- to study largely self-directed or autonomous and to conduct independent scholarly research within the area of the chosen discipline, as shown in the thesis;
- to develop a coherent overview of the professional field linked to the chosen discipline and to develop basic skills of a young professional in this field through participation.

#### b Leadership

The Master of Theology and Religious studies subprogramme Leadership seeks to enable students:

- 1. to show in-depth theoretical knowledge in contemporary theories on (religious) leadership, both in existing religious communities and non-profits and within the setting of pioneering and entrepreneurship;
- 2. to reflect theologically and critically on the issues that pertain in these theories and their application in practice and to place them in a multi-disciplinary frame of reference;
- 3. to identify the various definitions of hermeneutics as a basis for developing an adequate hermeneutic theory and dialogical praxis and to apply various hermeneutic theories to the theories and practices of religious and nonreligious Leadership in various contexts.
- 4. to make well-founded judgments regarding the practice of (religious) leadership;
- 5. to communicate the results of research efforts to diverse audiences of specialists and non-specialists;
- 6. to study largely self-directed or autonomous and to conduct independent scholarly research within the area of religion/theology and Lleadership;
- to become a reflective practitioner in the field of leadership with basic skills in leading existing (faith) communities and starting new (faith) communities and non-profits.

#### c Media

The Master of Theology and Religious studies subprogramme Media seeks to enable students:

 to show in-depth theoretical knowledge in the area of media and communication in relation to religion and spirituality, media sociology and media ethics and understanding of the religious dimensions and development of today's media



- culture, the implications of these for established religions, religious communities and individuals;
- to reflect theologically and critically on the function of media in religion, religion in the media and reflect theologically and creatively on one's own (non-)religious identity in relation to popular culture and to place these in a multidisciplinary frame of reference;
- 3. to identify the various definitions of hermeneutics as a basis for developing an adequate hermeneutic theory and dialogical praxis and to apply various hermeneutic theories in cases in which mediation of religion is involved;
- 4. to make independent critical judgments on the basis of limited data and with an eye on the social and ethical implications;
- 5. to communicate the results of research efforts to diverse audiences of specialists and non-specialists;
- 6. to study largely self-directed or autonomous and to conduct independent scholarly research within the area of Media, religion/theology and culture;
- 7. to develop a coherent overview of the professional field of media, communication and religion and to develop basics skills of a young professional in this field through participation.

#### d Spiritual Care

The Master of Theology and Religious studies subprogramme Spiritual Care seeks to enable students:

- 1. to show in-depth theoretical knowledge in the key concepts which define the domain of Spiritual Care;
- 2. to reflect critically (from the perspective of theology and religious studies) on the way of recognizing, analyzing, and approaching the vulnerability of human lives both in religious and non-religious traditions;
- 3. to identify the various definitions of hermeneutics as a basis for developing an adequate hermeneutic theory and dialogical praxis and to apply various hermeneutic theories on existential themes in the narrative of clients;
- 4. to make independent critical judgments on the basis of limited data and with an eye on the social and ethical implications as well as the relation with other disciplines, the organizational context and religious authorities;
- 5. to communicate the results of research efforts to diverse audiences of specialists and non-specialists and to communicate appropriately and respectfully about one's own and other religious and/or spiritual traditions;
- 6. to study largely self-directed or autonomous and to conduct independent scholarly research within the area of Spiritual Care;
- 7. to develop a coherent view of the professional field of Spiritual Care, to develop the ability to situate oneself authentically in this field and to develop the skills required for an initial start as a professional in this field.

#### e Building Interreligious Relations

The Master of Theology and Religious studies subprogramme Building Interreligious Relations seeks to enable students:

- 1. to show in-depth theoretical knowledge in the emerging field of interreligious studies: (1) be able to distinguish this field from both religious studies, comparative religion and theology of religions; (2) be able to identify the main scholarly positions in the field; (3) understand why this field requires a multidisciplinary approach
- 2. to reflect critically on the way dominant scholarly and/or societal assumptions with regard to religion (what religion is; how it relates to violence; the division between religion and the secular...) impacts the way diversity related conflicts are framed and analyzed.
- 3. to be able to understand and apply different hermeneutical strategies to a variety of 'sacred' texts and develop a differential and dialogical hermeneutics.
- 4. to be able to connect theory and praxis and to analyse judge and propose on concrete



solutions to cases about diversity related problems;

- 5. to communicate the results of research efforts to diverse audiences of specialists and non-specialists;
- 6. to study largely self-directed or autonomous and to conduct independent scholarly research within the field of interreligious studies.
- 7. to develop a coherent overview of the professional field of interreligious studies and develop basic skills of a young professional in this field through participation.

