16,282 Low-Income Residents in Florida's 16th District Connected to Benefits in 2022-2023

Thanks to federal funding that supports efforts to find and enroll low-income people on Medicare into benefits they are eligible for, 16,282 low-income older and disabled residents in Florida's 16th District received assistance that can help them to afford their prescription drugs and doctor visits.

This federal funding supports Florida's 16th District:

- State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)
- 1 Area Agency on Aging (AAAs)

Sara's Story

Sara's initial applications for MSP and LIS were denied due to an incorrect assessment of her assets. A benefits counselor diligently appealed the decision. To Sara's relief, she received a letter of approval for an MSP. Recognizing the error, the state agency awarded Sara's benefit retroactively, meaning she received \$698, a significant sum for someone on a limited income.
