that shaped Western Australia's maritime relationship. Dive even further into the State's maritime past at the nearby WA Shipwrecks Museum — recognised as the foremost maritime archaeology museum in the southern hemisphere. Steeped in history, the galleries house hundreds of relics from ships wrecked along Western Australia's coastlines over hundreds of years, including the original timbers from the Batavia (wrecked in 1629).

ANZAC HISTORY

The multi-award winning National Anzac Centre in the coastal city of Albany / Kinjarling is Australia's foremost museum honouring the Anzac legend. Set within Albany Heritage Park in the South West town, the centre offers visitors a deeply personal connection to Australia's Anzac history, which dates back to 1914 when more than 40,000 Australians and New Zealanders left the shore of Albany, bound for the Great War.



BEACHES AND LAKES

The waters off WA's 20,000 kilometres of mainland coastline and islands are some of the most pristine in the world — home to pure-white sands, crystal clear waters, fringing reefs and a myriad of marine life. Here's your Western Australia Dream List of beaches and lake adventures.

A SPARKLING BEACH MENU

Western Australia's beaches are regularly voted among the best in the world, and with 20,000 kilometres of pristine coastline, the sheer diversity and range of different coastal options is like no other destination on Earth. In Perth / Boorloo, there are 19 stunning beaches all located within easy reach of the city — Cottesloe Beach, City Beach and Scarborough Beach are visitor favourites. Venture to the southern corner of WA where the crystal-clear blue waters of the Southern Ocean contrast with granite boulders, rocky outcrops, pure white sand and adjoining green vegetation. Here you'll find Australia's whitest beach, Lucky Bay in Cape Le Grand National Park / Mandoowernup, home to friendly sunbathing kangaroos. The Coral Coast boasts Exmouth's / Warnangoora's dazzling Turquoise Bay and is where the outback meets the reef, with the World Heritage-listed Ningaloo Reef / Nynggulu creating an underwater playground against the rugged gorges of Cape Range National Park. Another World Heritage-listed area, Shark Bay / Gathaagudu is where you'll find Monkey Mia's friendly dolphins, and a beach made entirely of tiny white shells. In the North West, Broome's / Rubibi's iconic Cable Beach / Walmanyjun is famous for its golden glow sunsets and camel trains. The colours of the Kimberley coastline are like nowhere else in the world, with its red pindan sands, white beaches and azure blue waters. Here you'll also find incredible untouched wilderness, with the 1000-plus islands of the Buccaneer Archipelago all waiting to be explored on a Kimberley expedition cruise.

PERTH'S RELAXED ISLAND PLAYGROUND

The crossing to Rottnest Island / Wadjemup takes as little as 30 minutes by ferry, or try something different with a trip by helicopter or small plane. You'll soon have the pleasant dilemma of choosing from "Rotto's" 63 beaches and 20 secluded bays, or being enchanted by the Island's unique marsupial resident, the friendly quokka. The car-free island is easy to explore by bike, Segway, bus or on foot — or head into the water to see fish, coral and shipwrecks at some of the best snorkelling and diving sites this close to a capital city.

NINGALOO REEF

Easily accessible from shore, you don't need to travel by boat to snorkel this World Heritage-listed underwater wonderland. The massive fringing reef is home to brilliantly coloured coral and tropical fish, sea turtles and manta rays, plus one of the world's top shore dives at Exmouth's Navy Pier. Whale sharks and humpback whales visit each year, and visitors are able to swim with these gentle giants of the ocean, with tours operating out of Coral Bay and Exmouth.

MAKE SOME WAVES SURFING

Take the word of the world's top surfers who flock to WA's shores for some of the best waves on Earth. The famed Margaret River region, on Wardandi Noongar Country in the South West, is home to more than 100 surf spots ranging from powerful reef breaks to fun beach surf. Other surfing hotspots include Exmouth / Warnangoora, Gnaraloo, Quobba and Red Bluff along Ningaloo Reef / Nyinggulu, Esperance / Kepa Kurl, Kalbarri / Wurdimarlu and Rottnest Island / Wadjemup. If you're into different types of boards, an easy 90-minute drive north of Perth / Boorloo takes you to the windsurfing mecca of Lancelin / Wangaree — where you can also try out sandboarding on the white dunes.

WRECKS, REMOTE SHOALS, REEFS AND SNORKEL TRAILS

World Heritage-listed Ningaloo Reef, where you can wade out from the beach and be snorkelling over superb coral gardens teeming with colourful fish, manta rays and sea turtles, is one of the largest fringing reef systems in the world. Navy Pier, at the Ningaloo gateway of Exmouth, is rated as one of the world's top 10 shore dives. North of Ningaloo Reef, the Mackerel Islands offer an island playground of secluded fringing reefs. In the Margaret River Region, you can explore Busselton Jetty through snorkel, dive, observatory or undersea walking tours. A new Underwater Sculpture Trail and Artificial Reef Trail at the jetty offers a

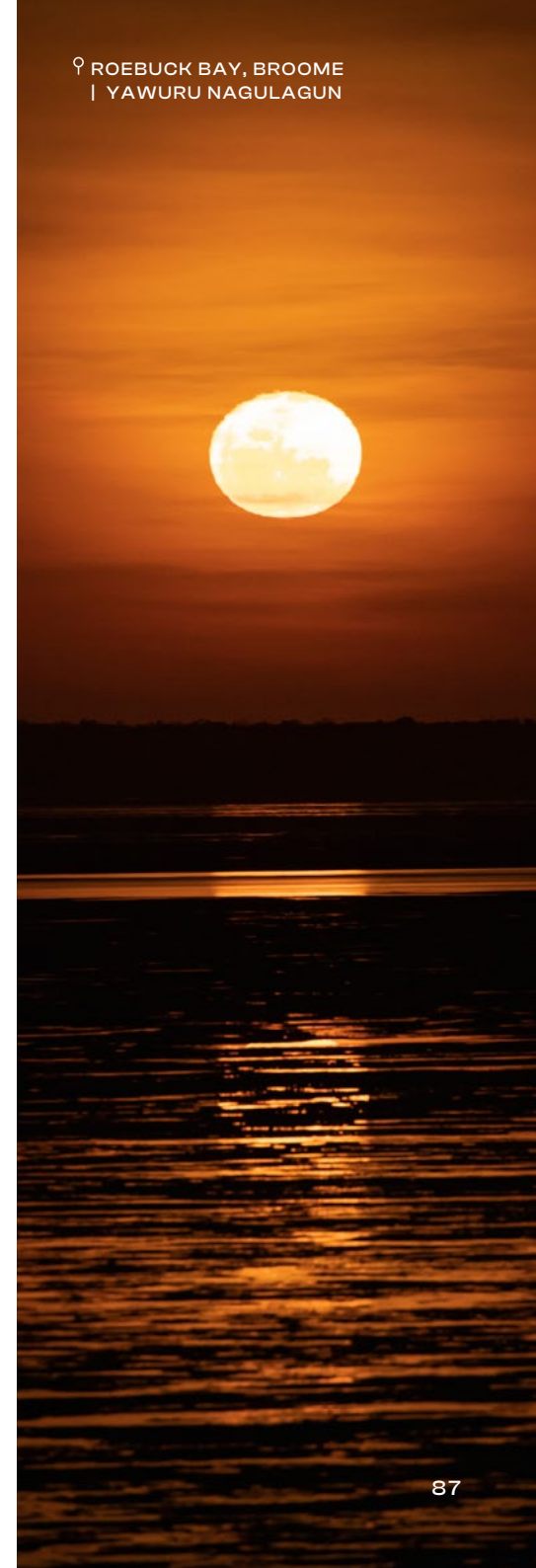
unique underwater experience. WA is also home to extraordinary shipwreck dives including HMAS Swan at Dunsborough, HMAS Perth in Albany / Kinjarling and 19 wrecks around the Houtman Abrolhos Islands off Geraldton / Jambinu, including the Batavia, which sunk in 1629 and led to one of the darkest chapters in WA history. In Perth, the Omeo shipwreck at Coogee has become 'insta famous'. Follow the underwater snorkel trails at Little Salmon Bay on Rottnest Island or the Marmion Marine Park near Trigg in Perth, where underwater plaques guide snorkellers and divers on an interactive journey to discover fish and marine species. A little further afield, take a tour to the 'aquarium in the middle of the ocean' at Rowley Shoals, 300 kilometres west of Broome / Rubibi, and dive among coral gardens with giant clams and schools of tuna and mackerel.

RAINBOW PINK LAKES

WA's photogenic bubblegum pink lakes have to be seen to be believed. The most easily accessible is the dreamy Hutt Lagoon, near Port Gregory — located between the Coral Coast towns of Geraldton and Kalbarri. Best viewed between April and October, the waters could be red, bubble-gum pink or lilac depending on the conditions. On the south coast, the small salt lakes near Esperance are a dreamy sight from a scenic flight. Known as the rainbow lakes, they are quite often bubble-gum pink, but the colours can change regularly.

TIDAL PHENOMENON — STAIRCASES TO THE MOON AND WATERFALL REEFS

The Kimberley coast has some of the biggest tidal movements in the southern hemisphere, with the daily ebb and flow of the tropical tides creating some of the region's most dreamlike attractions. From March to November, when conditions are just right, visitors to Broome are treated to a breathtaking natural spectacle — the Staircase to the Moon. The phenomenon occurs around three times a month at extremely low tide when the full moon rises over the exposed mudflats of Roebuck Bay / Yawuru Nagulagun, creating the optical illusion of lunar stairs. The staircase phenomenon can also be experienced at other north-west locations including Karratha, Port Hedland and Onslow. Near Cygnet Bay Pearl Farm on the Dampier Peninsula (north of Broome on Yawuru Country), tidal movements create the spectacular Waterfall Reef, where exposed reefs at low tide create a waterfall in the middle of the sea. On a Kimberley expedition cruise, witness a coral reef rising from the ocean in a torrent of cascading water during the tidal changes at Montgomery Reef, the world's largest inshore reef.



HIKES AND TRAILS

From steep and winding mountain biking trails to world-class multi-day hikes and gentle hills, there's a trail experience to suit everyone. Here's your Western Australia Dream List of the best hikes and trails in the State.

CAPE TO CAPE TRACK, MARGARET RIVER REGION

One of Australia's most iconic and varied trails, the Cape to Cape Track runs for 135 kilometres between the operational south-west lighthouses of Cape Naturaliste and Cape Leeuwin on Wardandi Country. Mostly following the coast, the track alternates between spectacular sweeping clifftop views with stretches of pristine beach and majestic karri forest. Allow five to eight days to tackle the whole walk; however, there are sections that make full day and half day walks, and several tour operators that offer fully-guided walks. Tour operators such as Cape to Cape Explorer Tours, Inspiration Outdoors and Walk into Luxury combine the best of the track with gourmet food and wine, and a range of accommodation.

BIBBULMUN TRACK, PERTH AND SOUTH WEST

One of the world's greatest long distance walks, the Bibbulmun Track spans 1,000 kilometres through some of Australia's most stunning scenery, including magnificent karri and tingle forests, rivers, valleys, ancient bushland and dramatic cliffs. From Kalamunda in the Perth Hills to Albany / Kinjarling on the south coast, walkers can do the entire track, or shorter sections in a day or over a few days. Join Inspiration Outdoors for guided multi-day tours and The Hike Collective for track experiences as short as two hours.

MUNDA BIDDI TRAIL, PERTH AND SOUTH WEST

As the premier off-road cycling trail in Western Australia, this 1,000-kilometre trail meanders through scenic river valleys, towering eucalyptus forests and ancient, unspoiled bushland from Mundaring in the Perth Hills to Albany in the South West. Joined by a purpose-built track, the Munda Biddi (which means path through the forest in the Noongar language) has sections suitable for cyclists of all ages and experience levels. The trail is easily accessible by car, so you can begin your journey wherever it is convenient.

