





We offer you two different routes to begin your JMU education: direct admission or enrollment in the International Study Center. Either option will provide you with the confidence and skills you need to succeed.

At the ISC, you will take academic and English language courses while having the benefit of the full JMU campus experience and the care of a dedicated team to help you adapt and thrive as an international student. When you complete your ISC studies, you'll continue your chosen JMU degree courses, confident and fully prepared for the challenges of a JMU education.

PROGRAMS: INTERNATIONAL YEAR

International Year includes specialized courses in American culture, English for Academic Purposes, and study skills to help you adjust to U.S. teaching methods and resources. You'll also take courses from year one of your degree programs, allowing you to earn 12 to 28 credit hours.

AT-A-GLANCE

- Available as a 1-, 2-, 3-, or 4-semester program
- Includes academic and English courses
- Specialized academic courses that fully prepare you to enter your degree program
- 12 to 28 credit hours for your degree
- Additional support to help you succeed academically
- You will spend 4-16 months at the International Study Center and then complete the remainder of your degree program.

- Graduate within four years, similar to direct admission students
- Take classes with other international students in the International Study Center, offering you dedicated attention and academic help
- Participate in JMU academic classes with students outside the ISC
- No JMU application fee for International Study Center applicants
- JMU issues the I-20 for visa purposes

Programs at the International Study Center are delivered by Study Group, in partnership with JMU. The International Study Center delivers the academic English courses, and James Madison University delivers the academic, credit-bearing courses.

DIRECT ADMISSION

If you meet the appropriate language and academic requirements, you can apply directly to any of our academic programs at JMU. This is an excellent opportunity for students from English-speaking countries or with high scores on the IELTS and TOEFL to attend JMU.


