While many people use the terms "Jackson" and "Jackson Hole" interchangeably, they actually refer to different things. Jackson Hole is the name of the valley that encompasses the region, while Jackson is the only incorporated town within that valley. As the largest municipality and the county seat of Teton County, Jackson serves as a primary gateway for visitors exploring the stunning landscapes of Grand Teton National Park and Yellowstone National Park.

Jackson Hole is steeped in Western culture and rich United States history. Originally home to Native American tribes, such as the Shoshone and Crow, the valley later became a hub for fur trappers during the 19th century. These early explorers, known as mountain men, played a key role in mapping the rugged terrain. Among them were notable figures like Jedediah Smith, Jim Bridger, and David E. Jackson, for whom the town was eventually named. Their presence in Jackson Hole helped pave the way for future settlement, leaving a lasting imprint on the region's cultural and historical landscape.

Today, Jackson Hole is still known around the country for its beautiful scenery and wildlife. It is surrounded on the western side by the Teton Mountain Range, on the eastern side by the Gros

Ventre Mountain Range, by Grand Teton National Park to the northwest, and the town of Jackson to the south. If nature isn't your thing, they also have many museums for the history buff, plenty of shops for the shopaholic, and delicious cuisine for the food lover.

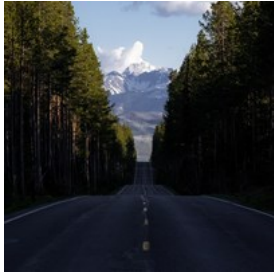

Jackson Hole offers a variety of special events throughout the year, celebrating the area's rich culture and heritage. Annual highlights include Elkfest, which focuses on wildlife and conservation, Old West Days, showcasing Jackson's Western roots, and the Fall Arts Festival, attracting artists and art lovers from around the country.

In 2009, Jackson earned the title of Preserve America Community, honoring its commitment to protecting and celebrating local history. Jackson Hole encourages visitors to experience its unique heritage firsthand, from storied trails to lively festivals, giving a sense of what life was like in the early days of the Old West.

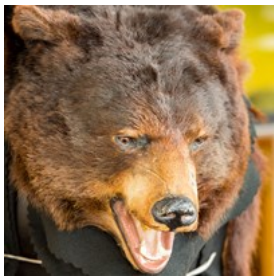


Hit all the landmarks and highlights of Yellowstone National Park on this full-day tour from Jackson Hole. Spot local wildlife such as grizzly bears,

The museum houses a wide range of exhibits, from artifacts such as Jim Bridger's rifle to archaeological finds from Fort Bonneville. It also hosts annual events like Living History Days and the Green River Rendezvous, bringing the era to life through reenactments and educational programs.

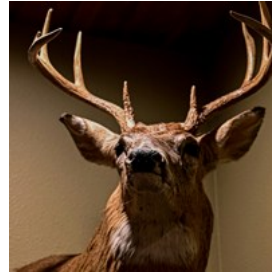

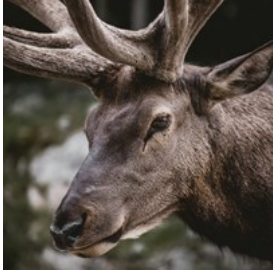

National Elk Refuge



The National Elk Refuge is a prime destination for wildlife viewing, featuring much more than just elk. Besides the massive elk herds, which can number up to 5,000 during winter, visitors may spot other species such as bison, trumpeter swans, bald eagles, and even wolves. A key highlight is the horse-drawn sleigh ride, which offers a magical and close-up experience with the elk in their natural habitat, running from mid-December to early April, depending on weather and herd conditions.

National Museum of Wildlife Art



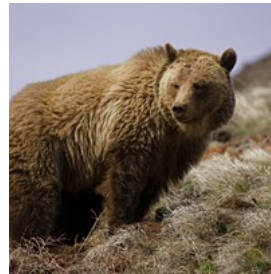

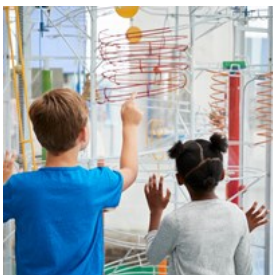
Hennes Gallery

Best Time to Visit



The best time to visit Jackson Hole will ultimately depend on your interests since each season delivers unique experiences. Summer (June to August), for example, is ideal for those seeking outdoor adventures like hiking, whitewater rafting, and wildlife viewing, with temperatures averaging between 21°C and 27°C. This is also when the Grand Teton Music Festival takes place.

Fall (September to November) is less crowded, showcasing stunning autumn foliage and great opportunities for wildlife viewing, particularly

during the elk rut.

Winter (December to February) transforms Jackson Hole into a winter sports haven, attracting skiers and snowboarders to its world-class resorts.

Lastly, spring (March to May) marks a period of renewal, with blooming wildflowers and wildlife emerging from hibernation, making it a great time for photography and outdoor exploration. If you're in Jackson Hole around that time, don't miss the Old West Days, a ten-day celebration in May that includes live music, rodeos, and the unique ElkFest, where antlers are auctioned off following their annual shedding by elk in the area.

Jackson Hole Airport (JAC)



Jackson Hole Airport is uniquely located within Grand Teton National Park, around 14.5 kilometers north of Jackson's city center,

making it a roughly 15-minute drive under normal conditions.

Visitors have multiple transport options to reach downtown Jackson, including rental cars available on-site, rideshare services, and taxis. For those preferring public transit, the START Bus operates a shuttle between the airport and Miller Park in Jackson, running hourly from early morning until late evening during the winter season.

Passport/Visa



Citizens of Schengen Area countries, along with Andorra, Australia, Brunei, Canada, Ireland, Japan, Monaco, New Zealand, San Marino,

Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, and the United Kingdom, can visit the United States for up to 90 days without needing a visa, provided they obtain an approved ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before their trip. All other travelers must secure a visa before visiting the U.S.

In addition, international travelers must ensure their passport is valid for at least six months beyond their intended stay. For the most current information and any updates on entry requirements, it is advisable to consult the U.S. Department of State website or contact the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate before traveling.

Public Transport



Public transportation in Jackson Hole is primarily served by the Southern Teton Area Rapid Transit (START Bus), which provides affordable and efficient service across the Jackson Hole area, including routes between Jackson, Teton Village, and the nearby town of Star Valley. START Bus is a convenient option for travelers, especially in peak tourist seasons and during winter when ski resorts are in high demand.

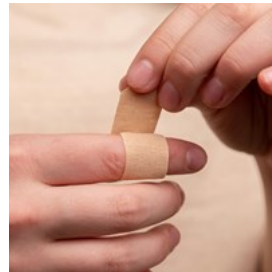
Post

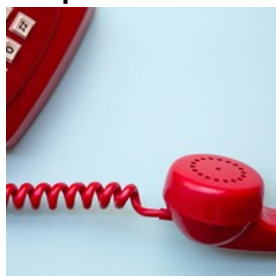
Pharmacy