#### f Peace, Trauma and Religion

The Master of Theology and Religious studies subprogramme Peace, Trauma and Religion seeks to enable students:

- 1. To show in depth theoretical knowledge in contemporary studies on peace and reconciliation and/or trauma and healing in contexts of conflict and war and in post-conflict contexts;
- 2. To reflect theologically and critically on the the role played by religious traditions in legitimizing conflict and violence and creating conflicting identities;
- 3. To identify the various definitions of hermeneutics as a basis for developing an adequate hermeneutical theology and dialogical praxis and to apply various hermenutical theories to the theories and practices of reconciliation, peace building and trauma healing;
- 4. To make independent critical judgments on the basis of limited data and with an eye on social and moral implications;
- 5. To communicate the results of research efforts to diverse audiences of specialists and non-specialists;
- To study largely self-directed or autonomous and to conduct independent scholarly research within the field of Violence, Religion and Reconciliation in a religious/theological perspective;
- 7. To gain a coherent knowledge and overview in the field of conflict-studies, peace-building and trauma-healing mechanisms and to develop the basic skills of a young professional in this field through participation.

#### Appendix 1

#### Evaluation of the education in the Faculty of Religion and Theology

Course and curriculum evaluations are aimed at improving the quality of the education. Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam has a number of key performance indicators that are measured by means of course evaluations. These concern the scores for the quality of the course content, the quality of teaching provided by teachers and the examination.

Questionnaires in the Faculty of Religion and Theology are sent electronically. That guarantees anonymity of students and enables the PDCA cycle – which is intended to improve education – to take place correctly.

When the results of the evaluation have been written up in a report, the course coordinator is notified. The teacher draws up a response to the results of the evaluation and may also inform the students of any changes he/she will make to the course in the following academic year in view of the results. Students are given access to a selection of the results of the evaluation and the teacher's response.

The evaluation reports are available to the Programme Committee, the Director of Studies and the Dean of Education. The Education Office is responsible for correct distribution of the evaluation reports. In the case of the Programme Committees this takes place through the evaluation contact persons. The annual evaluation plan states when the evaluation reports will be available; the Programme Committees can schedule their meetings accordingly if desired. The Programme Committees present an analysis of the evaluations in their annual report.

#### Courses to be evaluated

The following criteria are applied when designating a module as requiring evaluation:

- each course is evaluated (at least) once every three years. This means that in any event one-third of all courses will be covered.
- courses taught by new teachers;
- all newly developed (or fundamentally altered) courses;
- courses that are included in the Examination Committees' annual plans;
- all courses in new or renewed programmes of study;
- all less well rated courses, with scores of < 3.5 for questions 6 (overall rating of the quality of the course content), 17 and 39 (overall rating of the teaching qualities of the teacher) and/or 23 (overall rating of the exam);</li>
- all courses in the university minor Islam;
- courses with more than eight enrolled students which were designated as requiring evaluation in the previous year, but for which no evaluation results are available.

#### **Curriculum evaluations**

The basic principle is that a programme of study is evaluated in any case before the start of a mid-term review or visitation and after every (major) change to the programme of study. BA and MA questionnaires are sent electronically. The Director of Education may add additional questions to the questionnaire. The period in which the questionnaire is sent is determined in consultation with the programme. The results of curriculum evaluations may be discussed with the Work and Employment Advisory Committee, as well as with the Programme Committee.

#### **Panel discussions**

There are other ways of evaluating education besides digital evaluations. For example, evaluations can also be carried out effectively by means of panel discussions.

Panel discussions are initiated and organized by the Programme Committee; good reporting (including incorporation in the Programme Committee's annual report) is essential. Panel discussions may relate to one course or period, but also to a longer period (a whole semester or year). Programme Committees can determine the best options for their programme(s).

#### **National Student Survey**

Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam takes part in the National Student Survey, which is conducted every spring. The National Student Survey can provide useful information on how students view their programme. The results of the National Student Survey are considered in the programme annual reports.
