Introduction.

Welcome to

We gathered and collated this data in 2020, a year in which every facet of society was affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, but we believe this work is important so that we can establish a benchmark of the latest data on participation and facilities. The measures introduced by governments to mitigate the pandemic has seen countries around the world placed into periods of lockdown and for golf that has meant courses and facilities being required to close and golfers unable to play recreationally and competitively during parts of the year.

The pandemic has impacted on the working and social lives of millions of people around the world, resulting in changes to worklife balance and the availability of social activities, including attendance at sports events and participation in leisure. Positively for golf it has been considered by many governments to be an activity that can be enjoyed safely outdoors during the pandemic and there has been a surge in demand for golf course tee-times in many markets as golfers seek to enjoy its many social and health benefits.

The R&A has undertaken research to understand this trend so that steps can be taken within the sport to ensure that demand for golf continues to remain high beyond the pandemic by attracting and retaining new players, while encouraging lapsed golfers back into playing again.

This report looks largely at the situation before the outbreak of the pandemic and so is an excellent benchmark – it is the first collection of this data for many of the countries reported on – on the state of golf in these key regions around the world.

Golf provides many social and health benefits and it is something that we have been strongly promoting in our activities. It offers a wonderful opportunity for social interaction and physical activity, while delivering real fun and relaxation for families and friends. Golf is critical to support our mental fitness as well as our physical fitness.

There are many examples in this report of initiatives that illustrate how national federations have been developing and growing the sport, ensuring engagement and opportunity and encouraging diversity throughout communities in these countries. Many of these federations have signed up to our Women in Golf Charter and a number of the case studies. from the Pink Birdies in Costa Rica to Flexiclub in New Zealand. have provided successful models for others to replicate in order to encourage more women and girls into playing golf.



These programmes also promote shorter formats of golf which allow the sport to be enjoyed by participants who desire less time-consuming leisure and entertainment activities in their lives.

To fully understand the impact of these initiatives, it is important to measure and monitor participation amongst all golfers – from the beginner in the sport to the new or established club player and finally to national squad members. This report brings the information together from these regions for the first time and The R&A is committed to making this available to the wider golfing and sporting community.

The analysis on the markets included in this report supplements the study on the European countries affiliated to The R&A published in 2020.

There are seven case studies highlighted in this report from Central and South America, to Africa, to Asia and Australasia. Executive Summary and Analysis.

Global Golf Comparative Performance

It is estimated there are over 31 million golfers playing the sport on more than 12,600 full length golf courses in the eight monitored regions in this report which illustrates how important golf is in terms of overall sport participation and as an economic generator for these markets. Over three million of these golfers are registered players with the national federations in these countries.

This new report is the first time that The R&A has looked to benchmark the state of golf amongst its Affiliates around the world outside of Europe.* Countries included in the report are R&A Affiliates based on geographical location and are grouped according to the ISO definition resulting in a few member nations of the European Golf Association (EGA) being reproduced in this regional analysis.

Whilst golf's participation rates may be a small proportion of the overall aggregated population of 5.85 billion in these regions, it is estimated that over 31 million individuals are involved in the sport of which over three million are affiliated to the national federations.

The report looks at total golfers* in 102 markets across eight regions,

but with the main focus being on registered golfers to the national federation which is actively monitored by these R&A Affiliates. The areas covered include Africa, Asia, Canada, the Caribbean, Central America, the Middle East, Oceania and South America. All countries in these areas fall under the jurisdiction of The R&A.

Asia leads the way with almost 1.9 million registered players, followed by Oceania at over 600,000 and then Canada at over 285,000.

Registered golfers are those who are affiliated to national federations through golf club membership or direct federation membership, whereas total golfers covers not only registered golfers but also independent or nomadic golfers who play on full length golf courses but are not club members or affiliated to national federations. Total golfers is therefore the aggregation of registered and non-registered players and accounts for over 31 million individuals in this report.

The R&A fully recognises there are many other popular ways of being involved in the sport, aside from playing on a full length golf course, including driving ranges, pitch & putt, golf simulator usage, gamification and Adventure Golf. When combined with total golfers, these other ways of experiencing the sport provide a measure of Golf Actives, and significantly increase the overall size of the golfing landscape.

A full analysis of Golf Actives and the broader golfing landscape is not covered in this report as the level of detail and monitoring required to accurately measure this involvement has not been undertaken by the national federations or The R&A. However, it is clear from those markets in Europe where this has been undertaken sees an active involvement in the sport increase by as much as three times the level of the total golfer numbers recorded.

This report concentrates on countries affiliated to The R&A outside of Europe. Across the countries covered are a total of 12,633 courses, the data for which has been sourced by The R&A through its 'Golf Around the World' publication which explores golf's global supply of golf courses, existing and under development, and produced with the National Golf Foundation (NGF).

Golf allows active participation by people of all ages, genders and backgrounds and has a truly international footprint. The national federations from all of the featured regions have been growing grassroots participation and developing elite players who appear on the world's leading amateur and professional golf stages. Golf's reach, participation and influence is growing – providing physical and mental health benefits to millions of players, as well as supporting the sustainability of diverse habitats and ecological environments.

Using a combination of data provided by national federations, governing bodies and industry golf specialists, and with the use of case studies to highlight best practices for growing the sport as well as characterising this data, this report provides insight into the importance of golf and showcases the opportunities for its development in the future.

Also included in the report is important information relating to elite level golfers and contact information and social media details across each of the individual countries monitored. This makes this the most comprehensive collection of national federation information collated and presented for the sport.

As this is the first time analysis at this level has been attempted. not all information is currently monitored by each national federation or country, and the report only includes that data that has been provided to The R&A or has been sourced from The IGF (International Golf Federation) and industry experts. Data calculations have been made based on the information available and include some estimations gareed with the national federations. The final report is believed to accurately reflect the state of golf within the regions that have been covered.

The report also details a number of case studies where participation initiatives have been growing the sport or are in place and have helped in changing the perceptions, attitudes and playing profiles of golfers around the world. These case studies include researching the value of golf in Hong Kong and Singapore, the introduction of Flexiclub for a simpler, more affordable and less binding golf and golf club membership experience in New Zealand, the introduction of female focused participation initiatives in Argentina and the 'Pink Birdies' programme in Costa Rica, as well as how golf is creating a path for success for children in underprivileged communities in South Africa.

