Warren Schmidt called the meeting to order at 9:50 A.M.

Approval of Minutes. On motion of John Byork, seconded by Larry Neri, and unanimously carried the commission approved the minutes of the March 7 meeting, and excused the absence of Luis Ruiz from that meeting.

Announcements. Warren Schmidt announced that Burke Roche has resigned his position with the commission to become the Executive Vice President of the Los Angeles Taxpayers Association.

Dr. Schmidt announced that Dorothy Courtney had recently addressed the League of Women Voters of Beverly Hills on the subject of E & E Commission activities. Ms. Courtney reported that the meeting had been constructive and informative. Some League members had read the report on government structure, and expressed interest in our current activities. Warren Schmidt also announced that the Foundation for Effective

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Government had voted to sponsor and financially support the conference on government structure to be held at USC on May 4.

Task Force Reports. Catherine Burke reported that planning for the May 4 conference is proceeding on schedule. There is apparently a high degree of interest in the subject matter of the commission's report, Challenge for the 1980's: Can We Govern Ourselves? The conference planning session on March 23 was attended by 16 officials of community, state, and local organizations who will assist in providing invitation lists and confirming attendance.

John Campbell reported that the Task Force on Proposition 13 met on March 21 to review information gathered so far on the impact of Proposition 13 and to establish task force goals. Wayne Tavetian, an intern from Claremont Graduate School, will be working on this project, which fits in with his academic assignments. Regarding the Task Force on Proposition A, Mr. Campbell reported that the Board of Supervisors has appointed Dick Gunther as the E & E representative on the County's Advisory Committee on Contracting.

Executive Session (Personnel). The commission recessed to executive session at 10:25 A.M. to discuss personnel matters.

Personnel Actions. The commission reconvened in public session at 10:55 A.M. On motion of George Bodle, seconded by Robert Ruchti, and unanimously carried, the commission took the following actions:

- Appointed John Campbell as Executive Secretary effective May 1, 1979, to continue at his present fee under contract as Staff Specialist, and resolved to renegotiate a suitable contract fee for the 1979 - 1980 fiscal year.
- Resolved to recognize Burke Roche's dedicated service to the commission with a luncheon on May 2, following the commission meeting, and with presentation of appropriate awards.