LANE POOLE RESERVE, DWELLINGUP

Located in the Peel Region, just under 1.5 hours' drive from Perth / Boorloo, Lane Poole Reserve hosts the Murray Valley Mountain Bike Trails, catering for beginner, intermediate and advanced riders. The downhill trails can be accessed by the easy and moderate climbing trails, or via the shuttle road off Murray Valley Road. The trails offer stunning scenery and views over the valley, plus a diverse range of native flora and fauna.



ARKLOW TRAIL NETWORK, COLLIE

The Arklow Trail Network is located just five kilometres from the town of Collie in WA's South West. Designed for mountain bike enthusiasts, the trail network winds its way through the stunning Arklow forest, totalling 36-kilometres — of which 26-kilometres is new or upgraded trail. Six kilometres of the trail has been built to accommodate hand cycles, allowing mountain bike riders with disabilities the opportunity to enjoy even more of the area.

MOUNT LENNARD TRAILS, WELLINGTON NATIONAL PARK

The Mount Lennard Mountain Bike Trail Circuit contains approximately 40 kilometres of trails offering varying difficulties for mountain bikers of all levels. The trails tightly weave through the mature jarrah forest and granite outcrops to provide spectacular views of the lower Collie River Valley in the South West. The highlight is the 'Grizzly Trail' — a narrow trail with obstacles and technical mountain bike features for those who are up for the challenge.

LOOP WALK, KALBARRI NATIONAL PARK

The challenging Loop Walk in Kalbarri National Park on Yamatji Country in WA's Coral Coast highlights the erosive power of the Murchison River and its magnificent red gorges; the iconic 'Nature's Window', a natural rock formation which frames the Murchison Valley; the Bigurda Trail boardwalk, where you can spot whales and dolphins; and the impressive new Kalbarri Skywalk / Kaju Yatka, showcasing the Murchison River Gorge at one of its highest points.

WADJEMUP BIDI, ROTTNEST ISLAND

Traverse unique landscapes of Rottnest Island / Wadjemup along Wadjemup Bidi — a series of walk trails in the A-class reserve, off the coast of Perth / Boorloo. Take on the whole 45-kilometre journey, or choose your own adventure, with five to 10-kilometre sections offering a new way to experience the Island's stunning inland lakes, coastal headlands, Aboriginal art sculptures, WWII tunnels, snorkel spots and local wildlife, including the cute quokkas.

HERITAGE CYCLE TRAIL, SWAN VALLEY

Only a 25-minute drive from Perth, the scenic Swan Valley Heritage Cycle Trail is made up of three routes, suitable for riders of all ages and fitness levels. The trail passes many interesting places including fresh produce stalls, picnic spots, galleries, lively cafes, wineries, microbreweries, distilleries and restaurants. You will find many opportunities to stop, relax and enjoy an abundance of experiences.

THE KALAMUNDA TRAILS NETWORK, PERTH HILLS

About a 40-minute drive from Perth, the Kalamunda Trails area is the most popular mountain biking destination in Western Australia. With excellent facilities and more than 40 kilometres of fully signed single-track, the Kalamunda Trails have something for everyone. The two kilometre Scorpion descent is the most popular, known for its wooden berns and rollercoaster corners.

PURNULULU NATIONAL PARK, KIMBERLEY

The World Heritage-listed Purnululu National Park is home to the awe-inspiring Bungle Bungle Range. 350 million years in the making, its ochre and black striped domes make it one of the most unique and captivating ranges on Earth. The area's best day hikes include Cathedral Gorge and Echidna Chasm, while the five-day Piccaninny Gorge Walk offers spectacular and secluded scenery.

BLUFF KNOLL, STIRLING RANGE NATIONAL PARK

Located north of Albany / Kinjarling in the Stirling Range National Park / Warrungup, Bluff Knoll / Koi Kyeunuruff is the highest and most spectacular peak in WA's South West, sitting at 1,098 metres above sea level. Requiring some fitness, the moderate five kilometre return hike is a picturesque three to four-hour journey to the panoramic views from the bluff, before the descent to the base. The Stirling Range National Park is a biodiversity hotspot, home to 1,500 species of magnificent and colourful flora, many of which are unique to the area.

CASTLE ROCK, PORONGURUP NATIONAL PARK

The massive ancient granite domes of Porongurup National Park in WA's South West rise 670 metres above the landscape, surrounded by a sea of giant Karri trees. Home to the Castle Rock Granite Skywalk, a walking gantry mounted high out from the magnificent Castle Rock, the 4.4 kilometre return hike offers sweeping views of the stunning landscapes and surrounding plains near Albany / Kinjarling.

KARIJINI GORGES AND TRAILS, KARIJINI NATIONAL PARK

Two billion years in the making, Karijini National Park in the Pilbara region is one of WA's most spectacular natural attractions offering amazing hiking trails through ancient gorges. An adventure lover's paradise, explore tunnels of marbled rock, clamber over boulders, squeeze through narrow tunnels, paddle through waterways and descend into ancient chasms — often featuring secret waterfalls. There's also easy access to stunning lookouts and walk trails for varying levels of fitness and experience. Some of the most popular trails include Dales Gorge, Fortescue Falls, Weano Gorge and Oxer's Lookout.

CAPE RANGE NATIONAL PARK, NEAR EXMOUTH

Located within the World Heritage-listed Ningaloo Coast / Nyngulu, Cape Range National Park's rugged limestone ranges and breathtaking deep canyons are surrounded by pristine beaches. Keep an eye out for wildlife such as emus, kangaroos and a variety of birds on one

of the many walk trails through the park, and wonder at the earthy tones of the arid landscapes. Join Exmouth Adventure Co. for guided overnight walking tours of the gorges and coastline, including camping in the national park and snorkelling on Ningaloo Reef.

BOLD PARK, PERTH

At 85 metres above sea level, the seven-kilometre trail through Bold Park in City Beach offers spectacular views over the Indian Ocean, Perth City / Boorloo, Kings Park and Botanic Garden / Kaarta Koomba, and even glimpses of the Swan River / Derbarl Yerrigan. Join a guided hike group tour with The Hike Collective to meet other like-minded walkers, and visit during spring to spot a spectacular array of wildflowers.

FITZGERALD RIVER NATIONAL PARK, GOLDEN OUTBACK

Bushwalking along one of the many trails in this botanical wonderland is the best way to explore the incredible variety of plant life and spectacular rugged landscapes of granite cliffs, limestone ridges, valleys, woodlands and pristine beaches. Fitzgerald River National Park boasts a rich diversity of native and rare plant species, and is one of Australia's largest parks — home to 75 species of endemic plants, found nowhere else in the world. Visit during wildflower season and join a tour with the likes of Edgewalkers to discover this rich biosphere of unique flora and fauna.

Across coastal, urban and outback Western Australia, more than 130 Aboriginal tourism operators proudly share their fascinating stories, distinctive cultures and traditional lands with visitors through a variety of authentic experiences.

ABORIGINAL TOURS

Here's 20 fascinating tours on offer across the State.

BAIYUNGU DREAMING

Baiyungu Dreaming is the first Aboriginal tour experience on offer in the Ningaloo / Nynggulu region. Join Baiyungu woman Hazel Walgar on a 4WD tagalong tour from the Aboriginal-run Carbada Station in Coral Bay to explore hidden locations along the Ningaloo coast, discover culturally significant places and hear the stories connected to them. Explore the coastal plains near Coral Bay to discover shell middens and a sea turtle nursery, learn how to find fresh drinking water, or listen to ancient stories by a sunset campfire.

WOORAMULLA ECO CULTURAL JOURNEYS

Wooramulla Eco Cultural Journeys is a new tour exploring the Yinggarda history and culture of WA's Gascoyne region with passionate guide and local Yinggarda woman Rennee Turner. Departing from the town of Carnarvon in the Coral Coast, tour options include half-day tagalong Tours through the Gascoyne, including the spectacular blowholes of Quobba Station, and overnight tours of Mundathurra Kennedy Loop. There are also three-hour cultural town tours of Carnarvon to discover traditional bushfoods, medicine and wildlife; stargazing story tours; wildflower walkabouts and burrowing bee tours.

GO CULTURAL TOURS & EXPERIENCES

Go Cultural Aboriginal Tours & Experiences is a Perth-based, 100 percent Aboriginal-owned company. With several iconic tour locations within easy access of Perth City / Boorloo, visitors

can experience Aboriginal heritage and culture in the heart of the CBD, Kings Park and Botanic Garden / Kaarta Koomba, or at idyllic Rottnest Island / Wadjemup. Go Cultural Tours' interactive cultural walking tours offer visitors the opportunity to learn about Perth's history, whilst their knowledgeable guides explore the deeper significance of the land, its elements and resources from a local Aboriginal perspective. All tours include a traditional Welcome to Country and Aboriginal language, song and storytelling with a local Noongar guide.

DABUNGOOL CULTURAL EXPERIENCES

Experience the rich cultural history and nature of Kepa Kurl / Esperance with new eyes on this cultural heritage and bush tucker tour. Walk along the nature trails in the Kwongan heathland and bushland with **Dabungool Cultural Experiences**, discovering the abundance of native flora and fauna that are used as bush tucker and traditional medicines, and experience the true taste of Kepa Kurl Noongar Boodjar.

KOOMAL DREAMING

The Margaret River Region's big drawcards — beaches, caves and dining — come together on tours led by local Wardandi man, Josh Whiteland. With **Koomal Dreaming**, you'll journey into Ngilgi Cave for ancient stories and unique didgeridoo acoustics, as well as forage for, and taste, native food and medicine. The menu could include kangaroo, emu, quandong, emu plum and salt bush.



MIMBI CAVES

One of Australia's best-kept secrets, the vast subterranean labyrinth of **Mimbi Caves** / Jarlarloo Riwi is part of a 350-million-year-old Devonian reef system, which houses a significant collection of Aboriginal rock art and some of the most impressive fish fossils in the Southern Hemisphere. The Mimbi area is a place of strong spiritual significance for the traditional owners, the Gooniyandi people. Spectacular limestone formations, brilliant colours and crystal clear freshwater pools set the scene for a guided tour laced with ancient stories and bush tucker.

NGALANG WONGI ABORIGINAL CULTURAL TOURS

Bunbury's original inhabitants, the Noongar people, hunted and fished throughout the Koombana Bay area for thousands of years. Join international artist and storyteller Troy Bennell from

Ngalang Wongi Aboriginal Cultural Tours as he weaves his cultural knowledge into an array of ancient stories and whimsical yarns about traditional and contemporary Aboriginal life, sacred sites, the Noongar six seasons and Dolphin Dreaming, linking to Koombana Bay's population of wild bottlenose dolphins.

MABU BURU TOURS

Mabu Buru Tours is an Aboriginal owned and operated tourism business that provides an Aboriginal perspective to the landscape in and around Broome and introduces guests to the ancient culture of the Yawuru and Karajarri people. Mabu Buru Tours delivers authentic Aboriginal experiences and offers very personal journeys that share culture through traditional methods such as bushfood and bush medicine demonstrations, storytelling, and traditional songs and dances.

OOLIN SUNDAY ISLAND CULTURAL TOURS

Join Rosanna Angus — a Jawi woman whose family lived on Sunday Island during the early mission days — to discover Bardi Jawi culture, as well as the Dreaming stories connected to Sunday Island and the turbulent waters that separate it from the mainland. Departing from Cygnet Bay Pearl Farm, **Oolin Sunday Island Cultural Tours** retrace the ocean journey from Bardi Country on the mainland through the network of islands and tidal passages that make up Jawi Country, and through the whirlpools and eddies between Jooloom and Jayirru to learn how these massive tidal currents were used by the Jawi people to hunt, fish and trade.