Total registered golfers by market 2020

In total, there are six markets with over 200,000 registered golfers. Asia holds the top two markets in Japan and China which have the highest number of registered golfers with over 629,000 and 520,000 respectively. These are followed by Australia with almost 384,000, Canada with over 285,000 and then New Zealand

with over 223,000. South Korea has over 7.7 million total golfers although registered golfers are a smaller proportion of total players in this market at 214,000.

These six markets account for almost 2.6 million registered golfers or 72% of the total monitored markets.

The region with the highest total is Asia with over 1.89 million registered golfers accounting for 61% of the total.

In total, of those Affiliates able to provide measurable numbers, the number of registered players is over 3.1 million.

Total golfers

It is estimated there are over 31 million golfers across all 102 markets who are involved in the sport. With over 23.3 million players, Asia has the highest number of total golfers and makes up 75% of the total followed by 5.7 million total players in Canada and then almost 1.4 million in Oceania. There are also significant differences across the regions when comparing the proportion of registered golfers against the total number of golfers accounted for - with South America leading with 62% of total golfers being registered followed by 53% in the Caribbean and over 44% in Oceania.

In comparison, registered golfers only account for 8% of total golfers across Asia and 5% in Canada. This is reflective of the nature of the infrastructure and development of golf in these regions – with Asia for example, having a greater proportion and presence of driving ranges and golf simulator venues for players to be actively involved in the sport.

The top 12 markets within the monitored Affiliates outside of Europe account for 30.6 million or 98% of total golfers across these regions. Japan with 8.8 million is the leading country closely followed by South Korea with 7.7 million, and these two Asian countries account for over 50% of total golfers across The R&A Affiliates outside of Europe.

Asia has seven of the top 12 markets, with Oceania delivering two and 1.4 million golfers and 4.4% of total golfers, and then Canada, and one country each in Africa and South America.

The R&A is aware that an active involvement in golf can occur in many different formats and at many different venues – from driving ranges, to pitch & putt

courses; from Adventure Golf to indoor golf simulators; as well as initiatives to play on full length golf courses from six holes to nine holes or to a full 18 holes, as well as other local options in-between.

These are all valid routes to being active in the sport and are influenced by the historic level of involvement and infrastructure for the sport in the different markets.



Golf can be played in many other formats and at other golf facilities and efforts are being made to broaden this diverse offering on a global scale. The growth of driving ranges with tracking monitors and gamification offers is part of the future development of the sport expected across all regions.


Whilst most of these active players of golf in different formats will not be known to the national federations as they will not be registered as either a member of a golf club or affiliated to the national federation, they are individuals who are being introduced to the sport. As such, embracing and encouraging these players to stay in the sport, to try golf on a full length or par-3 course, is part of a strategy that will ensure the sport remains diverse, remains vibrant, and becomes increasingly successful and robust for years to come.

Across almost all markets the percentage of registered golfers as a proportion of the population is low. Currently only four markets have more than 1% of the national population registered as golfers with New Zealand and Golf NZ having the greatest up-take with 4.6% followed by Bermuda with 3.9%, the Cook Islands with 1.6%, and Australia with 1.5%. Both Bermuda and the Cook Islands have small national populations where tourism is a major source of business revenue. Golf is an important aspect of this income source and hence player numbers as a proportion of population are higher than many other markets.

It is important to consider that the registered golfer market is not indicative of golf as a whole in each country. Those golfers who are not registered are often termed as independent or nomadic golfers and are those players who could be the most likely to be encouraged to play more frequently or play on a full length golf course.

It is these golfing participants who could be most easily encouraged to become golf club members and hence registered players or who could be better embraced by the national federations through initiatives such as Golf NZ's Flexiclub – case study later in this report.

The independent or nomadic golfer is included in the total golfer number which is the traditional comparative metric used to monitor player numbers internationally, and is largely representative of total full length course players – 6, 9, or 18-hole – in each market. However, in some markets where driving range use is dominant then a measure of regular driving range players is included in the total golfer analysis.

When you look at these total golfers as a percentage of the population, then Canada has the highest proportion of the national population as active golfers at 15.2% followed by South Korea with 14.9%, and then New Zealand at 9.8% and Japan at 7.0% of the population.

Independent golfers play golf by paying a green fee at different golf courses in their own market or when playing in another country on a golfing break or holiday. There will also be a number of golfers whose active involvement in golf is only through driving ranges, par-3 courses, pitch & putt, Adventure Golf putting experiences or indoor golf simulators. All of these activities get potential players into a golf environment and expose them to the fundamentals of the sport and are legitimate channels to recruit new players to golf.

Player demand on golf courses – average registered golfers per golf course

Given the variations in cultures and infrastructures, countries will have varying capacities to absorb golfers into their community.

There are eight markets with over 500 registered golfers per course. Singapore has the highest ratio of registered golfers per course with 1,429 players, followed by Hong Kong with 954 and Venezuela with 871 registered golfers per course.

There are also some markets where registered golfer figures do not reflect the golf course infrastructure provided. This can be for a few reasons, including where golf courses and the golf infrastructure is more designed for an inbound tourism market, or where a large number of alternative formats allows for multiple ways to engage with golf, for example where driving ranges and simulator golf are popular formats.

Golf courses

According to The R&A Golf Around the World study produced by the National Golf Foundation (NGF) of America, there are a total of 12,633 golf courses, including 9-hole, 18-hole and other full length golf course facilities in the markets monitored.

Golf Around the World is the most comprehensive measurement of golf courses available and across the regions there are 1,013 golf courses in Africa, 6,111 in Asia, 2,564 in Canada, 87 in the Caribbean, 35 in Central America, 69 in the Middle East, 2,037 in Oceania and 717 in South America.

There are only five markets from The R&A Affiliates outside of Europe that have over 500 golf courses. Japan is the country with the highest number of courses with 3,140 golf courses followed by Canada (2,564) and Australia (1,584), with the other two markets with over 500 golf courses being South Korea (810), and China (617 estimated). These five markets account for 8,715 courses or 69% of the total reported in Golf Around the World for monitored Affiliate countries outside of Europe.

The average number of total registered golfers per course is 249 players, with 20 markets or 24% (only taking into account those that have submitted registered golfer numbers) having more than the average.


Female and junior golf

Golf is a family sport and can be played by different age groups and different genders together. There are many initiatives around the world focused on encouraging more women and girls – and hence more families – to be actively involved. Golf is a sport that is trying to be more inclusive and more balanced. Increasing female participation levels and growing junior involvement will enable the sport's family-focus to be realised and ensure a more diverse sport in the future.

Golf has traditionally been played more by male golfers and across all eight regions the sport is currently male-dominated. In Asia, for example, 86% of registered adult golfers are male. Canada is the only region where the rate falls below 80 to 76%.

