

Christopher David Ruiz Cameron is Vice Dean and Justice Marshall F. McComb Professor of Law at Southwestern Law School in Los Angeles. Dean Cameron has over 30 years of experience in labor relations and over 20 years of experience as a neutral. His neutral experience includes five years as a Member of the Los Angeles Employee Relations Board, the agency that resolves unfair labor practices affecting 48,000 employees working in 60 separate bargaining units in the nation's second largest city. He serves on a dozen arbitration or civil service rosters and hears cases raising the full spectrum of issues affecting the public and private sector workplaces.

In 2017-18, Dean Cameron became Secretary of the American Bar Association's Section of Labor and Employment Law.

At Southwestern, Dean Cameron teaches courses treating the law of the workplace. His published scholarship includes two books by West Academic Publishing: *Labor Law in the Contemporary Workplace* (2d ed. 2014) and *Labor-Management Relations: Strikes, Lockouts and Boycotts* (2017-18 ed.). He is an Elected Member of the American Law Institute, the College of Labor and Employment Lawyers, and The Labor Law Group.

After serving as law clerk to Judge Harry Pregerson of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, Dean Cameron practiced labor law at a major firm in Southern California. He is a graduate of UCLA and Harvard Law School, where he was an editor of the *Harvard Law Review*.
