Revised hearing on ordinance for adoption introduction amending County Code, Title 8 - Consumer Protection, Business and Wage Regulations. adding Chapter 8.42 - Sidewalk Vending, to regulate Sidewalk Vendors in the County Unincorporated Areas (All Districts); defines "Sidewalk Vendor" as a regulated business activity on public sidewalks and pedestrian paths in the Unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County; creates administrative procedures for a Sidewalk Vendor program; requiring requires that a Sidewalk Vendors register each year and pay an annual fee of \$604, as recommended by the Auditor-Controller for the reasonable regulatory costs for issuing the registration certificates and enforcing Chapter 8.42, with the fee amount subsidized by the Department of Economic Opportunity and the fee amount reduced to \$0 in the first year of the program; to annually applyfor a Sidewalk Vendor Registration Certificate, creates administrative procedures for a sidewalk vendor program to be administered by the Department of Economic Opportunity, regulates the operations of Sidewalk Vendors, including distancing and equipment requirements to ensure public health, safety, and welfare; prohibits tables and chairs for customer use on sidewalks and pedestrian paths pursuant to State and Federal accessibility standards; establishes an enforcement and appeals process, including imposition of fines and penalties for noncompliance; and requires a feeamount of \$604 for an initial registration application and annual renewal asrecommended by the Auditor-Controller for the reasonable regulatory costs for issuing the registration certificates and enforcing Chapter 8.42, with the fee amount of \$604 will be subsidized by the Department of Economic Opportunity and the fee amount reduced to \$0 in the first year of the program. Each item includes a brief summary of the Board member's motion or department's recommended action, and in some instances, a corresponding recommendation from the Chief Executive Officer, indicated in capital letters.

Included at the end of each agenda are items which have been continued from previous meetings for further discussion and action by the Board. This portion of the agenda is commonly referred to as the "A-item Agenda." At the request of a Supervisor, the A-items may be called up for consideration at any time.