There are a number of initiatives being championed by national federations to change this picture whether as part of The R&A's Women in Golf Charter, or as local initiatives. There are case studies featured in Argentina, Costa Rica and New Zealand considered as some of the best practices being trialled.

Across these monitored markets, there are currently over 460,000 registered women golfers, which account for 16% of total adult golfers measured.



There are five national federations where registered women golfers account for more than 30% of total adult golfers and 13 markets with 25% or above. Chinese Taipei has the highest percentage with 44%, followed by Nigeria with 35% and Morocco with 34%. Of the more established golfing markets, the country with the highest percentage of women golfers is Canada with

24%. Australia and China are the markets with the highest number of registered women golfers with over 74,000 and 70,000 respectively.

The markets that currently have the lowest proportion of registered women golfers are Belize and Libya where there are no adult female registered players, followed by India and Pakistan with only one percent.

Female and junior golf (continued)

One of the more highly developed markets that has a significant opportunity for increasing the proportion and number of women golfers is Japan with 60,000 registered female players but who only account for 10% of the total registered adult golfers in the country.

There are also a number of initiatives that focus on increasing the number of junior golfers. This is consistent with the sport becoming more family focused and also ensuring that golf has a sustainable future. A powerful case study on attracting junior players from a disadvantaged background can be seen in South Africa which explains how the federation is encouraging a diverse group of junior players with different backgrounds and experiences to try the sport.

"The leading market for registered junior golfers is China with 170,000 – which account for a third of all registered players in the country." With the markets that are able to monitor and record junior players, there are currently almost 257,000 junior registered golfers that account for eight percent of total registered players.

Of this total, 166,000 or 65% are boys and there are 90,000 girl players – or 35% of the total. This indicates a better gender balance than is the case for registered adult golfers.

The majority of these registered juniors are in Asia with 203,000 players or 79% of the total juniors monitored. The majority of the remainder of junior players are in Oceania – with just over 18,500 registered, and in Canada with just over 14,000 registered junior golfers.

The leading market for registered junior golfers is China with 170,000 – which account for a third of all registered players in the country. This is significantly more than Canada which has the next highest at almost 14,200 with Australia following at just over 13,100. These three countries make up 77% of the total junior registered golfers monitored.

Whilst generally coming from a very small base of overall players, the countries with the highest proportion of junior registered golfers as a proportion of total registered golfers are Jordan (60%), Libya (60%), Armenia (45%), Sri Lanka (44%), Afghanistan (43%) and Turkey (41%).

There are clear opportunities to grow the number of junior players in all markets.



National federation staff, board and committee members

National federations are multifaceted and complex and require input from multiple groups in order to function, including the staff members themselves, and individuals at board and committee member level. There are currently over 3,200 people working at these levels in the Affiliate markets monitored outside of Europe, and each is vital in creating and enabling the infrastructure for golf to function in their respective countries.

Of the national federations that provided information on these areas, there are more than 850 staff members (71% are full time), just under 950 board members and just under 1,400 committee members.

In order to create a golfing structure that enables and promotes women's golf, it is important to ensure that women are included in the decision making process.

As such, recruiting women at staff, board and committee level is extremely important – although representation varies at these different levels.

"Representation by women is highest at the national federation staffing level. They represent 41% of the full time workforce and 36% of the part time workforce." Representation by women is highest at the national federation staffing level. They represent 41% of the full time workforce and 36% of the part time workforce. Twenty five countries currently have 50% or higher female representation at full time employment level – and 15 countries have 50% or higher female staffing levels for part time contracts.

Women are much less represented at committee level, where they make up 23% of committee members. Currently, there are only six countries that have 50% or more representation rates, and there are eight countries which have no women committee members at all.

Board level currently has the lowest representation of female members. Women make up 15% of board members, a very similar representation rate to the registered adult female golfer landscape. Just four countries have a 50% or higher proportion of women at board level, and there are 26 countries with no women board members at all.

Golf's Bright Future

This is the first report from The R&A on the state of golf amongst its Affiliates and international markets across the regions of Africa, Asia, Canada, the Caribbean, Central America, the Middle East, Oceania and South America. The collation of numbers for total registered golfers, golf facilities and golf courses, and including national federation contact information is an important landmark in understanding the state of golf from the Affiliates' perspective and illustrating clearly that golf is a truly global sport.

Whilst total registered golfers at just over 3.1 million – or even total golfers at just under 31.1 million – represents only a small proportion of the total aggregated national populations at 0.06% and 0.5% respectively, it does indicate that the sport is embraced and recognised, and there is significant opportunity for growth for adult men and women players and junior boy and girl golfers.





The infrastructure in many of the markets is not yet fully developed but at the same time in some Asian countries, there are many golfers involved mainly through driving ranges, golf simulators, and other formats and gamification elements for the sport.

In all of these regions, the sport is being showcased by international professional and amateur events with many of the leading regional amateur events being organised and run by The R&A as part of its commitment to help grow the sport. These generate greater interest for local populations to get involved and themselves become active in some format of the game.

The R&A has recognised that many participants – termed 'Golf Actives' – get involved in the sport through alternative and off-course routes such as driving ranges, simulators, pitch & putt, Adventure Golf, and gamification. Golf Actives includes all these forms of engagement with the sport as well as active involvement through full length golf course experiences. This broader involvement

significantly increases the number of individuals participating in golf and the size of the golfing landscape beyond the 31M total aolfers identified in this report.

Golf employs many thousands of individuals in the industry whether working at golf venues, with the manufacturers who produce the equipment for playing or enabling the sport, or who work in the national federations, agencies and organisations who promote the development of the sport at all levels.

The potential exists to grow the sport further and increase per capita participation towards the rates seen in Canada, South Korea, New Zealand or Japan.

There are challenges and opportunities to grow women and girls' participation and while overall adult female participation of registered golfers is currently only 16% of total adult registered players, there are excellent initiatives and development opportunities as illustrated in the case studies in markets as diverse as Argentina, Costa Rica, Paraguay and New Zealand. With the strength of Asian players on the Women's World Golf Rankings, the case for growing participation and involvement by women and girls in the sport across this region is strong.

There are clear physical and mental health benefits from playing the sport and enabling golfers of different generations to exercise, play and compete together. This will allow the national federations to embrace the sport further and ensure golf continues to grow as a 'sport for life'.

Federation Statistics.

Total Market Summary

The R&A works closely with its Affiliates all around the world to develop and sustain the sport. Details on the national federations can be found below. This includes contact details of key individuals, key statistics relating to participation, diversity, and golf courses.