WARRANG-BRIDIL

This walking tour reflects **Warrang Bridil's** vision to 'close the gap' on knowledge and understanding of Noongar people's heritage, as they share

their culture with visitors. Explore the shores of the spectacular Swan River / Derbarl Yerrigan overlooking Perth City / Boorloo, Matagarup Bridge and the Optus Stadium precinct. Discover in depth insights into the history of the Noongar nation and the importance of culture, language, values, relationships, responsibilities and social structures.

WARINGARRI ABORIGINAL ARTS

Located in the heart of Miriwoong Country in Kununurra / Goonoonoorang, **Waringarri** was the first Aboriginal owned art centre established in Western Australia. It is a place for Aboriginal artists to share the importance of their country and culture, and supports more than 100 painters, printmakers, wood carvers, boab engravers, sculptors and textile artists. The centre also offers cultural tours and didgeridoo performances to complement the visitor experience, with a rich insight into Miriwoong culture.

GOLDFIELDS HONEY ANT TOURS

Join an authentic on-country bushfood foraging experience with an Aboriginal family in the heart of WA's Golden Outback with **Goldfields Honey Ant Tours**. On this family picnic outing, sample the sweetest of bushfoods, the prized honey ant, forage for witchetty grubs, discover seasonal nuts and fruits, and learn about bush medicine plants. After the foraging, gather round the campfire for billy tea, damper and slow cooked stew whilst being captivated by cultural stories about the traditional lifestyles and art of the Tjupan people and how they still practice cultural ways on country.

WULA GURA NYINDA ECO ADVENTURES

Francois Peron National Park is a picturesque peninsula of acacia-cloaked red dunes and shrub surrounded by turquoise water. Teeming with marine life such as dolphins and rays, the tranquil lagoons are perfect for kayaking and snorkelling. Join award winning guide Darren 'Capes' Capewell from **Wula Gura Nyinda Eco Adventures** for an inside view of the deep spiritual connection between the local Nhanda and Malgana Aboriginal people and this breathtaking saltwater paradise. Most recently, Darren has introduced scenic SUP Tours and an exclusive escape to Australia's westernmost point, Dirk Hartog Island / Wirruwana, to his tour offering.

BORRGORON COAST TO CREEK TOURS

Bardi man and fourth-generation pearler Terry Hunter combines traditional knowledge with his experiences growing up on a remote pearling farm on this walking tour with a difference on the Dampier Peninsula. On **Borrgoron Coast to Creek Tours**' signature experience, you'll learn about how the Bardi (land) and Jawi (island) people have lived in harmony with the land and sea for millenia, with a two hour walk through the mangroves, creeks and tidal flats of King Sound. Along the way, Terry will also share his deep knowledge of the pearling trade and treat you to a tasty bush tucker snack.

KINGFISHER TOURS

Kingfisher Tours pairs luxurious Kimberley region sightseeing with the deep knowledge of their Traditional Custodian guides. Local Aboriginal guides are at the heart of all experiences, be it flying over the beehive shaped domes of the Bungle Bungle Range in Purnululu National Park, before exploring the World Heritage-listed landscape on foot; or bouncing along in a 4WD to visit remote communities, learning stories of the land and its people along the way.

KIMBERLEY CULTURAL ADVENTURES

Join Robert Dann, a proud Kimberley man, for an incredible three-hour cultural experience with **Kimberley Cultural Adventures**. He will share with you a small slice of 40,000 years of Broome / Rubibi and Kimberley culture. Robert

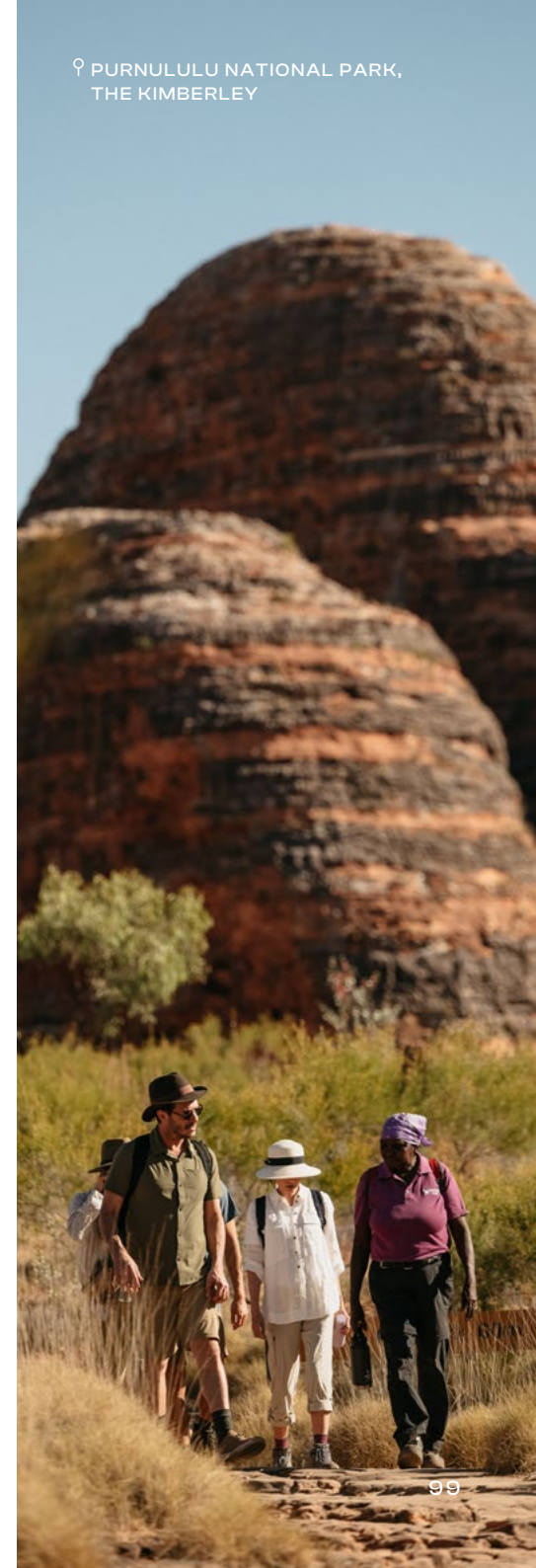

DALE TILBROOK EXPERIENCES

Join Wardandi Bibbulmun woman Dale Tilbrook from **Dale Tilbrook Experiences** in a relaxed setting to learn about native Australian herbs, spices and peppers; and discover the uses of bush tucker plants, their medicinal properties and their surprising health benefits. Enjoy a bushfood-inspired morning or afternoon tea with a delectable range of savoury and sweet dishes. Explore local history and culture or experience the cultural tradition of storytelling through art.

DJURANDI DREAMING

Djurandi Dreaming is owned and operated by Whadjuk man Justin Martin; a tour guide and Aboriginal artworks specialist. Experiences include the Dreaming in the Quay and Yagan Square Perth tours, Boya Kaarla Point Peron tour, Lake Walyungup Torchlight Tour, traditional Aboriginal art workshops and Kings Park education activities.

Aboriginal art abounds in Western Australia, from ancient rock paintings in the Kimberley and remote Aboriginal art centres throughout the region, to art galleries in Perth and fine art in the Margaret River Region. CAMPING WITH CUSTODIANS

Camping with Custodians in WA is an Australia-first program that develops high quality public campgrounds on Aboriginal lands, which are then owned and operated by the Aboriginal community. There are currently six Camping with Custodians sites across the Kimberley and the Pilbara, with a seventh campground currently under development at Lombadina on the Dampier Peninsula, a two-hour drive north of Broome / Rubibi, due to open in 2024. Lombadina will have up to 35 campsites, a camp kitchen and ablution facilities. Several Aboriginal cultural tours are also available from Lombadina to enrich the visitor experience.

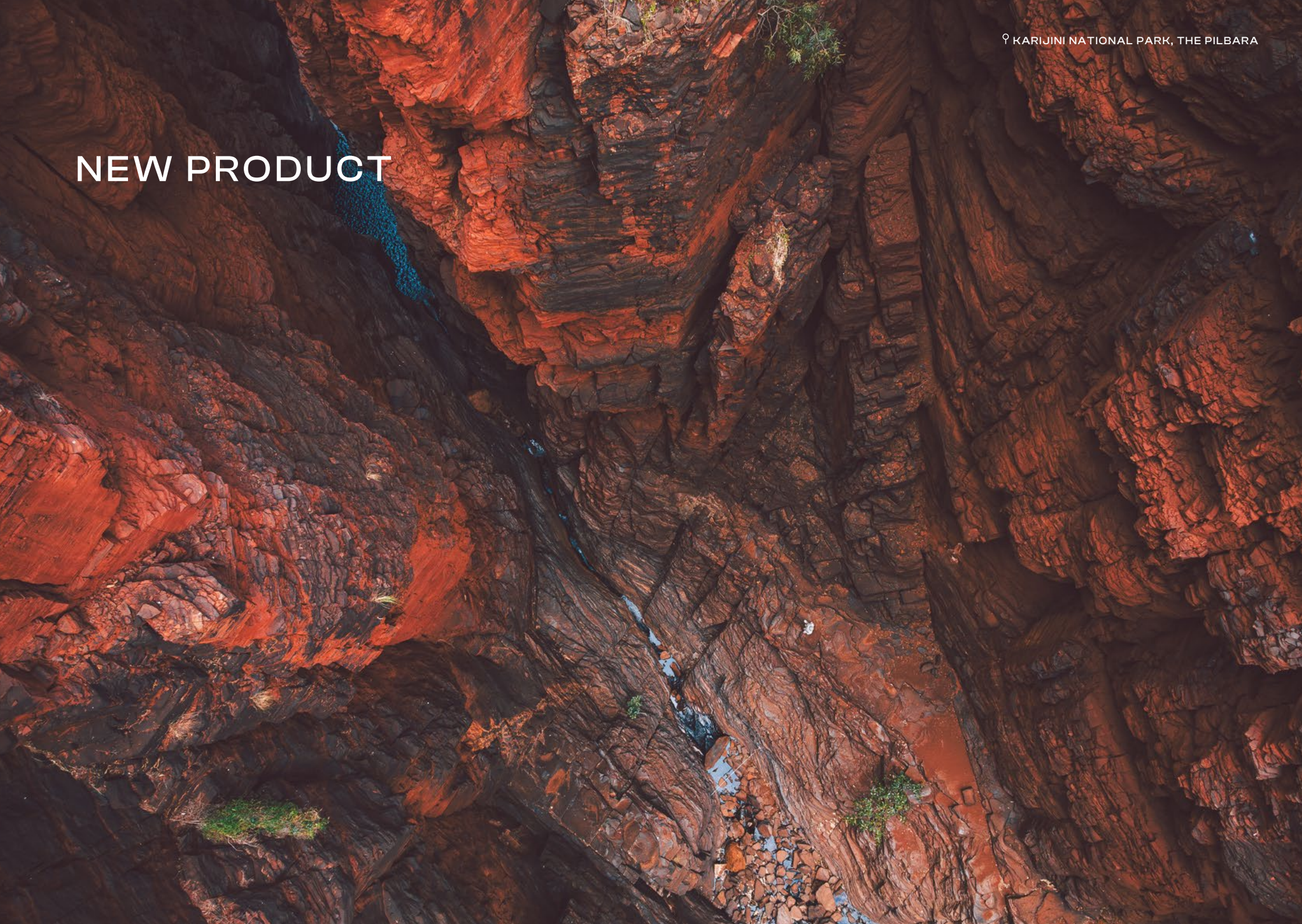

ACCOMMODATION

ABERCROMBIE AND KENT ECO-LODGE (KIMBERLEY, NORTH WEST)

The Kimberley will soon become Australia's latest sustainable tourism hotspot with world-leading luxury travel company **Abercrombie & Kent** set to develop a new eco-lodge in Purnululu National Park. The UNESCO World Heritage-listed site is home to the world-famous Bungle Bungle Range, believed to be over 350 million years old. The environmentally and culturally sensitive premium lodge is due to open by 2027 and will be developed in partnership with the Billingjul Aboriginal Corporation (BAC), with the initiative endorsed by BAC as one of the Traditional Owners for the park. The luxury eco-lodge will be an exciting new offering for visitors to experience the magic of the Kimberley — one of the world's last true wilderness areas, where ancient culture, prehistoric landscapes and otherworldly nature abound.

