Low-Income People in Wyoming Connected to Benefits in 2022-2023

Thanks to federal funding that supports efforts to find and enroll low-income people on Medicare into benefits they are eligible for, 11,283 low-income older and disabled people in Wyoming received assistance that can help them to afford their prescription drugs and doctor visits.

This federal funding supports Wyoming's:

- State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)
- 1 Area Agency on Aging



Funding also supports BenefitsCheckUp®, a free online screening and enrollment tool.

These organizations help older adults making less than \$22,000 a year apply for:

- Medicare Part D Low-Income Subsidy (LIS/Extra Help)
- Medicare Savings Programs (MSPs)



People in Wyoming in Need Found Help...

Thanks to previous federal funding, in 2022-2023:

- 3,283 Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers in Wyoming received help with access to low-income benefits
- 8,000 People in Wyoming used BenefitsCheckUp® to connect with benefits online

... But Far Too Many Are Still Missing Out

 28,349 Medicare beneficiaries in Wyoming are living at or below 150% of the federal poverty level and need help affording health care

Jake's Story



After Jake suffered a stroke, his sister became his main caregiver. But even combined, they could not afford Jake's medication, and he often had to go without it. They were living on a diet of sandwiches and ramen. Meeting with a benefits counselor connected the siblings to programs that can help. They applied for a Medicare Savings Program and Medicare Part D Extra Help, which helped pay for prescription costs, premiums, deductibles, and co-pays. The counselors even went the extra mile to help the pair find a better living situation and food assistance.
