## **PROFESSOR RICK VALENTA**

#### Acting Institute Director

Sustainable Minerals Institute, University of Queensland

Professor Valenta has over 40 years experience in the mining industry and related research, including 25 years in CEO and COO roles in Australia and Canada where he has led teams that have discovered and put into production significant deposits of gold, copper and uranium.

He has held senior roles that have put him at the interface of commercial, technical and strategic aspects of the business and innovation ecosystem of future mineral supply.

Rick is the Acting Director of The University of Queensland Sustainable Minerals Institute (SMI). He has led impactful programs there including the Complex Orebodies Program, and more recently played a key role in the \$120m Resource Technology and Critical Minerals Trailblazer and a recent SMI-led initiative in Resourcing Decarbonisation.



**Constellation Discovery** 



Aeris Resources Ltd (Aeris) own and operate a circa 1.8Mtpa processing plant at Aeris Tritton Operations (Tritton Operations), located between Nyngan and Cobar in Central West NSW.

There is a long history of exploration and mining within Aeris' tenement package, dating back to the turn of the 20th century. Over the last 30 years, Aeris has successfully utilised new techniques, resulting in discovery, the most notable being the Tritton deposit in 1995, which represents the largest known deposit (>25Mt) in the Girilambone Group sediments.

Prior to Tritton, exploration and mining was focused on extracting shallow copper oxide deposits.

Aeris Resources discovered the Constellation copper-gold deposit in November 2020. The Constellation mineralised system has currently been traced over 250 metres along strike, and 1,100 metres down plunge, remaining open at depth.

To date, 207 holes for 35,790m of drilling has been completed enabling the current mineral resource, released in August 2022, totaling 6.7Mt at 1.85% copper, 0.58g/t gold and 2.9g/t silver containing 123,000 tonnes of copper metal, 125,000 ounces of gold metal and 620,000 ounces of silver metal.

The Constellation deposit is quickly becoming the large +10Mt deposit Aeris were searching for when the current exploration program was proposed in 2015.

Kaiser Discovery: fast-tracked definition of significant Au-Cu porphyry resources in central NSW

In September 2019, Alkane Resources discovered the first evidence of a world-class gold-copper deposit at its Boda prospect, part of the company's Northern Molong Porphyry Project (NMPP) in Central West NSW. Encompassing five exploration licences, the NMPP covers 177 square kilometres, centred 20km north of Wellington and 35km east of Dubbo.

The Boda deposit has been estimated at 624Mt with an average grading of 0.51g/t AuEq for 10.1 million gold equivalent ounces (5.21Moz Au, 0.90Mt Cu).

The Kaiser deposit extends the known mineralisation at Boda, and is estimated at 270Mt with an average grading of 0.54g/t AuEq for 4.7 million gold equivalent ounces (2.05Moz Au, 0.48Mt Cu). The combined resource total is 894Mt at an average grade of 0.52g/t AuEq for 14.8 million gold equivalent ounces (7.28Moz Au, 1.38Mt Cu). This makes the deposit one of the most significant gold-copper Au-Cu resources defined in NSW in the last 10 years.

Copper is also critical for the electrification of transport and renewable energy technologies, making it vital to global value chains. Development of the Boda-Kaiser system would lead to a large- scale, multigenerational copper-gold mine valued in the billions, and would provide hundreds of operational and construction jobs.

Alkane has been a long-term committed explorer in the Central West, developing and operating the Peak Hill Gold Mine from 1996 to 2005; advancing the globally significant critical metals Dubbo Project (now owned by ASM); and discovering the McPhillamys gold deposit in 2006 (now owned by Regis Resources). Since 2014, Alkane has been producing gold at Tomingley Gold Operations, approximately 50km southwest of Dubbo.

The Myall Project is located approximately 20km southwest of Narromine, and 60km north of the Northparkes copper-gold mine. Myall comprises a single contiguous tenement of 244 square kilometres.

The Myall Project is characteristic of a porphyry-related copper-gold system, with the mineralisation showing many similarities to the nearby Northparkes deposits (current Resources and Reserves at Northparkes include 607Mt at 0.55% Cu & 0.21g/t Au).

While still at an early stage, the porphyry system at Myall is exceptionally large in scale, with grades also matching the Northparkes Resources in many places. The latest drilling has established that the Corvette-Kingswood mineralised corridor extends to at least 1.2km in length, up to 600 metres in width, and up to 800 metres in depth.

An active exploration program is still underway, with follow-up drilling expected to push the system even further to the north and at depth in the coming weeks.

The Myall Project has the potential to develop into a regionally significant copper-gold discovery with massive potential for the local region, and the state as a whole. Magmatic Resources is hopeful that as with other porphyry operations, the Myall Project will be very large, with inventories ranging from 100 million to several billion tonnes, and a mine life extending to decades.