BEST WESTERN CAMBRIDGE HOTEL KUNUNURRA (KUNUNURRA, NORTH WEST)

The **Best Western Cambridge Hotel Kununurra** located in the Kimberley town of Kununurra / Goonoonoorang in WA's North West, is officially open and welcoming guests. The refurbished hotel features stylish rooms reflecting the colour palette of the surrounding landscapes; a swimming pool, ample parking and the newly opened The Cambridge Brasserie 47, an onsite

restaurant and bar which honours the flavours and produce of the Kimberley. Located a few minutes from Kununurra Airport, the hotel is positioned within walking distance to local shops, restaurants and galleries.

Courtyard by Marriott Perth, Murdoch officially opened its doors in February 2024, located just 10 minutes south of Perth's / Boorloo CBD in one of the city's fastest growing urban catchments. Located on the Dampier Peninsula, 200 kilometres north of Broome / Rubibi, the site features five family tents each with one queen and one bunk bed accommodating up to four people, and seven single tents with queen beds. Each of the tents are fan-cooled and have private ensuites. The eco tents provide a relaxed and natural atmosphere for guests and are just a short walk from the pearl farm's main amenities, including the Homestead Restaurant, infinity pool and pearl gallery. The tents are easily accessible by 2WD vehicle.

DENMARK HOTEL (DENMARK, SOUTH WEST)

Camping with Custodians in WA is an Australia-first initiative, establishing public campgrounds on Aboriginal lands, all owned and operated by the Aboriginal community.

MOONLIGHT BAY SUITES (BROOME, NORTH WEST)

Overlooking Roebuck Bay in the Kimberley town of Broome, **Moonlight Bay Suites** completed its refurbishment in 2024. Each of the property's spacious one and two-bedroom self-contained suites have been transformed with new fixtures, fittings and furnishings throughout. A softer colour palette has been reflected throughout the property, offering a fresh and contemporary feel, with local artwork throughout and bathroom amenities from The Sandalwood Shop in the Kimberley. As the name suggest, Moonlight Bay Suites is the perfect location to witness the Staircase to the Moon phenomenon.

NINGALOO CORAL BAY (CORAL BAY, CORAL COAST)

In the World Heritage-listed Ningaloo / Nynggulu region, the **Ningaloo Coral Bay** holiday village in Coral Bay welcomed the opening of four Bayview Villas in October 2024. The three-bedroom villas are self-contained, with kitchens, bathrooms and new furniture. Two of the villas are ground floor units, and the other two are on the first floor. Both have private decks and balconies. Adding to this will be 16 two-bedroom villas, expected to be completed in 2025.

TOURS & ATTRACTIONS

ADVENTURE CONNECTIONS (COLLIE, SOUTH WEST)

The hub offers adventure enthusiasts and nature lovers a range of guided tours on the picturesque Wambenger Trails, as well as equipment hire and mountain bike shuttle services into and around the park. The historic **Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse** in the Margaret River Region has welcomed the opening of the Lightkeepers' Museum — an interpretive centre housed in one of the lightkeepers' original cottages. The museum showcases the history of the lighthouse and region, including the Wadandi people's 60,000-year custodianship and the influence of weather and whaling which set the scene for enthralling stories of shipwrecks and lightning storms. The opening of the Lightkeepers' Museum is the final part of the Capes Foundation's five-year redevelopment project at Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse.

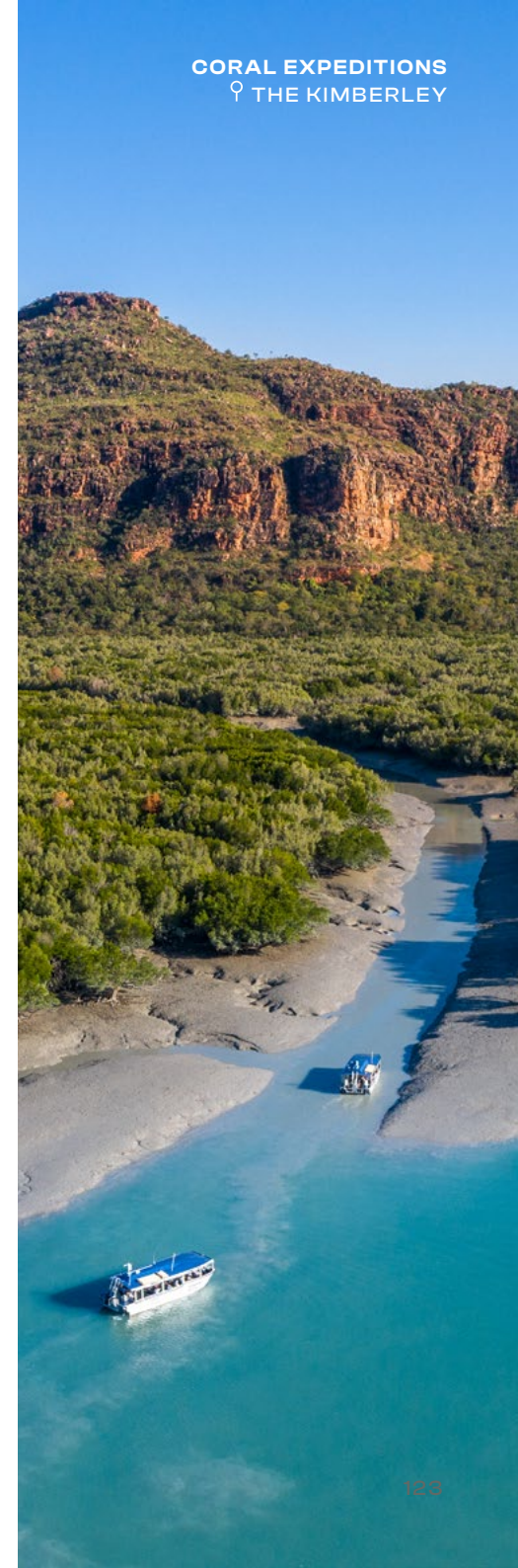

Tour highlights include Milky Way and Southern Cross sightings, along with otherworldly planets and spectacular constellations.

and with the swell and tides, the ocean can mature wine perfectly. The tour concludes at the Ocean Pantry café to sample freshly cooked abalone and the ocean-cellared wine.

REDSEA GALLERY (MARGARET RIVER, SOUTH WEST)

REDSEA Gallery opened its doors in the Margaret River Region in March 2024. THE BIKE KIOSK (MANDURAH, PERTH)

Mandurah's / Mandjoogoordap only eBike and eScooter hire and tour business **The Bike Kiosk**, has released a Peel Produce Peddle tour. Starting at the Mandurah Visitor Centre, the four-hour guided eBike tour follows the coastline, taking in some of the region's coastal highlights including Doddi's Beach, the

Dawesville Channel and one of Thomas Dambo's Giants of Mandurah. Guests will then stop at the Peel Farmers Markets for breakfast and a wander through the locally grown delights. The return ride takes in the Peel Inlet, with plenty of opportunities to spot local wildlife.

THE HIKE COLLECTIVE (PERTH ZOO, PERTH)

Perth-based hiking tour company **The Hike Collective** has launched an exclusive experience at Perth Zoo. Guests can step into a sanctuary of calm before the gates to the zoo open to the public. The two-hour exclusive tour begins with a gentle walk through the rainforest, followed by a 45-minute beginner-friendly yoga session in the calming zoo setting. The journey then continues with a walk through the African savannah and Australian bushland, meeting some of the much-loved locals—from lions and meerkats to pandas, and koalas. The experience finishes with a refreshing cold-pressed juice as you soak in the wonders of the wild.

THE WORLD'S BIGGEST TRACTOR SCULPTURE (CARNAMAH, CORAL COAST)

The **world's biggest tractor sculpture** has been unveiled in the WA Wheatbelt town of Carnamah. The Big Tractor stands at an impressive 11.5 metres high and 16 metres long — a five-times replica of the Chamberlain 40K, the first tractor manufactured in WA in 1949. The Chamberlain tractors played a significant role in the development of WA's agricultural regions after the Second World War. This photographic attraction for visitors to the town (particular during the region's spectacular wildflower

season that runs from July to October) also helps to preserve the history of WA's farming machines and the people who drove them.

THE OZONE AT OPTUS STADIUM (BURSWOOD PARK, PERTH)

Perth's Optus Stadium is offering twilight tours at **THE OZONE**. Step onto the roof of Optus Stadium and be captivated by the dreamy twilight views over Perth's skyline and the stadium below on the VERTIGO by Twilight experience, then, if you can summon a little more courage, hang 42 metres above the ground while you're harnessed from above. The HALO Rooftop Climb by Twilight offers the same stunning views with less adrenaline, with a 360-degree walk around the stadium roof.

ULTIMATE WATERSPORTS (HILLARYS, PERTH)

The adventurous crew behind WA's **Ultimate Watersports** has zoomed into Hillarys Boat Harbour. Offering jet ski hire, guided jet ski tours, fishing jet skis, paddleboarding, kayaking; Flyboard X, an exhilarating hydroflight; and the Waydoo Flyer E-Foil, an electric foil board; the Hillarys location is fully equipped for a thrilling or leisurely day out on the water. Ultimate Watersports Hillarys Boat Harbour is a welcome addition to the existing locations in Broome/Rubibi, Exmouth, Geraldton and Perth/Boorloo.

VENTUR ATLAS (THE KIMBERLEY, NORTH WEST)

Ventur Atlas is a new WA-based touring company providing premium and immersive land, air and sea adventures in the Kimberley region. Offering one — to six-day explorations of one of the last true wilderness areas, the tours provide exclusive access to iconic landmarks such as the Horizontal Falls / Garaan-ngaddim, Bell Gorge / Dalmanyi, Windjana Gorge / Bandilngan, Tunnel Creek / Dimalurru, Twin Flame Falls in the Wunaamin Miliwundi Ranges, Cygnet Bay Pearl Farm and Mount Hart Station. The all-inclusive tour packages include all meals, high-end eco-tent accommodation and an itinerary of adventures including extensive helicopter and seaplane travel, luxury 4WD coach tours and boating adventures.

WILLIE CREEK PEARL FARM ADVENTURE GETAWAY (BROOME, NORTH WEST)

Broome's **Willie Creek Pearls** has released multi-day adventure getaway experiences. Partnering with Kimberley Getaway, there are two action-filled packages to explore the best parts of Willie Creek Pearl Farm. Guests will stay onboard luxury floating accommodation, 'The Barra Shack' — a spacious three-level custom built houseboat featuring a large entertainment area and stunning panoramic views accommodating up to 12 guests. A three-day adventure getaway, or a five-day group adventure getaway for private group bookings of six to 12 guests is available now. tour options available, perfect for nature lovers seeking a low-impact, unique experience in one of Australia's most biodiverse environments. Each tour is guided by environmental educator Emma Bennett, offering guests an enriching and immersive experience where they can learn about the region's incredible flora and wildlife. Tours depart from the spectacular Valley of the Giants, are fully guided and include all equipment, so guests simply need to bring an adventurous spirit. The new tour offerings signify the next chapter of WOW Wilderness, a renowned operator known for leading visitors on EcoCruises on the Walpole-Nornalup Inlets Marine Park.