This is the first report benchmarking the situation amongst The R&A Affiliates outside of Europe.

Countries are reported within their regional area – Africa, Asia, Canada, the Caribbean, Central America, the Middle East, Oceania and South America. Within each region, reporting is alphabetical. The countries monitored are those affiliated to The R&A. As such, there are some countries not included

where the national federation is not part of The R&A affiliate network, or where there is no national federation for golf in existence.

As this is the first time that this information has been gathered, there are some markets where the information is not collected under the normal course of operations. Where information is not available, it has been stated as 'Not Available' ('n/a') unless agreement on an

estimate has been made and accepted by the national federation, The R&A and after evaluation by Sports Marketing Surveys.

It is anticipated that as the collection of this information becomes more regular that the gaps in the information collated will reduce, and the picture and understanding will be more comprehensive.

Comparisons between GAW and Affiliates course numbers.

In some cases, the number of golf courses affiliated to each federation is different to the total inventory of golf courses as detailed in The R&A's Golf Around the World publication. This R&A initiative, working with the US-based National Golf Foundation, has for many years been monitoring the number of golf courses around the world that have over six holes per venue. In order to ensure consistency of reporting across the markets in The R&A's jurisdiction, the Golf Around the World golf course numbers have been used in the calculation of the registered golfers per course across the monitored markets – which replicates the methodology in the report published in 2020 for Europe. In the federation statistics section, details have been provided by the national federations on the number of 18-hole, 9-hole and other golf courses affiliated to the federation. These numbers may not correlate completely with the total number of golf courses in each country as identified by Golf Around the World.

South Africa:

Developing a Path for Success.

Given the number of South African players who can regularly be found on professional and amateur tournament leaderboards across the world, the focus on the development of golfers in South Africa from an early age is significant. Success may not always be reaching national or professional playing level, it can also mean developing a player from an underprivileged grassroots background and providing opportunities through golf where the child is educated and equipped with a broad range of life skills while their ambitions and dreams are nurtured.

Taking on board valuable lessons learned over the last 20 years – what works and what has not for player development – the South African Golf Development Board (SAGDB) has produced a 'path of success'.

"From the outset, when the SAGDB was formed in 1999 by

businessman Johann Rupert it was with the purpose of developing golf amongst children in under privileged communities," notes Grant Hepburn, SAGDB Managing Director (and CEO of Golf RSA, the umbrella body for golf in South Africa). Golf RSA has been involved in supporting this initiative since day one.

"The emphasis was placed on producing good players that could represent provincial and national teams. In addition to developing golf skills, there was an integrated focus on developing life skills and social skills through the intrinsic values of golf" explained Grant.

So far, over 30,000 young golfers have been through the SAGDB programme.

1. A sustainable funding model

The SAGDB is fortunate to have a benefactor such as Johann Rupert and his companies to support ongoing funding. Once the SAGDB was established, it gained the support of the national federation, which made the decision to levy affiliated golfers with a 'Development Fee' as part of their affiliation membership subscriptions.

This fee is collected by the provincial golf unions and earmarked for development initiatives. There are 14 provincial golf unions in South Africa and each works with the SAGDB, creating a national footprint with over 2,500 under-privileged golfers benefitting from the programme each year.

2. Access to facilities

The SAGDB policy is to support development projects in communities that are close to driving ranges and/or golf courses. Most of the SAGDB beginners start off by hitting golf balls in a school field, park, or area of open ground near to their township. This is a starting point, but it is vital to children's development that they progress onto a driving range and then actual golf courses. Access to proper golf facilities is vital where basics rules and etiquette can more easily be taught.

3. Identifying and developing coaches to deliver the basic fundamentals

The SAGDB seeks out members of the community that play golf who are then trained to give basic Level One coaching. This is a costeffective way to get children started in playing golf – as well as giving new skills to the trainers or coaches.

Given South Africa has 11 official languages, it also helps to have local community members delivering the right information. Once golfers' skills are developed, they are given access to PGA professional coaching. Each region chooses a SAGDB regional squad of 12 players for one-on-one lessons. As players progress, they are entered into junior, regional and Golf RSA national events.

"For golfers that reach top level amateur golf, the SAGDB assists in helping them to find bursaries to attend university or college or golf-related programmes such as greenkeeping courses," adds Hepburn, who was formerly a National Coach.

Many of the nation's leading players also support and acknowledge the work done by the SAGDB.

4. Managers that can manage

Sometimes, the SAGDB managers are coaches that have shown management potential and have progressed into the role – but very often the managers do not have a coaching background. Not only must the managers be able to plan and arrange transport and logistics, they also need to be able to liaise with golf clubs and the parents of the children on many aspects. Transport is a huge challenge as very often the SAGDB needs to use mini-bus taxis and very often these taxis are unreliable. As a result, the managers seek out trustworthy taxi providers and form relationships.

5. Reliable and audited administrative structures

The administrative structures of the SAGDB have formed the backbone of its success, particularly due to the transparency of the financial reporting. The golf unions and sponsors can take comfort in the fact that the SAGDB provides audited financials to the sponsors and golf unions.

"Without a clear pathway even the most talented golfers or children will fall by the wayside and not reach their true potential," concludes Hepburn.

Demonstrating the value and impact that golf can make to a nation's economy as well as the social and health benefits which the sport provides are significant factors in encouraging political and national support for golf in today's society.

Sustainability and environmental issues are now key considerations for governments around the world and so demonstrating how the sport delivers in these areas can be of real significance for a national federation.

For the national federations in Hong Kong and Singapore, reports commissioned in 2018 have provided the bodies with evidence that outlines the economic and social benefits which golf provides.

Supported by The R&A, the Hong Kong Golf Association (HKGA) and the Singapore Golf Association (SGA) engaged with Golf Business Advisory Services, a specialist independent golf industry advisory firm based in Melbourne, Australia, to produce such a report for the first time for each country.

The in-depth Golf Industry Reports highlight a number of key findings, all of great use for both countries as they seek to develop the sport for all ages, genders, race and backgrounds.

Occupying islands and territory of approximately 1,100 square kilometres and now home to 7.4 million people, Hong Kong is the second most densely populated region in the world behind Singapore. With only six golf clubs and 10 golf courses, Hong Kong ranks the highest in terms of population count per course (1.47 million people per golf facility).

