Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles

Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles (GSGLA) is a nonprofit organization that serves nearly 43,000 girls throughout the diverse communities of Los Angeles County. Through impactful programs in the areas of entrepreneurship, life skills, outdoor, and science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), Girl Scouts offers every girl a chance to practice a lifetime of leadership, adventure, and success in safe and inclusive spaces. Whether championing a cause, exploring robotics, or running their own cookie business, girls are encouraged and inspired to empower themselves.

In support of their mission to build girls of courage, confidence, and character, GSGLA has invested in communities and championed a plan of action for positive impact on the lives of girls in Greater Los Angeles. This year, GSGLA forged remarkable strides in underserved communities, serving more than 13,000 girls from low-income areas (up 15%); providing financial assistance to nearly 25% of our girl membership.

GSGLA, in an ongoing outreach effort, will be opening their newest service center in the city of Inglewood in April 2018. GSGLA provides more than 76,000 programs and opportunities yearly for girls, including 22 robotics teams, the highest performing cookie program, and the most successful Gold Award program in the country, with an average of 250 high-school Girl Scouts earning Girl Scouts' highest honor each year. With dedication, GSGLA continues to work diligently to elevate the leadership legacy of Girl Scouts and girls and women everywhere. This year the Girl Scouts are celebrating 106 years of service.
