Event for Seattle-Area Older Adults Will Offer Tips and Expert Advice on Home Modifications to Help Maintain Independence and Safety

Event Will Take Place During <u>Falls Prevention Awareness Week</u> and will include live interpretation in Cantonese and Mandarin

SEATTLE, WA – Older adults from across the Seattle area will gather on Thursday, September 26 for a community event to learn about home safety modifications that can reduce the risk of falls around the home. A panel of experts will offer tips for home safety modifications. Participants will also have the opportunity to complete a personalized falls risk assessment. The event is a collaboration between <u>Age Friendly Seattle</u>, <u>Kin On</u>, <u>Sound Generations</u>, the <u>King</u> <u>County Fall Prevention Coalition</u>, and the <u>National Council on Aging</u>.

Falls are not a normal part of aging, and they can be prevented. However, more than <u>one in four</u> Americans age 65+ falls each year, and falls are the leading cause of fatal and nonfatal injuries for older Americans. The issue is particularly pressing in King County, where <u>nearly half</u> of all injury-related deaths among residents age 65+ are due to unintentional falls. This event prioritizes culturally sensitive programming designed to help reduce disparities in access to health information among different communities, and will include live interpretation in Cantonese and Mandarin.
