Hearing on an ordinance for adoption to extend Interim Urgency Ordinance No. 2022-0065U for a period of 10 months and 15 days to December 15, 2023, to temporarily require a Conditional Use Permit for the establishment of new drive-through establishments on all properties located within the boundaries of the Green Zones District communities (1, 2 and 4) in the unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County, and subject to the standards therein; and find that adoption of the ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. 2. Hearing on Fiscal Year-End Report and Updated Developer Fee

Hearing on adoption of a resolution updating the Developer Fee Program to approve the Developer Fee Detailed Fire Station Plan, the District's Developer Fee Funds 2021-22 Fiscal Year-End Report, and the 2022 Developer Fee Update Fee Calculation Summary to increase the Developer Fee rates in the unincorporated Areas of Benefit 1, Malibu/Santa Monica Mountains and the City of Calabasas to \$1.1345 per sq ft (+\$0.0931), Area of Benefit 2, Santa Clarita Valley, to \$1.5499 per sq ft (+\$0.1183), and Area of Benefit 3, Antelope Valley, to \$1.0881 per sq ft (+\$0.0961) (3 and 5), effective April 1, 2023, to reflect the current average costs associated with land acquisition, fire station construction, apparatus, equipment, and administration in each of the three Areas of Benefit; and find that the Developer Fee Program is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. 3. Hearing on County Code, Title 12 - Environmental Protection Amendment

Hearing on an ordinance for adoption amending County Code, Title 12 - Environmental Protection, acting as the Governing Body of the county consolidated Fire Protection District, to amend the definition within the County Code, Chapter 12.52 - Hazardous Waste Control of "large quantity generators" to the same standard established in Federal regulation and to delete the exemption provided to hazardous material handlers of carbon dioxide to be consistent with California State law, which will allow for permitting and regulating these facilities; and find that the amendments to the ordinance are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. 4. Hearing on County Code, Title 32 - Fire Code Amendment

Hearing on an ordinance for adoption amending County Code, Title 32 - Fire Code, to repeal Title 32 - Fire Code, which incorporated by reference portions of the 2019 Edition of the California Fire Code, and replaces it with a new Title 32 that incorporates by reference the 2022 Edition of the California Fire Code, with certain changes and amendments, which itself largely incorporates by reference, with certain changes and amendments, the 2021 Edition of the International Fire Code; State law allows the County and Consolidated Fire Protection District (District) to adopt more restrictive building standards than the 2022 Edition of the California Fire Code if they are reasonably necessary because of local climatic, geological, and/or topographical conditions; this ordinance contains findings that all of the amendments to the 2022 Edition of the California Fire Code that constitute more restrictive building standards are reasonably necessary because of local climatic, geological, and/or topographical conditions in the County; this ordinance further amends Title 32 by making administrative changes and editorial corrections; unless deleted or modified herein, the previously enacted provisions of Title 32 continue in effect; this ordinance adopts Title 32 as the Fire Code for the District. 5. Hearing to Grant a Water Pipeline Franchise to Walnut Park Mutual Water Company

Hearing on an ordinance for adoption granting a water pipeline franchise to Walnut Park Mutual Water Company, a California corporation (Franchisee), to collect, transport, and distribute water for a period of 15 years, beginning March 2, 2023, and expiring on March 1, 2038, in the unincorporated territory of the County, with the base annual fee payable to the County by Franchisee to be determined according to a formula contained in Section 2 of the franchise ordinance, and with the Franchisee to also pay a granting fee of \$10,000.