However, the benefits golf brings to Hong Kong are notable:

- Around 15,000 golfers are registered with the HKGA with women representing 24% of total affiliations.
- The financial revenues generated by golf facilities in Hong Kong is significant with total revenues across all facilities approximating \$HK600 million per annum.
- Based on an estimated participant base of approximately 100,000 golfers, the indicative health contribution being made by golf in Hong Kong is approximately \$HK10.3 million on an annual basis.
- On average, approximately \$HK30 million a year is raised for charity partners through golf club-based events in Hong Kong.
- Direct employment is being provided for 1,150 people, an average of approximately 230 individuals per facility.

Of the 11 South East Asian countries, Singapore, with 16 club facilities, ranks the fifth lowest in terms of population per facility, with an average of approximately 350,000 people per golf facility.

Given the general sports participation trends evident in Singapore, and the direct and broader benefits that are available from golf, there is a genuine role for golf to play as the government seeks to reverse declining sporting participation trends.

The key report findings for Singapore included:

- There are approximately 80,000 golfers in Singapore of whom 46,000 are members of Singapore's 12 private clubs.
- With the Singapore Government incurring annual expenditure of \$10 billion Singapore dollars around health services, the health benefits delivered through golf are being seen as potential ways of helping the government manage future health investment and expenditure, and potentially helping reduce the per capita spend.
- The financial revenues generated by golf clubs in Singapore is significant with total revenues across all facilities of around 238 million Singapore dollars per annum - an average of \$18.3 million per facility.
- On average, approximately \$63 million Singapore dollars is raised for charity each year through golf club-based events in Singapore.
- Labour costs account for approximately 47% of all club operating expenses, representing an annual market cost approximating \$100 million, delivering employment for 2,550 people.





Following the conclusion of both reports, both national federations discussed potential actions to develop the sport further in each market – such as a focus on junior golf – and a commitment to implement various initiatives and development programmes.

Dominic Wall, Director – Asia Pacific at The R&A said, "The Golf Industry reports commissioned by Hong Kong and Singapore could provide a model for many other countries that do not currently have such a report to highlight the size and value which golf provides to their territory, both economically and socially."

It was no ordinary day for Paul Chaplet. On 17 January 2016, the teenager from Costa Rica won the second Latin America Amateur Championship and added his name to the region's most prestigious trophy in amateur golf. "I'm in shock, I can't believe it," he said, at Casa de Campo's Teeth of the Dog course in the Dominican Republic.

A few months later he went on to make history by becoming the first Costa Rican to compete in The Masters Tournament at Augusta National. There, his countryman Alvaro Ortiz was in attendance too, beaming with pride.

"Watching the Costa Rica flag on the main leaderboard to the right of the 1st hole was very emotional," Ortiz said. "Watching Paul walk down the fairway with Mark O'Meara in the first two rounds; watching the kid I saw grow up play the Masters – it was like a dream."

Ortiz is Costa Rica's leading player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking® (WAGR), and with the stories of Chaplet at The Masters, and now his own performances, as well as other emerging players, it is illustrative of how a small golfing

nation like Costa Rica – with a population of just five million – can be successful on the global stage.

The work these players, and the Costa Rican Golf Federation, are doing can certainly help create more magical moments. Aided by funding from The R&A in 2020, Costa Rica is a shining example to many national federations of how multiple endeavours across a range of areas in their development plan can deliver exceptional results.

Costa Rica is a rugged, rain-forested Central American country with coastlines on the Caribbean and Pacific and the federation has been working hard to encourage more people to become golfers, improve player performance as well as host championships.

Working with the Costa Rica PGA, they are focused on the development of junior golfers, golfers with disabilities and, notably, women and girls' golf.

"Our key learning from 2019 was that volunteers are very important," said Maurizio Musmanni, President of the federation. "Our staff headcount is very small and we need people to keep growing and aiming for success. In 2019, we started to recruit interested people to help us and the response has been very positive. Today we have a women's committee, tournaments committee, juniors committee and rules committee."

Indeed, in 2019, the federation began sending staff members to train and specialise in The R&A's Tournament Administration and Referees Schools (TARS) through attending the Level 2 and Level 3 seminar programmes.

That year the federation organised 35 tournaments, including eight WAGR counting events. It saw an increase from 663 to 806 rounds played in official national tournaments. It has well-established competitions for players of any level and gender (over 650 members), helping the Costa Rican men's team to win the Copa Los Volcanes in 2019, with the women's team runners-up.

Having committed to The R&A Women in Golf Charter, the 'Pink Birdies' project was born. It has helped create a group of motivated golfers playing in both recreational and competitive activities, through schools and golf clubs, as well as creating a golf community for women and girls with a presence on social media.

"In 2019, one of our main focuses was women's golf," confirmed Musmanni. "We created a





committee focused only on ladies' golf and its development. Perhaps to our surprise, 'Pink Birdies' has been a total success! We are positive that if we continue working hard, women's golf in Costa Rica has a bright future."

The federation has initiated a number of other projects including 'Grow the Game' for junior players focused on schools and public parks, aided by the education of professionals. It has also included 'Project 36', with simple rules and holes to create fun golf opportunities for beginners.

Furthermore, the 'Give Back to Golf' programme has been a success. All golf professionals who have attended the nation's teaching and coaching summit have committed

to organising a minimum of three grow golf events per year in their local communities that are free of charge – with a total of over 125 having been delivered in 2019 – to enhance golf development.

Meantime, Challenge Golf Costa Rica offers the opportunity to practice and enjoy the sport for people with some type of disability, and this successful initiative has 41 members. It works in tandem with Disabled Golf Costa Rica – affiliated to EDGA since 2016 – with trailblazer Leiner Ramirez entering the World Ranking for Golfers with Disability for the first time in the country's history. For Costa Rica, it is onwards and upwards.





Australia:

A Vision for Change

Back in February 2018, Golf Australia launched a strategy to address a fundamental imbalance in the sport and draw more women and girls to golf – Vision 2025. Its primary aim is to tackle a reduction in female members to just 20% of all club membership, the lowest figure on record.

The four-pillar strategy aims to significantly increase participation rates for women and girls by 2025, along with improving the culture and welcome at golf clubs around the country so the sport is visibly seen to be inclusive of everyone. "If we love golf, it's actually our responsibility to help golf to be a sport for all," said Golf Australia's new Chief Executive. James Sutherland.

What are the main pillars of Vision 2025?

