SUMMARY OF WORK EXPERIENCE

Denyse J. Snelder has been acting head of the VU Centre for International Cooperation (CIS) since August 2023. She obtained her PhD in 1993 from the University of Toronto, Canada, for research on vegetative control of soil erosion in the semi-arid Baringo District, Kenya. Up to December 2012 she had a dual position, one as a senior advisor on Sustainable Land and Water Management at CIS and one as an associate professor at the Institute of Environmental Sciences Leiden (CML), Leiden University, Netherlands.
