## MISSION STATEMENT AND ORDINANCE

### MISSION STATEMENT

The Commission for Children and Families advises the Board of Supervisors on strengthening service delivery systems and enhancing partnerships to create safer and more secure futures for Los Angeles County's at-risk children and their families.

### ORDINANCE

The Commission was created by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors (Board) on May 8, 1984, and is charged by its ordinance to:

- ❖ Review all programs administered by County departments that provide services for at-risk children;
  - ❖ Receive input from appropriate community groups and individuals concerning administered children's services programs;
  - ❖ Review and make recommendations to the Board concerning legislation dealing with children's needs;
  - ❖ Make recommendations, as necessary, to various County department heads to improve children's services;
  - ❖ Make recommendations, as necessary, to the Board on action to be taken to improve children's services; and,
  - ❖ Provide an annual report to the Board concerning the status of children's services, along with recommendations for their improvement, to be utilized for broad community distribution and discussion.

## ACTIVITIES AND PRIORITIES IN 2024

As reflected by the Commission's meeting topics and presenters (shown later in this report), the Commission heard from agencies, advocates, and community members on several issues impacting children and families this year. These presentations informed the Commission of ongoing challenges and provided opportunities to address the continuing and emerging needs for children in Los Angeles County, particularly, foster children, children aged zero to five years, school-aged children, and transition-aged older youth.

During the first half of the year, the Commission had a particular interest in the contracted role of Sheriff's Deputies on school campuses. The Commission heard from community advocates that wanted to ensure that the presence of these School Resource Deputies, whose primary purpose is to help maintain a safe environment on campus, did not undermine the school experience for students, particularly Black and Latinx students. On April 2, 2024, the Commission submitted a memo<sup>1</sup> to the Board of Supervisors recommending that the Board direct County agencies to implement the recommendations from the Civilian Oversight Commission's, Quality of Life Ad Hoc Committee, October 19, 2023 Report and Recommendations<sup>2</sup> on Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's School Resource Deputy Program, and to take additional steps identified by the Commission.

The Commission also continued to focus on the needs of foster children by receiving updates and presentations at their meetings on the developmental, placement, and mental health needs of these children and youth.

The Commission's Racial Justice Committee (RJC) is a "standing" committee that, like the Commission, meets monthly and adheres to the open meeting requirements of California's Ralph M. Brown Act. The RJC expanded the Commission's focus to include the impact that involvement in the family law court and child support systems has on families, particularly women and children.

A highlight of the year was the Commission's celebration of its 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Supervisor Hilda L. Solis provided special remarks and presented an anniversary Board scroll to the Commission. Many Commissioners from years past, joined the present Commissioners to recognize the four decades of service the Commission has provided to the children and families of Los Angeles County.