1. Culture and leadership

More women on boards and in senior positions across the industry; empowering clubs and courses to make them more welcoming; encouraging equal access and equal rights

2. Grassroots

Introductions to golf that are friendlier and more social; more emphasis on fun and family; better transition to courses and clubs; hubs and networks for women and girls

3. High performance and coaching

More role models to inspire the next generation; more female coaches to nurture and develop talent; more chances for the elite to compete and hone their skills; ensuring high performance pathways meet the specific needs of women and girls

4. Marketing and positioning

Changing the way the sport is perceived; more women and girls proud to say 'I play golf'; promoting the fun, healthy, social game as a complimentary sport and a sport for life

"Through Vision 2025, Golf
Australia intends to introduce

As part of the strategy, Golf
Australia is encouraging its 1,500
clubs to provide equal access for
all genders and from all ethnic
backgrounds – which many already
offer – and for clubs to take on
more female board members and
senior executives. "It's a massive
task, that's why we've made it

2025," said Jill Spargo, Vision 2025 Steering Group Chair, who believes a 30% female membership rate is a realistic target.

"It's not something that's going to happen quickly. A lot of clubs are doing good things out there, so we need to be identifying those clubs that are doing good things and sharing best practices with other clubs."

LPGA Tour pro Hannah Green came to the sport in the footsteps of her golfing father but admits she might have been lost to golf had it not been for her friends, firstly at Hartfield Golf Club in Perth and then Mount Lawley Golf Club. "It's just nice to play golf with another female," she said. "I joined Mount Lawley and there were maybe seven other girls and I don't think I'd be still playing golf if it wasn't for them. You just feel more comfortable."

Vision 2025 achievements:

- The establishment of a Vision 2025 Global Action Plan that is comprised of shared objectives across Golf Australia, Golf New South Wales, Golf Western Australia, PGA of Australasia, Australian Ladies Professional Golf and Golf Management Australia. The Global Action Plan encompasses 16 key focuses, with priority given to addressing low numbers of women on club boards; building the capacity of clubs and facilities to deliver needs driven participation opportunities for girls and women; increasing women's involvement in participation delivery and in high performance coaching ranks; and, showcasing examples of club excellence in leading gender equality change in golf.
- Participation is also showing signs of progress. The female golf AusPlay data (survey of participation run by Sport Australia – includes adult member and non-member participation) shows a growth in female players from 188,500 in 2018 to 209,800 in 2019-20.
- The COVID-19 pandemic, while challenging for society on a global scale, also contributed to an overall growth in golf participation in Australia in 2020 – including among females.



In their report, "New member demand – the impact of COVID-19", Golf Australia highlighted that more than 42,000 people joined golf clubs in the 10 months to the end of October 2020. That represented a surge in new membership demand of 126% nationally – despite the lengthy COVID-19 shutdown in metropolitan Melbourne.

Golf Australia's General Manager of Golf Development David Gallichio is optimistic about the findings, compiled by Golf Business Advisory Services. "The numbers themselves are important right now," he said. "But what is paramount for the game's future is for us to ensure the retention of the new members and players by extrapolating the data and taking those lessons to our clubs and facilities."

Male membership growth represented 88% of the total surge and it was women aged 50+ who were responsible for more than 56% of the female growth.

The report also revealed that year-to-date October data (excluding Victoria due to a COVID-19 outbreak that closed courses for three months) showed rounds 8% up on 2019 – and 22% in the months May to October. For this latter period, male and female rounds demand was up by 22% and 20%, respectively.

Kurdas added, "There is an air of change regarding women and girls' golf in Australia and we now have to continue the momentum."

Golf was first played in New Zealand at the Dunedin Golf Club in 1871 so 2021 will see the country celebrate 150 years of golf. Golf is also the most played sport in New Zealand with around half a million Kiwis playing each year. The industry employs over 2,000 people, has more than 6,000 volunteers, and contributes more than a billion New Zealand dollars (NZ\$) annually to the national economy.


Importantly, developments around the sport include Golf New Zealand positively engaging with independent golfers. The process of involving non-club members in the sport is a significant challenge for most national federations around the world. Golf New Zealand is perhaps leading the way in this field in supporting the growth of the sport beyond traditional club membership.

LOVE Golf Flexiclub has been designed by Golf New Zealand to meet the needs of modern, casual golfers by providing greater flexibility, increased affordability and therefore real credibility to encourage people to start, progress and stay in the sport.

Officially launched in October 2018, LOVE Golf Flexiclub, is an 'online virtual club' designed to provide casual golfers with the flexibility to pay for play at a variety of courses and a credible way to obtain an official Golf New Zealand handicap.

Flexiclub offers golfers multiple pricing options to cater for every budget including free registration on the national database, which has grown to 128,000 casual and independent golfers. Golfers then have a choice of an annual subscription for \$120 or a monthly payment of \$15. These subscription packages include other features and services: an official Golf New Zealand handicap; access to an app to keep track of scores; to find courses to play; to book tee times; and to communicate with other independent golfing friends.

Since the launch, an impressive 2,846 golfers have joined the Golf Flexiclub scheme which allows Golf New Zealand to better understand who these players are, their golfing preferences and enables the federation to communicate with a growing base of casual

players. Initially, Golf New Zealand restricted Flexiclub member numbers to 2,000 in the first two years in order to test and trial the product but now expect numbers to grow in the coming years.

In 2019, golf club membership in New Zealand increased nationally by 2.5% through a range of marketing and club support programmes, reversing a long running trend of small annual declines.

Membership of clubs continued to increase nationally throughout 2020 with a rise of 7% being achieved and taking affiliated numbers to 111,000 people. Flexiclub is playing a part in this growth with 515 golfers having already gone on to join another club.

Dean Murphy, Chief Executive at Golf New Zealand, said: "These learnings show that Flexiclub is working to inspire new golfers to engage in the game in a way they never have before, attracting lapsed golfers back and providing an option for those who are considering leaving the sport due to work or family commitments to continue playing the game."


Many stakeholders across the golf sector have contributed their feedback to shape the development of Flexiclub. "The ability to connect and communicate with a growing base of casual golfers is important for golf as we seek to better understand their wants, needs and involvement in the game," added a club's General

Manager. "It allows us to create and promote new experiences and offerings to grow participation and membership within our golf clubs."

A shared revenue model is benefiting all stakeholders – including the clubs, District Associations and Golf New Zealand itself. Flexiclub members contribute to the administration costs of the game which going forward presents an opportunity to reduce the affiliated levy for golf club members.

In total, 30% of the Flexiclub subscription revenue is shared with participating golf clubs through a levy rebate, and a further 20% shared with District Associations to provide funds for growing participation.



Argentina: Ladies' 9 Hole Tour

A focus on growing interest in golf for women and girls and advocating shorter formats of the sport are key areas for The R&A to broaden its appeal. Argentina is excelling in delivering in both.

