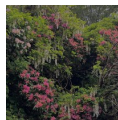


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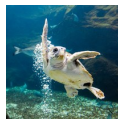

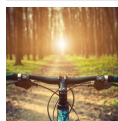

THE TOWN

Rich in history and charm, Falmouth is one of Cape Cod's most captivating towns. It is home to several historical sites, many of which are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. These include landmarks like Nobska Lighthouse, the Bourne Farm, and the Josiah Tobey House, which give visitors a glimpse into the town's storied past. With a population of around 35,000, Falmouth is the second-largest town on Cape Cod and is made up of eight distinct villages: Falmouth Village, East Falmouth, Hatchville, North Falmouth, Teaticket, Waquoit, West Falmouth, and Woods Hole.

Falmouth's close connection to Boston dates back to the 19th century when the railroad opened up the Cape to more travelers, both for business and recreation. Today, tourism is vital to Falmouth's economy, offering visitors a blend of New England history with all the joys of a classic beach getaway. With its sandy shores, sunny skies, and salty air, Falmouth is the perfect destination for those seeking both relaxation and adventure.

Beyond its natural beauty, Falmouth is a cultural hub with attractions like the College Light Opera Company, the Falmouth Art Center, and the annual Woods Hole Film Festival. Woods Hole itself is renowned for its marine science

institutions, including the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution and the Marine Biological Laboratory. The village also serves as the departure point for ferries to Martha's Vineyard.

Whether you're exploring the outdoors with activities like fishing, boating, or biking, or enjoying a leisurely meal at one of Falmouth's many eateries, there's always something to do in this eclectic seaside town.

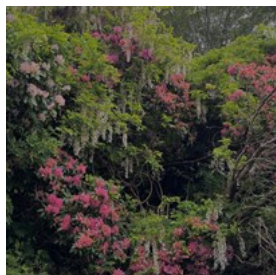

Shining Sea Bikeway

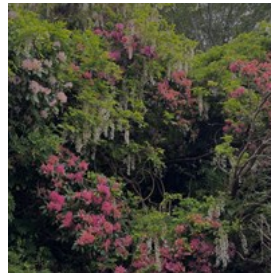

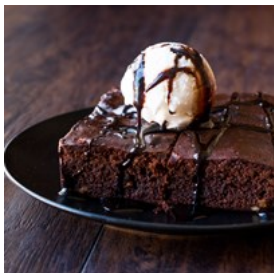

Best Time to Visit



The best time to visit Falmouth is between late spring and early fall (May to October) when the weather is warm and the town comes alive with

events and outdoor activities. During the summer months, especially July and August, you can enjoy Falmouth's beautiful beaches, bike rides on the Shining Sea Bikeway, and events like the Falmouth Road Race and the Woods Hole Film Festival. Early fall, particularly September, offers milder crowds, pleasant

weather, and stunning fall foliage. For a quieter experience, late spring brings blooming gardens and the annual Cape Cod Maritime Festival. While winters are quieter and colder, they still offer charm for those seeking serene coastal escapes and off-season discounts.

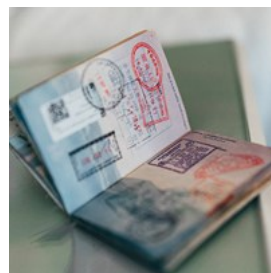


The most convenient airports for reaching Falmouth are Logan International Airport (BOS) located in Boston and T.F. Green Airport

(PVD) in Providence, Rhode Island. Logan Airport is approximately 115 km and about a 1.5- to 2-hour drive to Falmouth, depending on traffic. T.F. Green Airport is slightly closer, at around 110 km or 1.5 hours by car. Travelers can reach Falmouth by renting a car, using shuttle services, or taking a bus such as Peter Pan or Megabus, which connect Boston to Falmouth.

Passport/Visa



Citizens of Schengen Area countries, along with Andorra, Australia, Brunei, Canada, Ireland, Japan, Monaco, New Zealand, San Marino,

Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, and the United Kingdom, can visit the United States for up to 90 days without needing a visa, provided they obtain an approved ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before their trip. All other travelers must secure a visa before visiting the U.S.

In addition, international travelers must ensure their passport is valid for at least six months beyond their intended stay. For the most current information and any updates on entry requirements, it is advisable to consult the U.S. Department of State website or contact the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate before traveling.

Public Transport



Public transportation in Falmouth is limited but functional for visitors who wish to explore without a car. The Cape Cod Regional Transit

Authority (CCRTA) operates the Whoosh Trolley, a seasonal service running from late June to Labor Day. This trolley connects key points in Falmouth, such as the Falmouth Mall, Village Green, and Woods Hole, with the Steamship Authority ferry terminal. It's an affordable option, and the route conveniently links to the Shining Sea Bikeway for outdoor enthusiasts. However, the service is seasonal and best suited for summer visitors.

Year-round, the Sealine bus connects Falmouth to other Cape Cod towns, but local options remain sparse. Ride-sharing apps like Uber and Lyft are popular alternatives, offering more flexibility for tourists.
