Warren Schmidt called the meeting to order at 9:45 a.m. He advised that the agenda would be rearranged because the copies of the report on government structure had not yet arrived from the printer.

Approval of Minutes - Margaret Carr asked that the December 13 minutes be corrected on page 2 to read "Proposition 13", not "Proposition B", in reference to the task force she recommended. The minutes were approved as corrected.

Nominations for Commission Chairperson - In accordance with commission operating procedures ballots were passed out for the members to list their first, second and third choices for chairperson. The staff will later tabulate the choices - five points for first place, three points for second, and one point for third. The three persons receiving the highest points are nominated. The election will be held at the February meeting.

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<u>Presentation of the Task Force Report on Government Structure</u> - Copies of the report arrived and were distributed.

Warren Schmidt gave a short introduction before presenting Catherine Burke. He said that the report is a response to the public's feeling about government. People believe that government is too costly, too unresponsive and too complex. The report represents a vision, something to move toward. It presents the first steps to make government more responsive, efficient and effective. The report invites discussion and we will continue to solicit comments.

Catherine Burke presented a detailed summary of the report. She described and emphasized the problems which the present system of 1,604 public agencies in the five county metropolitan area creates - problems of duplication, of size, of financing, and of complexity. She then described alternative solutions, including the commission's recommendations leading to a federated structure. She emphasized the difficulty and the time it will take to achieve an effective federated structure, but concluded that until we begin to move toward this goal government cannot perform its role as the facilitator in solving the immensely complex social, economic and environmental problems facing us.

Warren Schmidt recessed the meeting at 10:45 a.m. to answer questions from the press and television media. He reconvened the meeting at 10:58 and asked commission members for their comments. The members were in unanimous support of the task force report. Jerry Epstein emphasized the importance of getting the message to the public. Carolyn Ellner agreed that the commission should work with civic groups and public officials to pursue the program. John Byork strongly endorsed the recommendations on LAFCO actions and the importance of eliminating the unincorporated islands and forcing cities to annex undesireable areas.

Catherine Burke said the task force will continue to solicit comments and examine reactions leading to public hearings or conferences and addendums to the report. She then moved to adopt the report for circulation and discussion. Warren Schmidt asked that the motion read "To adopt for circulation, discussion and invitation of comments." Motion adopted unanimously.

George Shellenberger recommended that copies of the report be sent to the Los Angeles County delegation in the legislature. The commission agreed.

New Task Force Assignments and Activities - Warren Schmidt announced that he had formulated a list of task force assignments, including both continuing task forces and new task forces. After reviewing the list, the commission agreed on the following assignments.