While the participation initiatives in Australia and New Zealand to increase the number of people playing nine-hole golf have received many plaudits, including working in tandem with The R&A's annual 9 Hole Challenge, the efforts in Argentina are equally worthy.

Organised by the Argentina Golf Association, a new 9 Hole Women's National Programme and Tour, promoted as 'Ladies' 9', started in March 2019 with 10 competitions taking place around the country. The results have been impressive, delivering the following:

- raising awareness of the benefits of nine-hole golf
- an increase in the number of women playing
- an increase in more family golf
- an increase in nine-hole competition rounds

- an increase in club involvement in principal cities and regions
- a focus on more socialising and networking among women of different age groups

Each of the 10 competitions in 2019 attracted, on average, 70 women golfers. With gross and net categories and age group prize categories, a Grand Final was then held at San Isidro Golf Club. In total, around 500 formal nine-hole rounds were entered for handicap purposes (with the new World Handicap System making rounds easier to monitor).

Mike Leeson, Executive Director of the Argentina Golf Association, said, "Our funding from The R&A was instrumental to getting the project started. Many players said it was the first tournament they had competed in. Organised with



shotgun starts in the morning and afternoon, this enabled the women at both tee times to share lunch together, and it emphasised that the social aspect of the event is as important as taking part in playing golf."

Photos of the competitions and winners were also shared through the association's social media platforms to increase awareness of the initiative. Having signed up to The R&A Women in Golf Charter, the Argentina Golf Association were pleased with their progress in year one.

"In a way, it exceeded our expectations," continued Leeson. "Nine-hole golf is appealing to women, especially newcomers to the sport. Many wanted to play in the afternoon again and we will look to give that option and have a separate competition. We also had numerous clubs asking to be part of the tour in 2020."

While COVID-19 brought challenges in 2020, the ultimate outcome for golf in Argentina is to be successful in attracting more women, beginners and non-golfers from different backgrounds to the sport. This will be delivered by encouraging more clubs to organise nine-hole competitions and invite local players.

"The whole idea is getting more women to play and incorporate the nine-hole competition concept, targeting more women to have a handicap," adds Leeson, who is looking to double the number of nine-hole competitions by 2021.

"We are confident that from 2021 the Tour will be established and we will have some sponsors that will make it sustainable. We will give support and create incentives to increase participation – such as establishing and providing access to Pro-Am's around the concept. This is very much in line with our objectives for women's golf, the Women in Golf Charter and nine-hole golf."

Paraguay: Amazing Women and Girls' Success

While home to only six courses, there have been many memorable moments in Paraguay's remarkable golfing history.

Back in 1993, their men's professional team travelled over to Scotland for the Alfred Dunhill Cup in St Andrews and a round one victory stunned a home side featuring Colin Montgomerie and Sam Torrance. A year later, Celeste Troche won the South American Junior Championship for the first time, a signpost for future success, before she became the first Paraguayan player to make it to the LPGA.

Then, in 2007, Troche and Julieta Granada stole the show to lead from start-to-finish and win the Women's World Cup of Golf at Sun City in South Africa, pushing the American Solheim Cup pairing of Juli Inkster and Pat Hurst into second place.

Carlos Franco, part of that winning team over the Old Course in '93, is arguably Paraguay's most famous golfer, with the 18-hole Golf & Country Club in Arroyos Esteros bearing his name. Fabrizio Zanotti and the female duo of Troche and Granada also act as role models for young players.

Indeed, it is the country's great success with women and girls' golf that presently stands out.



In 2008, the Paraguayan Golf Association began working with a selected group of leaders to implement a high-performance programme for aspiring young golfers. A process in which a key outcome is to support golf within the 'family' environment, including working together to provide financial, social and emotional assistance.

"We consider points such as the culture itself, role models, coaching and the creation of teams as very important," says Arnaldo Acosta, President of the Paraguayan Golf Association, which was founded in 1979.

As part of their efforts, the Paraguayan Golf Association have focused on staging a national circuit for juniors, developing players and increasing participation for the most talented in prestigious international tournaments. For a small country with little more than 1,000 registered players – one of only two landlocked countries



in South America – the results have been impressive, notably on the high-performance side.

Milagros Chaves, Paloma Vaccaro, Sofia Garcia, Fernanda Escauriza, Anahi Servin, Giovanna Fernandez and Katia Meyer are among those who have all shone.

Four players currently sit inside the top 500 in the World Amateur Golf Ranking®, including Garcia within the top 50. Garcia achieved history back in 2016 when she defended the South American Amateur title at Lima Golf Club in Peru aged only 16.

Culturally, Paraguayan women are very strong, focused and determined. This strength is rooted in history. At the end of the Great War with Brazil, Argentina and Uruguay in 1870, where the male population was greatly reduced, it was Paraguayan women who were in charge of leading the country and taking it forward.

Fast forward to 2019 and players from Paraguay participated in more than 10 international events. Player participation constantly increased during the year with over 100 players competing in junior tournaments and over 60 in scratch and professional tournaments.

International results were excellent, with gold and silver medals achieved in tournaments such as the South American Amateur, the Pan American Games and repeated success in the Copa Los Andes (also known as the South American Team Championship).

"I was fortunate to lead this group of great players for the last 11 years to all the South American pre-junior, Junior, Copa Los Andes and World Championships," notes Acosta, also captain of the women's teams between 2008 to 2019.

"Despite golf being an individual sport and having extraordinary players, we as an Association believe that beyond their great individual capacity, creating a team spirit and friendship has greatly enhanced their performance."

Regular communication with players in different parts of the world, talks and engagement with professionals still involved in the high-performance programme, such as Granada and Zanotti, has also aided Paraguay's success.

In 2020, the process continued to develop, with initiatives introduced seeking to also improve the preparation and training of juniors "We are committed to continuing to develop women's golf in Paraguay – not only players but volunteers, and more women working in the industry."

Glossary.

The information included in the individual country statistics has been provided by the national federations, the National Golf Foundation, with additional support from the IGF (International Golf Federation) and Sports Marketing Surveys market knowledge. The source of the national population figures is the World Bank Data (2019).

The definitions of the key performance indicators follow.

MARKET COVERAGE

All countries included in this report are Affiliates of The R&A, and the allocation by region is based on the ISO list of countries published by the International Organisation for Standardisation (ISO), which defines the names of countries, dependent territories, and special areas of geographical interest.

