Low-Income Residents in Florida's 16th District Connected to Benefits in 2022-2023

Thanks to federal funding that supports efforts to find and enroll low-income people on Medicare into benefits they are eligible for, 16,282 low-income older and disabled residents in Florida's 16th District received assistance that can **help them to afford their prescription drugs and doctor visits.**

This federal funding supports Florida's 16th District:

- State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)
- 1 Area Agency on Aging (AAAs)



These organizations help older adults making less than \$22,000 a year apply for:

- Medicare Part D Low-Income Subsidy (LIS/Extra Help)
- Medicare Savings Programs (MSPs)



Funding also supports BenefitsCheckUp[®], a free online screening and enrollment tool.

Residents in Florida's 16th District in Need Found Help...

Thanks to previous federal funding, in 2022-2023:

- **16,282** Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers received help with access to low-income benefits

... But Far Too Many Are Still Missing Out

- **120,617** Medicare beneficiaries in Florida's 16th District are living at or below 150% of the federal poverty level and need help affording health care

Sara's Story

|| Sara's initial applications for MSP and LIS were denied due to an incorrect assessment of her assets. A benefits counselor diligently appealed the decision. To Sara's relief, she received a letter of approval for an MSP. Recognizing the error, the state agency awarded Sara's benefit retroactively, meaning she received \$698, a significant sum for someone on a limited income.
