The majority of the Board's Tuesday agenda is a consent calendar. During the reading of the Agenda, the Executive Officer will indicate which items have been requested to be held for discussion or continued to a future meeting, and the remaining items will be approved. Each item includes a brief summary of the Board member's motion or department's recommended action, and in some instances, a corresponding recommendation from the Chief Executive Officer, indicated in capital letters.