FOOD & WINE

AH UM (NORTHBRIDGE, PERTH)

Perth / Boorloo listening bar Astral Weeks has welcomed the opening of a restaurant. **Ah Um** is an intimate offering tucked behind Astral Weeks, with only 25 seats, and offering a curated modern-European share-style menu. The restaurant has the same focus on sound, with the dining soundtracks being chosen from mixes uploaded to AW Radio — Astral Weeks' recently launched online streaming platform.

AZABU BY KAMPAI (NORTHBRIDGE, PERTH)

A premium Japanese dining experience has opened its doors in Perth's cultural hub of Northbridge. **Azabu by Kampai** focuses on showcasing premium A5 wagyu sourced directly from Japan. With restaurants in Malaysia and Kuala Lumpur, Azabu by Kampai is the first to

open in Australia. The restaurant offers a menu that showcases Wagyu Kappo and Yakimiku — a style of Japanese cuisine that emphasises the meticulous preparation and presentation of dishes using premium A5 Wagyu as the centrepiece. Also on the menu is a seafood selection of oysters and sashimi, along with smaller bites and a curated cocktail list.

BAILEY BREWING CO (DUNSBOROUGH, SOUTH WEST)

WA brewery **Bailey Brewing Co** has opened a second venue in the Margaret River Region. Following the success of its Swan Valley brewery, which opened in Perth's wine region in 2020, the owners have expanded the offering by taking over the former Clancy's Fish Pub venue in Dunsborough. Bringing its easy-drinking beers and family friendly vibes with it, the brewery features a menu of simple beers, local wines and hearty food to fuel the entire family.

BAR LOVE (NORTHBRIDGE, PERTH)

Bar Love is a retro dive bar-inspired venue that opened its doors in Northbridge in October 2024. The hand-painted outdoor signage promises 'cold drinks, warm service and hot bartenders', with the interiors offering 70's maximalist with hot pink walls, bric-a-brac and velvet love seats. Signature cocktails are served up alongside seasonal creations and quality classics, with four taps pouring batched cocktails and local brews and a minimalist wine list. A menu of classic bar snacks is also on offer to keep patrons satisfied.

BAYSWATER HOTEL (BAYSWATER, PERTH)

Local favourite the **Bayswater Hotel** reopened its doors in October 2024 after a \$7 million-dollar redevelopment. Located in Perth's eastern suburb of Bayswater, the historic hotel's old charm has been mixed with a modern design, and now boasts one of the largest and most impressive family offerings in the city. Inside, there's a lively sports bar with pool tables and its own alfresco space. The hall-sized family restaurant has been refreshed, and the newly designed outdoor area offers a landscaped beer garden with large TV screen, and a custom-built children's playground with an impressive 10-metre-tall tower with slide. The menu offers a mix of classic pub favourites, wood-fired pizzas, innovative dishes, and kid-friendly options; alongside an impressive 64 beer taps featuring local brews, plus wine and cocktails.

BERT'S CITY BEACH (CITY BEACH, PERTH)

The team behind Perth foodie hotspots The Rowing Pavilion and General Public Food Co has announced a relaxed new venture in City Beach. **Bert's** will be a new full-service pub and dining venue set to open in late 2025, offering a laidback dining experience which embodies coastal living. Its name is a tribute to 'Bert's Shop', a former beach kiosk and surf hangout which served up ice creams and snacks to the surfing crowd during the 1950s and early 1960s. The modern revival will retain the sense of community and spirit of the original shop, bolstered by the hallmarks of modern dining — seasonal local produce, sustainable practices and thoughtful design. City Beach is one of Perth's 19 metropolitan beaches, located around ten kilometres from the city centre.

BEYOND DISTILLING (PERTH CBD, PERTH & BUSSELTON, SOUTH WEST)

Busseton-based distillery **Beyond Distilling** has launched a two-hour gin masterclass sure to appeal to budding distillers. The experience includes a guided tour of Beyond Distilling, a tasting paddle featuring four of Beyond's small-batch gins, the opportunity to create a custom gin in a mini copper still, and a take-home, named 500ml bottle of the final bespoke creation. Beyond prides itself on its local, from-scratch approach, working with local farmers and infusing native botanicals in its lively product range, all overseen by Head Distiller Greg Garnish. Everything is crafted onsite so the result is a truly home-grown piece of WA's South West.



BLAK TAPAS BUSH FOOD CAFÉ (KUNUNURRA, NORTH WEST)

Blak Tapas Bush Food Cafe has opened its doors in the Kimberley town of Kununurra / Goonoorang. The proudly local and Aboriginal-owned cafe has partnered with Job Pathways to host job seekers interested in beginning a career in hospitality. The café showcases the native flavours of Indigenous Australia, with house made sweet and savoury treats showcasing signature bush food flavours and flare.

BLASTA COLLECTIVE (BURSWOOD, PERTH)

One of Perth's inner-city breweries had a makeover in early 2024. Blasta Brewery reopened as the **Blasta Collective**, spanning across two buildings and joined by a picturesque laneway known as Unicorn Alley. The sprawling 1400-capcity

venue is home to a gastrobrewery located in a converted red brick warehouse, a beer hall, alfresco area with children's playground, florist, patisserie, bottle shop and a cafe. Offering multiple dining zones and a private dining greenhouse, the gastrobrewery serves up an elevated dining menu with a focus on local ingredients, while the Beer Hall offers more traditional pub fare.

BREWDOG (WEST PERTH, PERTH)

Scottish craft beer powerhouse **BrewDog** opened its first venue in WA in January 2024. Taking over the former 945 square metre Gordon Street Garage site in West Perth, the fifth BrewDog establishment in Australia boasts two bars, an open-air beer garden, and lounge area with arcade games. The interior features an industrial aesthetic nodding to its heritage, including the original Blue Seal

chocolate factory signage, bright neon signs, leather seating, industrial lighting and a retail store featuring BrewDog beer. With 20 taps of craft beer, and a diverse beverage menu, the venue caters to various tastes. The food menu includes plant-based options alongside BrewDog's signature dishes.

BROOME ADVENTURE CRUISES (BROOME, NORTH WEST)

Broome Adventure Cruises has launched an elevated high tea experience focussing on the flavours of the Kimberley region. The **Boab and Myrtle Chandon High Tea** takes guests on a culinary and cultural journey, hosted at the company's private venue, Broome Weddings and Events, located on the water edge of beautiful Roebuck Bay. The exclusive, immersive experience includes a Chandon garden spritz welcome drink on arrival, a Kimberley pearl meat appetiser, a

Chandon sparkling tasting flight, theatrical flambéed camembert and a delicious tasting paddle of homemade cakes. The menu has been designed with local flavours in mind, including boab nut and aromatic myrtle, and the experience includes complimentary return transfers from Broome/Rubibi resorts.

BURRATA BAR (NORTHBRIDGE, PERTH)

Burrata lovers can now get their cheesy fix in Perth's cultural hub of Northbridge with the opening of the **Burrata Bar**. The popular Perth food truck has now found a permanent home on Aberdeen Street in the heart of Northbridge. The venue serves a variety of burrata dishes including burrata bowls, focaccia sandwiches and cheesy pasta dishes, such as gnocchi bowls topped with a burrata ball, seven days a week.

CABLE BEACH HOUSE (BROOME, NORTH WEST)

Cable Beach House (CBH) opened its doors for the 2024 season on the doorstep of one of Australia's best beaches — Cable Beach. Formerly Zanders, the property has been restyled and revitalised to reflect a more modern era, whilst still showing off its significant history. Grab a bite from the CBH Kiosk or stop to enjoy a delicious sit-down meal with a large range of cocktails to choose from.

CASSIA (FREMANTLE, PERTH)

Opening in Fremantle / Walyalup, **Cassia** celebrates and redefines the art of the classic Australian barbecue. Cassia's menu focuses on live-fire cooking techniques. Designed to be shared, the menu includes an array of smoked meats, fresh seafood and seasonal vegetables, cooked over a wood fire. Both the drinks list and the food menu showcase the best of WA producers. The venue is designed around its open kitchen, with the custom-made 1.2 metre wide wood-free grill taking a fiery centre stage.

CHELSEA SOCIAL (PERTH CBD)

Bringing some British-inspired flair and a whole lot of West Australian atmosphere, **Chelsea Social** has arrived in Murray Street, in the Perth CBD. Open from morning until evening, it serves a delicious and expansive menu, filled with all-day brunch options, pub classics and abundant share platters. The interiors are light and airy, with pops of post-box red delivering the London charm.

Chelsea Social is located within the Ibis Perth hotel, in the heart of the buzzing Murray Street district, and close to the prestigious King Street precinct.

CHIPPIES (ROTTNEST ISLAND, PERTH)

Visitors to Perth's Rottne Island / Wadjemup can now enjoy an iconic Aussie dining experience — eating fresh fish and chips served from a food van. Located at the Rottne Island Golf Club, **Chippies** is serving up freshly battered snapper, hot chips, crumbed prawns, squid rings and more. It's the ideal food stop after a round of golf at the much-loved golf course or a game of barefoot lawn bowls.

COMMON BAKERY (FREMANTLE, PERTH)

One of Fremantle's much-loved restaurants Bread in Common has expanded its offering to the port city's historic west end. **Common Bakery** serves up the signature Bread in Common wood-fired and preservative free bread that's baked daily, alongside freshly baked foccacias and pastries, and barista coffee. This is the third Common Bakery opening for Bread in Common, with two locations in the western suburb of Nedlands.

CROUCHING MONKEY (NORTHBRIDGE, PERTH)

Northbridge icon The Brass Monkey hotel has expanded its repertoire with the opening of **Crouching Monkey** restaurant. Taking over the upper level, this dynamic Asian fusion restaurant is serving imaginative share plates and

colourful cocktails, with an emphasis on fresh flavours and a vibrant atmosphere. The 'Tuk Tuk Menu' offers a chef selected feast, while classics like Massaman Beef Curry and Red Curry Duck feature in the curry line-up. Crouching Monkey enhances The Brass Monkey's existing options which include a main bar, sports bar and rooftop bar.

DE'SENDENT (MARGARET RIVER, SOUTH WEST)

Ideally located on the main street of Margaret River town, **de'sendent** is a new culinary venture for the former owners of successful winery and restaurant Arimia Estate — Ann Spencer and Executive Chef Evan Hayter. With capacity for only 35 diners inside and options for alfresco dining outside, the restaurant serves up a seasonal, refined dining experience with a darker, more intimate atmosphere. De'sendent emphasises a commitment to high-quality, local, organic produce sourced from like-minded producers with shared values. The menu features premium WA ingredients, including abalone, Wagyu beef, marron, and uni (sea urchin), and the restaurant's interior offers an intimate open kitchen experience.

FALLOW (NORTHBRIDGE, PERTH)

Fallow opened its doors in May 2024, taking over a long-vacant, multi-storey heritage building in Northbridge. The 248-seat modern bar and kitchen offers an open kitchen experience with a wood-fired oven and hearth, along with a unique meat vault that showcases dry-aged cuts. The menu showcases Fallow's fire power, with dry-aged steaks and

expertly roasted meats and vegetables amongst the highlights. The venue's interior offers a rustic dining experience, alongside a drinks menu of speciality curated drinks.

