Los Angeles County Human Relations Commission to Release Annual Hate Crimes Report

LOS ANGELES — On Wednesday, December 7th, the Los Angeles County Commission on Human Relations will release its Report on Hate Crime in Los Angeles County for the full calendar year 2021.

The report provides analysis of the greatest collection of hate crime data for LA County, including information based on race/ethnicity, national origin, sexual orientation, religion, gender, and disability. The information is collected from more than 100 law enforcement agencies, school districts, and community-based organizations throughout the County.

Topics to be covered include hate crimes in which COVID-19 was mentioned; rising numbers of antiimmigrant slurs; disproportionate victimization of African Americans; high rates of violence against lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender individuals; continued victimization of the Jewish community; and hate crimes committed by gang members.

The report also documents which regions of the County experienced the highest numbers and rates of hate crimes. Speakers will also talk about what is happening to end hate crimes and incidents in our County, including the L.A. vs. Hate Initiative.