This report covers the Affiliates to The R&A from around the world outside of Europe. This does include some countries who are members of the European Golf Association (EGA) whose data was included in the 2019 report on Europe Participation. Where countries have been reported in both publications, this is to ensure market consistency with Golf Around the World (published by The R&A using data collected on its behalf by the National Golf Foundation) to ensure comparability with the number of golf courses in the different regions. Data reported for those markets in the European Golf Participation Report 2019 has been reproduced as previously reported.

Countries which may be geographically located in the regions covered in this report but not affiliates of The R&A have not been listed and included.

TOTAL POPULATION

The national population figures (World Bank 2019). The regional populations quoted within the report are the aggregated country populations of the countries affiliated to The R&A in that region. This enables analysis

of the number of golfers within the monitored markets of a region against the populations of those markets. It is not the World Bank aggregated total populations of all countries as defined by the ISO.

REGISTERED GOLFERS

Total golfers, adult and junior, who are affiliated to the national federation. This reflects those golfers who are either a member of a golf club, or who have joined or registered separately with the national federation for the purposes of obtaining a handicap or an official playing accreditation. Where registered golfers are shown in italics – this is due to data not being provided by the federation, and an estimate has been made.

% OF POPULATION

Registered golfers as a percentage of the population illustrate the penetration of golf within each country.

TOTAL GOLFERS

This is the accepted measure of golfer numbers in each market and is representative of total full course players. Total Golfers includes those defined as Registered Golfers (affiliated to the national federation or a golf club member) and those Independent or Nomad golfers who Pay-and-Play for their rounds as green-fee players. Where driving range or golf simulator usage may be the only golf product and experience available to a player, these players may be included in the Total Golfer number. Inclusion may be based on geographical, infrastructure or cultural factors – and are included on agreement with national federation and industry experts. The numbers for Total Golfers are measured through undertaking a nationally representative participation study, or are estimated by applying algorithms influenced by comparative market and cultural aspects, golfer-per-course relationships and are relative to registered golfer numbers or other nationally available participation metrics.

GOLF ACTIVES

Golf Actives is a measure of the total individuals – adults and children – who have had some form of active involvement in golf in the last 12 months. Golf Actives includes those who have played or tried golf including Adventure Golf, pitch-&-putt, par-3 golf, driving range, gamification experiences (such as TopGolf), golf simulator play, as well as full length golf course players on 6-hole, 9-hole or 18-hole layouts. The numbers are generated through a nationally representative household survey.

The Golf Active individual has been exposed to the sport in one of many different formats, and maybe the most likely target to develop to regular full-course play (a measure of Total Golfers) and to becoming a golf club member or affiliated to the national federation (a Registered Golfer).

REGION RANKING

Analysis of how each region compares against others for monitored Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and ranking them on these metrics.

R&A AFFILIATES RANKING

Comparison of each country against all other R&A Affiliates (excluding Europe) globally for monitored Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and ranking them on these metrics.

REGISTERED GOLFERS PER COURSE (Golf Around the World Courses)

Total registered golfers per course calculated from The R&A's report on courses – 'Golf Around the World' which explores golf's global reach through the supply of golf courses, existing and under development – showing total courses per country. Provides a comparative measure of demand and usage from affiliated golfers per golf course for the federation in each country.

Glossary.

NATIONAL SQUAD / ELITE PLAYER & DEVELOPMENT SQUAD GOLFERS

Number of absolute players in the national squads, on the elite development squad programmes including national teams from adult, senior to junior players run by the national federation.

ADULT MALE REGISTERED GOLFERS / ADULT FEMALE REGISTERED GOLFERS

Absolute number of adult male and female golfers registered or affiliated to the national federation.

% OF ADULT REGISTERED GOLFERS

Male / female split of the absolute number of adult male and female golfers to indicate the penetration of golf amongst the male-&-female adult genders. Indicative of success in achieving equality in participation and creation of a family sport in the market.

JUNIOR REGISTERED GOLFERS / % of TOTAL REGISTERED GOLFERS.

Absolute number of junior golfers registered or affiliated to the national federation, and calculated as a percentage of total registered golfers. Indicative of success in broadening the appeal of the sport to a younger generation, and towards achieving equality in participation and creation of a family sport in the market.

TOTAL GOLF COURSES (Golf Around the World)

Total golf courses per country as monitored and measured through The R&A 'Golf Around the World' programme which explores golf's global reach through the supply of golf courses, existing and under development carried out in association with the National Golf Foundation. The country totals will include those courses not affiliated to the national federations. Used as the golf course variable in the calculation of total registered golfers per course.

TOTAL 9-HOLE GOLF COURSES

Number of 9-hole golf courses affiliated to the national federation. A good measure of facilities from starter venues to established standalone 9-hole golf courses.

TOTAL 18-HOLE GOLF COURSES

Number of 18-hole golf courses affiliated to the national federation.

NOTE

For clarification, the total sum of 9-hole, 18-hole and Other Golf Courses affiliated to the national federation may not equal the absolute number of golf courses from the Golf Around the World monitor.

Reference to full length golf courses include 6-hole, 9-hole, 18-hole or other combination of hole layouts of standard length holes. Pitch & putt, and Par-3 golf courses are defined and monitored in addition to full length courses.

Reflection on Data Collection Process.


The data collection process is a challenging one. The R&A, working with Sports Marketing Surveys, has attempted to gather key data from more than 100 different national federations. As this information is being gathered for the first time it is not always possible to benchmark the submitted information against other sources or to interrogate every piece of data that is submitted.

Sports Marketing Surveys would like to thank Mark Lawrie (R&A Director, Latin America & Caribbean) and Dominic Wall (R&A Director, Asia Pacific) for their significant support in contacting and liaising with the national federations to source the information.

Sports Marketing Surveys have attempted to liaise individually with federations in order to evaluate and confirm the accuracy of the information that is being collated. This has not been possible in all instances.

It is anticipated that the accuracy will increase in future data collection and reporting, and replication of the process will facilitate this.

Improvements will also result through ongoing benchmarking. This programme will become an ongoing monitor which will allow federations to establish a recording process that allows them to collect data relating to their golfers. This is not only useful for the purposes of reporting but will help the federations with understanding their own golfing landscape.



"This report brings data together from many international affiliate markets for the first time. This is an important milestone and the report provides valuable insights regarding participation among golfers in countries and regions in which we work to grow and develop the sport. There are 39 million golfers under our jurisdiction of which 31 million are covered by the countries in this report. We will continue to invest in research so that we can identify trends and use these insights to inform our activities in golf and support our international affiliates with the aim of ensuring that the sport continues to thrive 50 years' from now."


