Low-Income Virginians Connected to Benefits in 2022-2023

Thanks to federal funding that supports efforts to find and enroll low-income people on Medicare into benefits they are eligible for, 266,573 low-income older and disabled Virginians received assistance that can help them to afford their prescription drugs and doctor visits.

This federal funding supports Virginia's:

- State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)
- 22 Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs)
- 3 Benefits Enrollment Centers (BECs)



Funding also supports BenefitsCheckUp®, a free online screening and enrollment tool.

These organizations help older adults making less than \$22,000 a year apply for:

- Medicare Part D Low-Income Subsidy (LIS/Extra Help)
- Medicare Savings Programs (MSPs)



Virginians in Need Found Help...

Thanks to previous federal funding, in 2022-2023:

- 48,573 Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers in Virginia received help with access to low-income benefits
- 218,000 Virginias used BenefitsCheckUp® to connect with benefits online

... But Far Too Many Are Still Missing Out

 479,898 Medicare beneficiaries in Virginia are living at or below 150% of the federal poverty level and need help affording health care

Mr. Chester's Story



A Virginia Benefits Enrollment Center (BEC) helped Mr. Chester with applications for Medicaid, SNAP, MSP, and LIS. Mr. Chester was referred by the local DSS office, which indicated he needed person-centered assistance due to being deaf. The BEC was able to assist Mr. Chester using text and email to complete all applications in a timely manner.
