Low-Income Tennessee Residents Connected to Benefits in 2022-2023

Thanks to federal funding that supports efforts to find and enroll low-income people on Medicare into benefits they are eligible for, 412,363 low-income older and disabled Tennessee Residents received assistance that can help them to afford their prescription drugs and doctor visits.

This federal funding supports Tennessee's:

- State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)
- 9 Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs)
- 2 Benefits Enrollment Center (BEC)



Funding also supports BenefitsCheckUp®, a free online screening

and enrollment tool.

These organizations help older adults making less than \$22,000 a year apply for:

- Medicare Part D Low-Income Subsidy (LIS/Extra Help)
- Medicare Savings Programs (MSPs)



Ohio Residents in Need Found Help...

Thanks to previous federal funding, in 2022-2023:

- 313,763 Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers in Tennessee received help with access to low-income benefits
- 98,600 Tennessee Residents used BenefitsCheckUp® to connect with benefits online

 455,733 Medicare beneficiaries in Tennessee are living at or below 150% of the federal poverty level and need help affording health care
