

Call to Order. (21-3913)

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Co-Chair Sarah Dusseault, Blue-Ribbon Commission on Homelessness.

1. Continuation of Commission Meetings by Teleconference in Compliance with AB 361. (21-3932)

Ms. Mary Wickham, Executive Director, Blue-Ribbon Commission on Homelessness (BRCH), provided that, pursuant to action by the Board of Supervisors, the BRCH would continue meeting virtually due to the ongoing emergency.

A member of the public commented on this item.

II. PRESENTATION

2. Presentation by Ann Oliva re: Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority: Report on Governance, February 2021. (21-3912)

Ms. Ann Oliva, Vice President for Housing Policy, Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, provided an overview of the findings in her report prepared for the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) Ad-Hoc Committee on Governance.

Commissioner Sedano inquired about outreach after LAHSA transitioned to a system administrator and whether service providers felt there was an overlap. Ms. Oliva provided that service providers expressed frustration about lack of resources, but not about overlap with LAHSA's outreach services.

Commissioner Evangelis requested clarification on the system administrator role. Ms. Oliva provided that LAHSA's role in compliance and grant administration has expanded to strategic planning, data management, and management of the rehousing system.

Commissioner Sedano inquired whether it was a best practice for a single organization to manage the substantial budget increase during the pandemic. Ms. Oliva provided that no other jurisdiction is comparable to Los Angeles County in size or local government structure and that LAHSA was the only viable option to take the funding.

Commissioner Shevlin inquired about the authority of LAHSA to take on an expanded role as system administrator.

Commissioner Porter inquired whether examples exist in other jurisdictions in which the system administrator is the Continuum of Care (CoC) Board.

Commissioner Rodarte commented on the need for LAHSA to communicate in a way that acknowledges the other cities besides the City of Los Angeles.

Commissioner Shevlin requested future discussion about the cities' concerns about distribution of funds.

Ms. Suzette Shaw addressed the BRCH.

On motion of Commissioner Greuel, seconded by Commissioner Shevlin, and duly carried by the following vote, the BRCH received and filed the presentation presented:
