1. Call to Order and Land Acknowledgment of Indigenous Peoples: Commission President Helen Chin called the meeting to order at 12:31 p.m. with a quorum in attendance. President Chin began by reading the L.A. County Land Acknowledgment – which can be found at the following link: Land Acknowledgment – (lacounty.gov) - and recognized the Tongva, Tataviam, Serrano, Kizh, and Chumash Peoples as original inhabitants of these lands, honoring and paying respect to their elders and descendants; acknowledged that settler colonization resulted in land seizure, disease, subjugation, slavery, relocation, broken promises, genocide, and multi-generational trauma; reminded us of our responsibility and commitment to truth, healing, and reconciliation, and to elevating the stories, culture, and community of the original inhabitants of Los Angeles County.

2. Review & Approval of December 2, 2024 Meeting Minutes: The motion to approve the minutes of the Commission meeting of December 2, 2024 was presented by President Helen Chin. Commissioner Isabelle Gunning made a motion to approve, and Commissioner Fredrick Sykes seconded it. The motion passed

3. President's Report

- 3.1 Spotlight on a Partner- Prof. Stacy-Lynn Sant: President Chin welcomed Professor Stacy-Lynn Sant, a professor who does research at the University of Michigan, looking at sport and strategic planning with a focus on addressing and mitigating human rights issues for large scale sports events. Prof. Sant explained that with the World Cup and Super Bowl coming to Los Angeles, it is important to acknowledge that millions of tourists will be coming into Los Angeles and the work includes proactive planning and management of their impact on LA County as the key to generating a positive legacy. She suggested to engage stakeholders early to build trust in and around the events and focus on the issues that are important to them. Additionally, transparency and accountability are also very important to help people have a way to report any issues. Lastly, Prof. Sant recommended research, monitoring and evaluation to ensure that the grievance mechanism falls in line with what is currently being implemented.
- **3.2 LACCHR Annual Hate Crime Report Press Conference- Dec 11, 2024:** President Chin briefly shared she had the privilege of attending this event and wanted to acknowledge Commissioners Moss and Sykes for attending as well. President Chin shared that there was broad attendance and it reminded her of the importance and value of documenting and reporting incidents. Additionally, she noted with pride that all the L.A. County Supervisors attended in person and spoke at this press conference.
- **3.3** New Year's message: In reflecting on the challenges we face in the new year, President Chin shared a passage from Braiding Sweetgrass by Robin Wall Kimmerer to ask us to reflect on how we can hold the growing complexities of this moment worry about the impacts of hate on our communities, our commitment to human rights for all, and the right actions to take, all while turning toward each other in connection and solidarity to move us into the future.

4. Executive Director's Report

- **4.1 Hate Crime Report Press Conference, December 11, 2024:** Executive Director (ED) Robin Toma began by wishing everyone a Happy New Year. He expressed that this last press conference for the LA County Hate Crime Report was one of the most successful ones that HRC has ever held. He noted that over 3,000 hate crime reports were received by our agency. And in addition to the five County Supervisors, the Sheriff and the District Attorney, there was representation from the community partners and supporters. ED Toma expressed the hope that having the Supervisors present would help with the resources needed by the communities that are being hardest hit by hate.
- **4.2 Invitation to JFEDLA Celebration on December 16, 2024:** ED Toma shared that he was invited to speak at the Jewish Federation of Los Angeles (JFEDLA) Hannukah Menorah Lighting event on December 16th at Gloria Molina Grand Park, at which he will remark on the rise in antisemitic hate crimes calling on us all to respond to the Jewish community and all communities targeted for hate, and that he will be speaking at the upcoming January 25th Holocaust remembrance event organized by the JFED of the Greater San Gabriel and Pomona Valleys, of which Commissioner Moss is Executive Director.
- **4.3 Communications Update Robert Sowell:** Assistant Executive Director (AED) Robert Sowell reported on behalf of PIO Tony Cowser, who is taking well-deserved time off. He shared images of

the Supervisors and DA Nathan Hochman at the December 11th press conference, expressing the magnitude of PIO Cowser's work. He stated that it does not go unnoticed and emphasized that his work made it possible to successfully organize the press conference. AED Sowell highlighted that the results of this press conference led to an 800% increase of social media mentions.

4.4 Other Program and Administrative (Budget) Updates: ED Toma informed attendees that the CEO of Los Angeles County has asked all departments and agencies to do a budget curtailment exercise to help identify how funds can be cut if there is that need (due to the change in law that eliminates time limitations to file claims of child abused against LA County government., and he is currently working on identifying such budget reductions without affecting staff..

5. Committee Reports

- **5.1 Transformative Justice Committee (Gunning):** Commissioner Gunning shared that the committee is still working on reports, which will be finalized in February or March.
- **5.2 Human Rights Committee (Yuen):** President Chin informed all attendees that Commissioner Yuen, the chair, was absent, therefore there was no report at this time.
- **5.3 John Anson Ford Human Relations (JAF) Awards Committee (Davidson):** Commissioner Montaño reported on behalf of Commissioner Davidson, indicating that she wanted to discuss item 5.3 during the action/discussion item 7.1.
- 6. Public Comment: (3 minutes per person): None was offered.

7. Action/Discussion Items:

- 7.1 JAF Awards event decisions: Commissioner Montaño explained that the committee has met and has selected recipients for consideration for the John Anson Ford Human Relations (JAF) Awards. Commissioners discussed each of the nominees and decided on the top two nominees per district as well as awardees for the two county-wide awards. The motion was made to approve awardees and a runner up f for all the awards. The motion passed unanimously, except for an abstention by Commissioner Ellis-Royston abstained.
- 7.2 Update on human rights recognition for LA County: ED Robin Toma shared that they met with the committee about our Commission's recognition of the international human rights treaties and declarations that are relevant to our work, and researching those involved with LA County government's adoption and implementation of the Convention to Eliminate Discrimination Against Women.
- 7.3 Follow up on annual hate crimes report for LA County: ED Toma shared that our Commission has been drafting a plan in response to the Annual Hate Crime Report that would be an action item for the Board of Supervisors to consider and more information will be provided to Commissioners in upcoming meetings.
- **7.4** Collaboration with County Office of Anti-Racism, Diversity and Inclusion (ARDI): Tabled 7.4 without objection due to lack of time.
- **8.** <u>Commissioner Announcements:</u> Commissioner Keushkerian shared that he had the honor to attend Supervisor Barger's meeting for her commissioners in the Hall of Administration and was proud to represent the Commission.

9. Adjournment: The motion to adjourn in memory of former President Jimmy Carter, Nobel Peace Prize winner and human rights champion; of world-renowned African American poet and activist, Nikki Giovanni; and of Alicia Gaudet and Betty Jackson, former Commission staff members; was made by Commissioner Moss, seconded by Commissioner Davidson. The motion passed unanimously. President Chin adjourned the meeting at 2:08 p.m.
