ABOUT TIKKUN

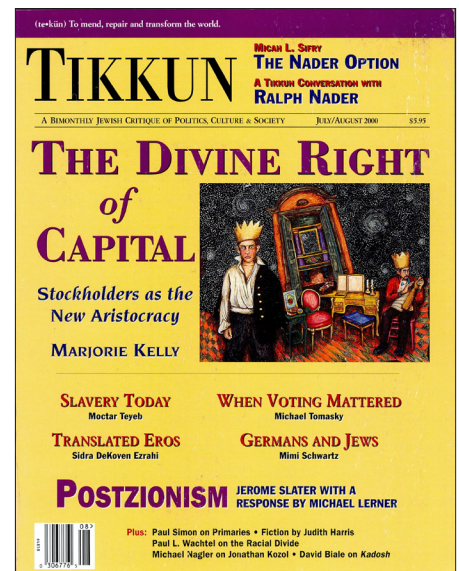
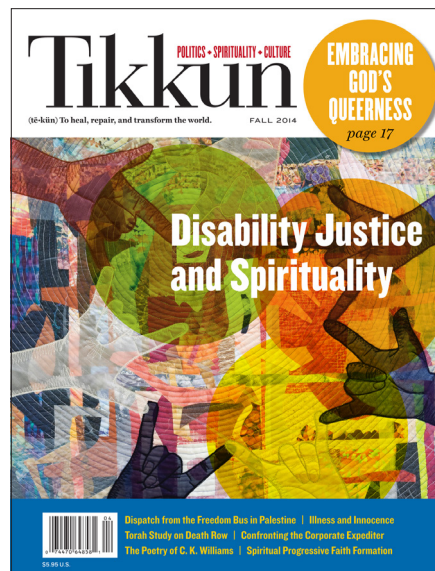