FLORA & FAUNA (FREMANTLE, PERTH)

One of Perth's popular vegan cafes has moved from its 'hole in the wall' location in Northbridge, to the port city of Fremantle. **Flora & Fauna** serves up delicious and vibrant plant-based dishes, alongside baked treats, coffee and freshly squeezed juices. The Fremantle location offers a bigger café space, with vintage and eclectic furniture welcoming patrons to sit down and dine.

FORAGE SAFARIS (MARGARET RIVER, SOUTH WEST)

Forage Safaris' newly launched Flavours of Italy tour takes food-loving visitors on a small group, hands-on food and wine experience in Margaret River. After a light breakfast at Dunsborough's Merchant and Marker, guests create authentic Tuscan dishes alongside celebrated chef Sioban Sargent of Wildwood Valley Cooking School, before sitting down to a long-table lunch together. Each of the five courses hero local produce, alongside paired local Italian wine varietals, with expert insights by Leah Clearwater from the Margaret River Wine Academy. The experience includes hotel pick up and drop off, breakfast and lunch plus tastings and pairings, and a take-home recipe book.

FOUND. SUBIACO (SUBIACO, PERTH)

A new brewery has found its home in the inner-city suburb of Subiaco. **FOUND. Subiaco** opened its doors in November 2024 and is the flagship venue for the brewery — with an existing venue in the outer-city suburb of Byford. The refurbished 350-person venue includes an inside area and outside beer garden, and an on-site brewery pouring a range of different brews on tap. The venue's food menu focuses on elevated pub fare showcasing the best of WA produce.

FROTH CRAFT BEACH (NORTH BEACH, PERTH)

Froth Craft Brewery has opened its third WA venue in Perth's coastal suburb of North Beach. Froth Craft Beach is a 120-capacity craft beer taphouse with dreamy 180-degree views over the Indian Ocean. The family-friendly and dog-friendly venue offers in-house beers, seltzers and 16 craft brews on tap showcasing the brewery's diverse beer range — with alfresco dining and a play area for children. After opening in the Coral Coast town of Exmouth in 2017, Froth has since opened Froth Craft Bunbrewery in Bunbury / Goomburrup in 2023, and now brings its laid-back and welcoming vibe to Perth's coastal suburbs.

GIBNEY (COTTESLOE, PERTH)

Perth welcomed the opening of **Gibney** in May 2024 — a sophisticated seaside brasserie and grill overlooking the Indian Ocean in Cottesloe. With a 45-metre ocean facing frontage and capacity for

approximately 160, this luxury brasserie from Kailis Hospitality Group is formal in its approach with tablecloths, jacketed wait staff, all soft furnishings, marble, brass and high-end tableware. The menu draws inspiration from traditionally classic steakhouses and brasseries throughout Europe, London and New York, and showcases classic French cooking utilising local produce. The vast drinks menu offers tableside cocktails and Perth's largest champagne selection.

GINZA NANA ALLEY (PERTH CBD, PERTH)

Australia's first Yokochi-style dining experience has opened its doors down a Perth laneway. **Ginza Nana Alley** is a 70-person space with an authentic street-style atmosphere. The five venues within the space include Ginza Midai which specialises in oden; Yakitori Washokudo, a fire grill dedicated to skewers; Onomichi Ramen Mitsuya offers Onomichi-style ramen; Tonkatsu Kubota is Japanese comfort food with a western twist; and Monkey and Bird is a retro-inspired Japanese style cafe and bar. An array of Japanese vending machines can also be found in the venue, providing visitors with an authentic street experience.

H&C URBAN WINERY (FREMANTLE, PERTH)

WA's first urban winery opened its doors in the port city of Fremantle in February 2024. **H&C Urban Winery** is a bar, restaurant, events space, cellar door and fully operational winery all under one roof. The concept of the urban winery means parcels of grapes are sourced from WA, then crushed, stored and fermented on-site, and produced

through collaborating with some of the State's best wine makers. With the venue's various owners also managing multiple distilleries, there's also a focus on spirits — plus beer taps pouring local brews, and a food menu that showcases fresh local produce designed to share. The large venue offers a lush and serene setting, with a large barrel room used to host events.

HAVEN CAFÉ (BROOME, NORTH WEST)

Open, airy and drenched in golden sunlight, **Haven Café** opened its doors in Broome's vibrant Chinatown precinct for the 2024 season. Open seven days a week, the brunch spot features specialty WA roasted coffee and mouth-watering food such as pulled pork benedict and cinnamon scroll waffles. The café offers dine-in and convenient grab-and-go options.

HAVZA (ROTTNEST ISLAND, PERTH)

A contemporary Mediterranean dining experience has popped up on the shores of one of Rottnest Island's most popular beaches, The Basin. **HAVZA** is an outdoor dining experience offering stunning Indian Ocean views alongside a menu that blends the flavours of the Aegean Sea with local WA produce. The casual, family-friendly dining experience serves up tapas-style dishes designed for sharing — with takeaway options also available for true beachside dining.



ILMA BEACH HOUSE (BUNKER BAY, SOUTH WEST)

The Margaret River Region in WA's South West has welcomed the opening of a stunning beach-side restaurant. Taking over the former Bunkers Beach House, **Ilma Beach House** is the latest venue from restaurateurs Liz and Mark Ahearn, who also own the popular Meelup Farmhouse in Dunsborough. Located on the shores of Bunker Bay, the restaurant offers stunning views of the pristine waters of Bunker Bay Beach, and has been freshly renovated to reflect the coastal backdrop. The menu offers Mediterranean-inspired flavours featuring locally sourced seafood, with brunch and lunch options for relaxed and shared-style dining. There's also a Kofe Kabana for takeaway coffees and ice creams to take to the beach.

LIGHT YEARS (PERTH CBD)

East Coast culinary mainstay, **Light Years** has brightened the Perth CBD with an outlet at the popular 140 William Street precinct. The latest installment of the iconic Byron Bay establishment brings an elevated holiday atmosphere to the heart of the city, with a 200-seat venue inside the heritage Gordon Stephenson House. Its Asian-inspired menu, curated by culinary director Robbie Oijvall, encourages share-style dining with newly developed dishes including an expanded dumplings selection, steak tartare and lobster noodles sitting alongside Light Years' favourites such as kingfish ceviche, crispy pork belly and miso corn ribs. Meanwhile, its extensive wine list will showcase West Australian winemakers plus globally sourced varieties and the cocktail menu features the boldly flavoured and colourful options that Light Years is known for.

LIL'S ROOFTOP & BAR (PERTH CBD)

Perth's / Boorloo CBD has welcomed a new era of modern hospitality for a former stalwart in Perth's late-night scene — Tigerlils. Taking over the venue is **Lil's Rooftop & Bar**, a well-rounded, retro-chic eating and drinking hub that features a 600-person capacity with two distinct spaces — a ground floor main bar and a vibrant open-air rooftop. The main bar is home to casual bites, large TV screens for live sport, sunny outdoor tables for after-work drinks, and lively Saturday nights with Lil's Late Night Disco. The rooftop is a lush, open-air oasis in the heart of the city, designed for sun-soaked drinks and share-friendly plates. The Mediterranean-inspired menu by Executive Chef Mark Zavone offers small plates, woodfire pizzas and hearty mains, paired with a curated drinks menu of local wines, beers, spritzes and agave-forward drinks.

LITTLE IRIS CAFÉ (DUNSBOROUGH, SOUTH WEST)

Little Iris Cafe is in full bloom in the town of Dunsborough in the Margaret River Region. A laidback and relaxing cafe that makes the most of the WA sunshine with outdoor garden seating, along with indoor benches and pink bar stools against the glass window storefront. Little Iris offers a selection of cakes, toasties, bowls and brunch options, all topped with locally sourced condiments and preserves.

LITTLE LOCAL (ESPERANCE, GOLDEN OUTBACK)

Popular Esperance / Kepa Kurl bakery Bread Local has welcomed a baby bakery sister — **Little Local**. Conveniently located in the Esperance town centre, the cafe offers the core bread, pastry and sandwich range from Bread Local. Specialising in handcrafted, naturally leavened and slowly fermented sourdough bread, the Bread Local bakery is only open Friday and Saturday — so the opening of Little Local gives baked bread lovers the chance to sample the goods six days a week, with the convenience of a ready-made range. Enjoy delicious pastries, freshly prepared sandwiches and cold press juices for lunch on the go.

LITTLE OTTO'S BIG CHOC SHOP (BUSSELTON, SOUTH WEST)

Visits to the picturesque Busselton foreshore are set to be even sweeter, with the recent opening of **Little Otto's Big Choc Shop**. The playful new addition offers house-made chocolate and gelato, alongside shakes, coffees and other takeaway sweet treats. Owned and operated by the team behind Shelter Brewing Co, the shop carries a bright and joyful aesthetic, sure to appeal to the young and young-at-heart. The namesake behind the shop is Otto, the 24-metre blue whale on display in the WA Museum Boola Bardip, preserved by taxidermist Otto Lipfert in 1897 after it was discovered beached in Busselton.

LITTLE WAVE (SCARBOROUGH, PERTH)

Little Wave has opened its doors in Perth's coastal suburb of Scarborough. The wine bar and café offers stunning Indian Ocean views, ideal for watching a WA sunset. The menu offers Mediterranean-inspired flavours, with share plates and larger dishes, and a wine list featuring local and European varieties. As well as an evening wine bar, the venue also offers a relaxed beach-side café vibe, serving up coffee for the early beachgoers.

LUPE'S CERVECERIA (PERTH CBD)

Lupe's Cerveceria is a new underground tequila and taco bar located in the heart of Perth's CBD. A 'Mexican discotheque meets agave oasis,' the venue is the latest venture from hospitality group Sesh Mafia — adding to the growing list of Perth hot spots including Shui, Margot's and neighbouring Papi Katsu. Inspired by the colourful, back-alley bars of Mexico, the bar features bright neon lights, vintage Mexican posters and a wall lined with tequilas, mezcals and raicillas — which are used for the venues vibrant cocktail offering. The food menu is kept simple, with a selection of tacos, botanas (snacks) and la paletas (ice creams).



MAGIC APPLE WHOLEFOODS (COTTESLOE, PERTH)

Magic Apple Wholefoods has opened its doors at one of Perth's most notable seaside addresses in Cottesloe. Originally established in WA in the 1970's as a smoothie bar then restaurant chain, Magic Apple is now a modern-day hospitality concept embracing the clean eating and wellness movements. Offering stunning Indian Ocean views, the 110-person dine-in capacity restaurant is open seven days a week for breakfast, lunch and dinner. The Cottesloe location will be the flagship site for Magic Apple Wholefoods, with a company-owned, national rollout of the wholefoods restaurant planned over the next two years.

MARGOT'S (NORTHBRIDGE, PERTH)

Margot's has opened its doors at the upper end of William Street in Northbridge. The 120-person venue has taken over a 100-year-old building and transformed it into a modern deli,

cellar and bar — dedicated to the craft of creating the classic martini cocktail. With a Baltic and North-Eastern European-inspired menu, expect to see share plates that include house-made seasonal pickles, local meats, cold and cured seafood, charcuterie and stone baked breads. From behind the custom-built red marble bar sourced from the Pilbara, the drinks menu pays homage to martinis and classic cocktails, with an old-world European inspired wine list, plus an extensive selection of WA wines, spirits and pre-made beverages available in the bottle shop for drink in and takeaway.

