Teesside University International Study Centre is based on a friendly, central campus in Middlesbrough – a large town in North East England.




Arranging your own accommodation

If you prefer to arrange your own accommodation, note that you must live within a 50-mile distance (less than 60 minutes away) from the International Study Centre. It is your responsibility to ensure this is arranged and ready for your arrival in the UK.

- The nearest tube station is Stratford (Central, Elizabeth and Jubilee lines as well as the Docklands Light Railway and overground), which is a 20-minute walk away from the campus.
- The nearest overground train station is Hackney Wick, which is less than a 10-minute walk from the campus.
- · You can get a free shuttle bus from Stratford International or Stratford City Station to the campus.
- · If you're a cyclist, the campus is well-connected to local cycle paths allowing you to easily commute and explore the local area.


How to apply
