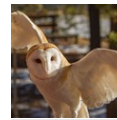

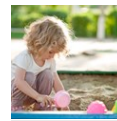

With a mission to “preserve the spirit of the desert,” Cave Creek, Arizona, retains its rugged charm through vast ranches and a rich historical heritage. Before its official establishment, the area was home to the Hopi Nation, leaving behind artifacts, drawings, and adobe structures that serve as a testament to their presence. Later, the region became a hub for gold miners, and even the U.S. Cavalry used it as a rendezvous point in the 1870s. Despite the rapid growth of neighboring Phoenix and Scottsdale, Cave Creek locals have succeeded in maintaining much of the town’s original character.

Perched high in the foothills of Black Mountain, Skull Mesa, and Elephant Butte, Cave Creek boasts a terraced landscape that attracts vacationers and embodies the quintessential “Old Western” feel. Visitors can explore saloons, attend rodeos, and browse rustic art galleries or Western-style shops. The town comes alive at night with live music at most venues, featuring local and national acts. For those seeking recreation, championship golf courses and specialty stores abound. And if urban energy calls, the bustling cities of Phoenix and Scottsdale are just a short drive away.

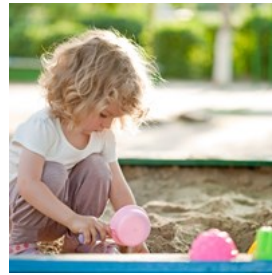

Created through the valiant efforts of community volunteers, Desert Awareness Park is 26 acres of educational and outstanding natural

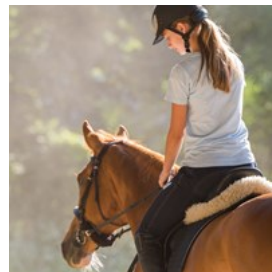

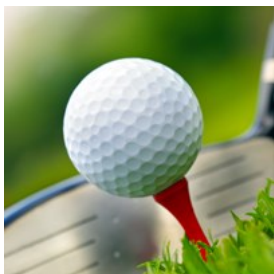

Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, and the United Kingdom, can visit the United States for up to 90 days without needing a visa, provided they obtain an approved ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before their trip. All other travelers must secure a visa before visiting the U.S.

In addition, international travelers must ensure their passport is valid for at least six months beyond their intended stay. For the most current information and any updates on entry requirements, it is advisable to consult the U.S. Department of State website or contact the

nearest U.S. embassy or consulate before traveling.

Best Time to Visit



The best time to visit Cave Creek is during the cooler months, from October to April. This period offers mild, pleasant temperatures, typically ranging from 16°C to 24°C, ideal for outdoor activities like hiking, horseback riding, and exploring the Sonoran Desert. Visitors during this time can also enjoy a vibrant calendar of events, including the Taste of Cave Creek in October, the Cave Creek Rodeo Days in March, and various art festivals like Hidden in the Hills in November.

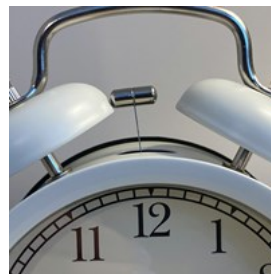

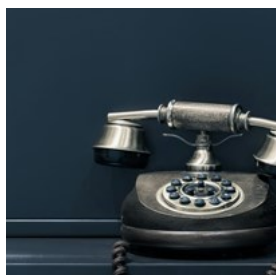
The post office provides a wide range of services, including mailing and shipping (domestic and international), passport appointments, passport photo services, money orders, and package pickup.