THE MARGARET RIVER WINE ACADEMY (MARGARET RIVER, SOUTH WEST)

The Margaret River Wine Academy has launched in the Margaret River Region in a first of its kind for WA's South West. It offers small group wine education courses for individuals, groups, tourism and hospitality providers, corporate and conferencing programs, and workplace training. Specialising in teaching people

about the unique attributes of the region and its world-class wines, each course runs for two to three hours, finishing with a tasting of various regional wines. There are a range of wine enthusiast courses on offer that focus on varietals including chardonnay, cabernet and sparkling, as well as a wine basics course. Run by Margaret River local Leah Clearwater, who has lived in the region for 20 years, the courses are hosted at wineries throughout the region and can also be privately run at visitors' accommodation.

MASSERIA (MARGARET RIVER REGION, SOUTH WEST)

The Margaret River Region welcomed a new Italian dining experience in December 2024, with the team at Cherubino Wines re-opening the iconic Caves Road site — formerly Frui Momento. **Masseria** showcases casual Italian-Mediterranean cuisine using traditional methods with a South West twist. The osteria-inspired menu features WA produce with flavours from Italy's culinary hotspots. The wine list complements the menu, with Cherubino wines featuring alongside a selection of Italian and French wines from Larry Cherubino's import portfolio.

MISS CHOWS MARGARET RIVER (MARGARET RIVER, SOUTH WEST)

Perth's renowned contemporary south-east Asian restaurant group Miss Chows — helmed by Jacquie Chan — opened **Miss Chows Margaret River** at Edwards Estate winery in November 2024. The new-build restaurant offers contemporary urban dining, with modern Asian dishes

paired with local wines and set amongst the rolling vineyards. Locally sourced produce features prominently on the menu, with dishes such as Margaret River venison tartare, Amelia Park lamb and lemongrass dumplings, abalone from Augusta and truffle from the South West.

MONELLI (BURNS BEACH, PERTH)

Meaning 'mischievous rascals', **Monelli** is a playfully elegant new addition to Perth's Italian dining scene. Opening in the northern coastal suburb of Burns Beach, Monelli offers an elevated Mediterranean dining experience in a sophisticated setting, and is helmed by husband-and-wife owners Ezio Patrizi and Cinzia Di Pio in collaboration with their daughter Eleonora Patrizi. Its menu heroes seasonal produce, fresh seafood and handmade pasta, alongside classic desserts and an Amalfi-inspired cocktail list. Embracing an understated design, Monelli gives a subtle nod to its coastal setting and effortlessly blends alfresco and indoor dining. Monelli serves breakfast, lunch and dinner and is set to offer events and functions soon.

MOON & MARY (FREMANTLE, PERTH)

Moon & Mary opened its doors in Fremantle in September 2024. It brings together an exciting mix of modern Asian dining in The Dining Room, casual beer garden vibes in The Rec Yard, and a speakeasy bar plus in-house distillery at Best Behaviour. The venue pays tribute to Fremantle's little-known Asian heritage, drawing inspiration from WA's first documented Chinese person to arrive in the State — Moon Chow. Moon & Mary is

a bespoke build, with three venues under one roof and incorporating the existing heritage elements on the site of the Old Fremantle Lockup. Patrons can expect a seafood focused, modern Asian fusion menu, and a drinks list of premium spirits distilled in-house.

OSCARS IN THE VALLEY (SWAN VALLEY, PERTH)

Family owned and operated restaurant Oscar's has partnered with the team at Limeburners Whisky and Giniversity Gin to open **Oscar's in the Valley**. Formerly located in Guilford, Oscar's can now be found at the cellar door of Limeburners and Giniversity in the Valley in Perth's Swan Valley wine region. The restaurant offers a modern Australian menu designed for sharing and one that celebrates WA produce. The food can be paired with an array of different gin and whisky cocktails from Limeburners and Giniversity, as well as Swan Valley wines and local beers.

OTHERSIDE OF NOWHERE (WEST LEEDERVILLE, PERTH)

Otherside of Nowhere has opened its doors in West Leederville. Formerly Nowhereman, the venue is the result of a merger with Otherside brewery and alongside some layout changes, the venture has a live music program, a revamped food menu, and a selection of Otherside brews on tap. The venue also has a dedicated children's area, an outdoor alfresco area, and an integrated retail and takeaway space.

PAPI KATSU (PERTH CBD, PERTH)

Modern Japanese eatery **Papi Katsu** has opened its doors on St Georges Terrace in the heart of Perth's CBD. The subterranean izakaya draws inspiration from contemporary Japanese cuisine, with a focus on seasonal produce and locally sourced seafood. A premium caviar service and a daily selection of sashimi features on the menu, alongside larger dishes such as wagyu sirloin and glacier 51 toothfish. With a cyberpunk-inspired interior of neon lights and modern wooden furnishings, the venue is designed for fun with a menu that encourages sharing and an extensive drinks list featuring sake, signature cocktails, wines and beers.

PELICAN (ROTTNEST ISLAND, PERTH)

Pelican opened its doors at the recently renovated The Lodge Wadjemup in late December 2024. The kiosk is designed to bring back the nostalgia of island summers past with its corner milk bar aesthetic, serving up soft serve ice creams, coffee, sandwiches, baguettes and sweet treats. Guests can 'grab and go' or sit back and relax under the umbrellas in the precinct's courtyard.

REPUBLIC OF FREMANTLE (FREMANTLE, PERTH)

Award-winning Fremantle distillery, the **Republic of Fremantle** has unveiled a new Distillery Bar and a partnership with Da Napoli's Kitchen and Pizzeria. The new Distillery Bar is tucked away near the working stills area and offers a unique bar experience and a varied drinks menu,

including signature spirits, spritzes and classic cocktails. Meanwhile, the Da Napoli team has moved in the pizza ovens and is serving up handmade pizzas and pasta, classic desserts and sharing starters. The new offerings enhance the venue's existing experiences including a cocktail bar, gin school, tours and tasting flights.

ROMULUS (LEEDERVILLE, PERTH)

Wine bar Romulus is serving up Mediterranean delights in the bustling city-fringing Perth suburb of Leederville. Named after Roman mythology, **Romulus** focuses on good food, wine and most importantly — good vibes. A range of wine choices from Australia, Italy, USA, Argentina and France accompany the starters such as olive focaccia or a main like mushroom and chorizo risotto.

SASSY (PERTH CBD)

Sassy is a late-night aperitivo and cocktail bar merging Italian flair with delectable bites. Offering sophistication and sass, with a menu serving up a range of Mediterranean-inspired 'cicchetti' or small bites, and expertly crafted cocktails. Open till late Wednesday through to Saturday, guests can dance to disco house beats under a giant disco ball on Saturday nights; then from Monday to Friday the venue transforms into Mammis Espresso Bar — a 'hole in the wall' takeaway coffee bar serving fresh brews and sweet treats.



SECRET PICNIC ADVENTURES (BUSSELTON, SOUTH WEST)

After the success of its adventures in neighbouring towns, **Secret Picnic Adventures** has arrived in Busselton. Part foodie trail, part problem-solving adventure, the picnics commence at Busselton Visitor Centre before leading guests to delicious nearby locations. Foodies can follow the digital clues to collect local delights which have been carefully curated to showcase the best of the region's food outlets, while taking in the town's attractions and scenery. The tours are available on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays, with a Dunsborough tour set to launch in spring 2025.

SHIRLEY'S (FREMANTLE, PERTH)

Shirley's is the latest venture from the team behind the popular Manuka Woodfire Kitchen, located just 35-metres down the road. The cosy wine bar serves local and international wines alongside spirits and creative cocktails, with an art deco decor mixed with vintage pieces. The food menu offers bar snacks, and more substantial bites — with pies, lasagna, vegetable terrine and cheese plates on the menu.

SOMEWHERE IN THE PARK (VICTORIA PARK, PERTH)

Victoria Park is now home to another bustling wine bar, with the recent opening of **Somewhere in the Park**, along the popular Albany Highway precinct. It offers a rotating list of more than 200 wines from around the world, along with a refined craft beer selection, and an accompanying menu bursting

with share plates, gourmet pizzas, local seafood and upscale pub classics. The venue carries a relaxed aesthetic with indoor-outdoor seating and an open mezzanine, in addition to a dedicated kids' play area and free arcade games. Plus, the venue doubles as a lively café by day, serving up an extensive breakfast selection, fresh smoothies and coffee to the morning crowd.

SONS OF NAPLES (MARGARET RIVER, SOUTH WEST)

Sons of Naples is a modern Italian restaurant serving up Neapolitan-style woodfired pizza, traditional pastas, share plates and desserts in the town of Margaret River. Owned by brothers Alessandro and Ferdinando Fucci — both from Naples — and brother-in-law Andrea Costantini from Genova, the restaurant was born from a passion to express the essence of Italy and connection to family. The restaurant offers a dark and moody vibe with an eclectic mix of modern artwork, while the rustic alfresco area is designed for patrons to enjoy a local wine or brew.

SORA CAFÉ (DUNSBOROUGH, SOUTH WEST)

Sora Café has opened its doors on Dunsborough's foreshore in the Margaret River Region. The café's style is inspired by the beachside location with minimalist colours and decorations to match the menu which has a less is more philosophy. Local produce is used to make granola bowls, bacon and egg rolls, chicken sandwiches and green bowls, as well as gluten-free options.

SOUTH BIRD (NORTHBRIDGE, PERTH)

An American-inspired diner, dedicated to Nashville hot chicken has opened on William St in Northbridge, replacing boutique wine bar North Bird. The co-owners of **South Bird** have a passion for fried chicken and have committed to finding a perfect combination of flavour, spice and crunch. Good food, beers and cocktails have been combined with jazz, blues and hip-hop music to create a playful and mischievous vibe.

STORIES (YAGAN SQUARE, PERTH)

Stories is a new chapter for Perth's Yagan Square, following a multi-million-dollar redevelopment. This five-storey hospitality mecca opened its doors in April 2024 with a variety of different offerings. Patrons can embark on a journey of different discoveries, with Stories Pourhouse offering an industrial vibe with 20 different beer taps, Stories Front Yard boasts the CBD's largest beer garden, and Stories Rooftop bringing the late-night party vibes. Also within the venue is the signature restaurant **Alba**, serving up modern Italian fare; **KARLA** offering modern Asian cuisine; and **Ugly Baby** bringing fun and Middle Eastern flavours. Hidden within the venue is **Fat Controller** — a hidden speakeasy cocktail bar; and for the morning patrons there's **ground.** — a hole in the wall takeaway coffee window also serving pastries and toasties.

STRANGE BREW WINE BAR (COWARAMUP, SOUTH WEST)

The team behind Skigh Wines has recently opened the doors to **Strange Brew Wine Bar**, in the South West town of Cowaramup. Designed as a bar, bottle shop and events space, it offers a relaxed atmosphere to enjoy a glass of local or international wine, share a charcuterie board with friends and unwind in the spacious garden. Each week, 'Strange Brew Sundays' takes over — with DJs setting the mood with the venue's eclectic vinyl record collection. With scope to host exhibitions upstairs, the venue looks set to expand its events and offerings even further in the future.

SUNSET BAR AND DINING (ROTTNEST ISLAND, PERTH)

Perth's Rottne Island welcomed the opening of its latest dining offering in late December 2024. **Sunset Bar and Dining** is the on-site hospitality venue for the recently restored The Lodge Wadjemup accommodation. Operated by the highly successful Social Grounds Hospitality, with Chef Mat Powell leading the culinary team, Sunset Bar and Dining offers a Mediterranean-inspired all day dining venue serving up Australian seafood, house made pasta and rotisserie items. With large indoor and outdoor dining areas, the venue boasts the island's best sunset views over the salt lake.

SWAN VALLEY OLD VINE CHARTER (SWAN VALLEY PERTH)

The Swan Valley wine region has launched the **Swan Valley Old Vine Charter**, which encourages the preservation and continued use of the region's historic vines. Participating vineyards have taken part in age classification by registering all vines more than 35 years, including wines equal to or greater than 125 years old. The Charter recognises the age of the vine as either Old Vine (35+ years), Survivor (70+ years), Centenarian (100+ years), or Ancestor (125+ years). Wine has been grown in the Swan Valley for more than 190 years. The Swan Valley Old Vine Charter has created a program of cellar door signage, wine labelling, and old vine and winery entry signage that helps to guide wine enthusiasts through the Swan Valley region's rich heritage.

THE BRIDGE HOUSE (NORTH FREMANTLE, PERTH)

An iconic restaurant site in the port city of Fremantle has been given another lease of life, with the opening of **The Bridge House**. Located in North Fremantle, it's a new restaurant for an old site — one that was originally built in 1925 as The Harvest Road cottage, owned by artist Murray Gill who converted his home into a gallery and cafe. Successful Perth businessman George Grundy has now taken the reigns, completing an extensive renovation to give the historic venue a contemporary feel. The Bridge House offers a 10-seater private dining room, a stunning front garden and a versatile outdoor area. The restaurant serves up a modern Australian menu with a European influence, with a wine list reflecting both old and new world excellence.

THE BROOME CLOSET (BROOME, NORTH WEST)

The Kimberley town of Broome has welcomed the opening of a cocktail bar **The Broome Closet**, tucked away in the heart of Broome's town centre. The Broome Closet is a charming venue serving up a crafty selection of creative cocktails in a cosy setting with a speakeasy-inspired vibe. The cocktail menu features timeless favourites alongside bold and original creations that celebrate local flavours and local spirits. The venue hosts regular events, including music nights and mixology classes, and is the only venue in Broome offering full table service to its customers.

THE CRAY SEAFOOD AND GRILL (FREMANTLE, PERTH)

The Cray Seafood and Grill restaurant has added yet another location to its WA repertoire, opening in Fremantle in March 2024. Located just a ten-minute walk from the Fremantle train station, it's in the perfect location to spend the day exploring the maritime city and ending the night with local WA seafood. The Cray's iconic seafood platters feature local crayfish, king crab legs, clam seafood chowder, a range of oysters and more.

THE STATION (SOUTH PERTH, PERTH)

The Station opened its doors in South Perth, located within the meticulously restored federation-style South Perth Police Station and Quarters which originally opened in 1908. Upstairs, The Station is a captivating urban food and beverage destination, seamlessly fusing European charm with modern flair. Enjoy

a modern pub menu amidst the leafy alfresco or the diverse indoor spaces that showcase the Station's unique history. Venture below ground to restaurant Ludo, a subterranean dining experience showcasing classical French cooking techniques, with a menu crafted for shared enjoyment.

THE TAPAS BAR (SWAN VALLEY, PERTH)

The Tapas Bar has opened in Perth's Swan Valley wine region, offering tapas-style dining alongside Olive Farm Wines and local beers and spirits from the region's craft producers. The venue showcases local cuisine and wines while guests bask in the sunshine of the outside deck that overlooks the Susannah Brook and surrounding bushland. Its menu features Shark Bay tiger prawns, Wedge Island octopus, popcorn crocodile, kangaroo carpaccio and more.

WAYFINDER CELLAR DOOR (DUNSBOROUGH, SOUTH WEST)

Wayfinder Wines has opened a unique cellar door tasting concept and restaurant experience in the town centre of Dunsborough in the Margaret River wine region. **Wayfinder Cellar Door & Restaurant** offers the opportunity to taste Wayfinder wines from a dedicated wine-tasting bar. The rest of the venue is dedicated to casual dining, with a farm-to-table offering that features fresh, seasonal produce sourced straight from the Wayfinder vineyard and farm, alongside locally sourced meat and seafood. The extended wine list features Wayfinder wines as well as a select number of European imports.



WILD LOT DISTILLERY (MARGARET RIVER, SOUTH WEST)

Led by a passionate female distiller, **Wild Lot Distillery** is a family-owned establishment which has opened in the heart of the Margaret River Region. Gaining traction with locals and visitors, Wild Lot Distillery offers guided tastings and curated cheese boards in a picturesque, family-friendly setting. Each gin batch is infused with local botanicals, fresh fruits and indigenous herbs, resulting in a lively product range which reflects its surroundings. The team prides itself on its thoughtful, sustainable approach at every stage of production.

WILLI'S PIZZA BAR (PERTH CBD, PERTH)

Willi's Pizza Bar is now open on the ground floor of The Royal Hotel, serving up Detroit-style pan pizza. Enjoy thick, cheesy and crispy rectangle sliced pizzas alongside primi side plates, neon lights, all backed by an '80s funk soundtrack. The bar's cocktails offer nostalgia with a twist, and the wine list is a blend of funky styles.

WILSON BREWING CO (ALBANY, SOUTH WEST)

Wilson Brewing Co has opened at the historic White Star Hotel in the coastal city of Albany. With a capacity to host 500 patrons, this space not only preserves Albany's rich heritage but also provides an exciting new home for craft beer lovers in the Great Southern. The family-friendly venue features an on-site microbrewery, where visitors can enjoy Wilson Brewing beers brewed right in the heart of Albany. The venue also serves as

a hub for live entertainment and events, where guests can enjoy locally brewed craft beer alongside classic, tasty pub food made with quality local ingredients.

YAHAVA KOFFEEWORKS (SWAN VALLEY, PERTH)

The Swan Valley is set for a major caffeine boost with the announcement of a new **Yahava KoffeeWorks** location, due to open 2028. To be set across 17-acres close to its current location, the new roastery is a visionary project to be Western Australia's largest walk-in coffee roastery open to the public. It's set to offer a sensory and immersive experience, including a cinematic walk-through of a coffee plantation, complete with crunchy soil sound effects underfoot. Visitors will be able to roam around the vast working roastery, watch live demonstrations, sample free tastings, take coffee classes, and purchase coffees and meals from the full kitchen. Offering views of the Swan River/Derbarl Yerrigan, the venue will also include alfresco dining and a nature playground. The Swan Valley is WA's oldest wine region and is a 25-minute drive from Perth's CBD.

ZYPHER LOUNGE (PERTH CBD)

A Japanese-inspired late-night lounge has opened its doors in Perth's CBD. **Zypher Lounge** takes its inspiration from modern Japanese izakaya, serving up a Japanese fusion menu of both indulgent dinners and late-night snacks, alongside a selection of sake and cocktails inspired by Tokyo's vibrant nightlife. Friday and Saturday nights feature live entertainment before the DJs hit the decks from 9pm.





ABORIGINAL EXPERIENCES

BUNDA BUNDA TOURS (DAMPIER PENINSULA, NORTH WEST)

Join Jabirr Jabirr Ngumbarl man Jaden Howard to discover the coastal country of the Dampier Peninsula, a two-hour drive north of Broome / Rubibi. **Bunda Bunda Tours** is a cultural tagalong tour that takes guests along dirt tracks to discover mangrove ecosystems, freshwater springs and the white sandy beaches of Carnot Bay. Spend the full-day tour fishing in secret lagoons and foraging for shellfish whilst learning about traditional hunter gatherer techniques. Guests can cook up their catches of the day and enjoy the afternoon eating and lounging in a sheltered campsite.

BOOLA BIDI DREAMING CENTRE (HARVEY, SOUTH WEST)

The **Boola Bidi Dreaming Centre** in the town of Harvey / Korijekup has launched a walking tour to coincide with the Djilba wildflower season. Walk alongside local Elder Lesley Ugle on the Ridge Walking Tour — a two-hour experience showcasing bush medicine, flora and stunning views

over the backwaters of Harvey Dam to the east and the coast to the west. There's also the Noongar Kaartdijin Bidee (Noongar Knowledge Path) Tour — a one-hour walk taking in the sights, sounds and cultural stories of the Harvey River, and the six Noongar seasons. The Boola Bidi Dreaming Centre offers visitors Aboriginal cultural experiences on Bindjareb Noongar Country including cultural ceremonies, bush food and medicine workshops, artefact and tool making, and Noongar language lessons — as well as an extensive retail range of Aboriginal products.

BURROWING BEE DREAMING (CARNARVON, CORAL COAST)

An Aboriginal cultural tour that uncovers the unique burrowing bee has launched in the Coral Coast town of Carnarvon. **Burrowing Bee Dreaming** is a 90-minute walking tour that explores the Gascoyne region, discovering traditional bush foods and the cultural background of the region. The main highlight of the tour is spotting one of the largest bees in the world, the Mungurragurra (Burrowing Bee). Only found in WA, these bees do not produce honey or live in colonies, instead thousands of them cluster together and dig individual nesting burrows. Toni Roe,

named The Bee Lady of Carnarvon, leads these tours and shares the story of the Mungurragurra and their relevance to local Aboriginal culture.

DJOONA (PERTH)

Djoona has launched a series of enriching and engaging cultural tours in the Perth/Boorloo area. The tours offer a dynamic mix of cultural experience, storytelling and truth-telling, along with sightseeing, and offer visitors a unique insight into the region's rich Noongar history. Visitors can opt to cycle along the Swan River/Derbal Yerrigan; join a guided bus tour through Perth city and surrounds, kayak along the Canning River wetlands, or discover the historical landscape of the South Perth Old Mill.

DUDJA DREAMING (TOODYAY, PERTH)

Dudja Dreaming provides immersive experiences to enhance cross-cultural learning and stimulate growth through truth-telling and reconciliation practices. Located in Toodyay in the Avon Valley region, there are four different hour-long tours to choose from. Guests can either stroll along the Avon River, head out to scenic lookouts or participate in the Newcastle Gaol Museum Experience, while engaging with WA's diverse and important Aboriginal history.

It offers guests a heartfelt Welcome to Country Cultural Immersion experience that introduces the cultural, spiritual, physical and economic relationship of the Ngarinyin Aboriginal people with the vast expanse of the land and waters of the Kimberley. Be a part of ancient family rituals and listen to stories that have been passed down from generation to generation whilst seeing El Questro through the eyes of its Traditional Owners.

KALGOORLIE ABORIGINAL CULTURAL EXPERIENCES (KALGOORLIE, GOLDEN OUTBACK)

Proud Ngadjju Wangkatha man and internationally-acclaimed Aboriginal artist and advisor Jason Dimer has launched **Kalgoorlie Aboriginal Cultural Experiences** (KACE Tours). The walking tours take guests through the Goldfields city of Kalgoorlie-Boulder to discover the art, history and cultural connections to the lands, including one of the largest First Nations outdoor art installations.

KINGFISHER TOURS AND GARINGBAAR BUSH BOTANICALS

Two women-led businesses, **Kingfisher Tours** and **Garingbaar Bush Botanicals**, have collaborated to create a unique and sustainable eco-tourism partnership in Purnululu National Park. Through the partnership, Garingbaar founder Bec Sampi, a proud Gija Woolah custodian for country, will lead visitors through spectacular Gija and Jaru Country. Along the way, visitors will hear Dreamtime stories, see ancient rock formations and discover the wonders of bush tucker and bush medicine.

MABU BURU TOURS (BROOME, NORTH WEST)

Mabu Buru Tours has introduced a 4WD tag-a-long coastal foraging tour to its range of Aboriginal cultural experiences in Broome. The Binba Mayi coastal foraging experience is a half-day tour exploring Broome's surrounding mudflats, mangroves and creeks. An Aboriginal guide will show guests traditional foraging techniques and talk to the local culture. The tour finishes with a bush barbecue to cook up the catch of the day.

NYINGGULU CULTURAL AND SNORKELLING TOUR (EXMOUTH, CORAL COAST)

Discover the wonders of the World Heritage-listed Ningaloo Marine Park / Nyinggulu and its connection to Aboriginal culture on a new tour in Coral Bay.
