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#### CODE OF CONDUCT

The Commission on HIV welcomes commissioners, guests, and the public into a space where people of all opinions and backgrounds are able to contribute. In this space, we challenge ourselves to be self-reflective and committed to an ongoing understanding of each other and the complex intersectionality of the lives we live. We create a safe environment where we celebrate differences while striving for consensus in the fights against our common enemies: HIV and STDs. We build trust in each other by having honest, respectful, and productive conversations. As a result, the Commission has adopted and is consistently committed to implementing the following guidelines for Commission, committee, and associated meetings.

#### All participants and stakeholders should adhere to the following:

- 1) We approach all our interactions with compassion, respect, and transparency.
- 2) We respect others' time by starting and ending meetings on time, being punctual, and staying present.
- 3) We listen with intent, avoid interrupting others, and elevate each other's voices.
- 4) We encourage all to bring forth ideas for discussion, community planning, and consensus.
- 5) We focus on the issue, not the person raising the issue.
- Be flexible, open-minded, and solution-focused.
- 7) We give and accept respectful and constructive feedback.
- 8) We keep all issues on the table (no "hidden agendas"), avoid monopolizing discussions and minimize side conversations.
- 9) We have no place in our deliberations for racist, sexist, homophobic, transphobic, and other discriminatory statements, and "-isms" including misogyny, ableism, and ageism.
- 10) We give ourselves permission to learn from our mistakes.

In response to violation of the Code of Conduct which results in meeting disruption, Include provisions of SB 1100 which states in part, ". . . authorize the presiding member of the legislative body conducting a meeting or their designee to remove, or cause the removal of, an individual for disrupting the meeting . . . . Removal to be preceded by a warning to the individual by the presiding member of the legislative body or their designee that the individual's behavior is disrupting the meeting and that the individual's failure to cease their behavior may result in their removal." Complaints related to internal Commission matters such as alleged violation of the Code of Conduct or other disputes among members are addressed and resolved in adherence to Policy/Procedure #08.3302." (Commission Bylaws, Article VII, Section 4.)

#### **COMMISSION MEMBER "CONFLICTS-OF-INTEREST"**

Updated 2/10/25

In accordance with the Ryan White Program (RWP), conflict of interest is defined as any financial interest in, board membership, current or past employment, or contractual agreement with an organization, partnership, or any other entity, whether public or private, that receives funds from the Ryan White Part A program. These provisions also extend to direct ascendants and descendants, siblings, spouses, and domestic partners of Commission members and non-Commission Committee-only members. Based on the RWP legislation, HRSA guidance, and Commission policy, it is mandatory for Commission members to state all conflicts of interest regarding their RWP Part A/B and/or CDC HIV prevention-funded service contracts prior to discussions involving priority-setting, allocation, and other fiscal matters related to the local HIV continuum. Furthermore, Commission members must recuse themselves from voting on any specific RWP Part A service category(ies) for which their organization hold contracts.\* \*An asterisk next to member's name denotes affiliation with a County subcontracted agency listed on the addendum.

#### 7. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/STAFF REPORT

#### a. Operational Updates

Executive Director, Cheryl Barrit, opened the floor by thanking all commissioners who responded to the check-in phone calls during the fires and reported the following:

- C. Barrit will forward questions regarding services that may have been impacted by the recent fires to Dr. Michael Green, Division of HIV and STDs Programs (DHSP), and the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Project Officers.
- The January 9<sup>th</sup> Commission meeting was canceled due to the Board of Supervisors (BOS) order to commemorate it as a day of mourning for the late former President Jimmy Carter. Agendized motions were moved to the February 13<sup>th</sup> agenda.
- The February 13<sup>th</sup> Commission meeting will be held at the California Endowment from 9 AM to 12 PM, immediately followed by the 2025 Consumer Resource Fair from 12 PM to 5 PM at the same location.
- The February 13<sup>th</sup> Commission meeting will focus on the Commission's restructuring process, which is tied into the Bylaw, and driven by feedback from the HRSA technical assistance, DHSP, commissioners, and the community. Additional meetings discussing the restructuring process will be scheduled as needed.
- The Commission on HIV's (COH) work plan incorporates core legislative responsibilities as follows:
  - The listening sessions and focus groups that began last year will carry over into this year as part
    of the needs assessment work.
  - HRSA has released its guidance for the next five-year cycle of the Comprehensive HIV Plan (CHP), accessible <u>HERE</u>. The current CHP ends in June 2026 and the Commission will begin planning for the next CHP this year.
  - The Planning, Priorities and Allocations (PP&A) Committee is finalizing its program directives which should be available for approval to the full body by March.
  - The Standards and Best Practices (SBP) Committee is updating the housing service standards; updates for Transitional Case Management service standards will follow. Additionally, SBP will continue to build upon current case management services.
  - Operations will continue working on the Assessment of the Efficiency of the Administrative Mechanism (AEAM), maintaining operational support of the Commission, membership training, upholding the mentorship program, and updating policies and procedures as needed.
  - The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with DHSP is currently underway. A meeting with Dr. Green and Pamela Ogata will be scheduled to review their feedback.
  - The Consumer Caucus in cooperation with the other caucuses will continue its community engagement activities.

- C. Barrit addressed questions regarding having contingency plans if Ryan White Program funding is affected by federal budget cuts. C. Barrit reminded the Committee that the Chief Executive Office (CEO) discussed anticipated shortfalls during the County 2025 budget presentation and instructed Departments to partake in the budget curtailment exercise of 3%, 5%, and 8% budget cuts and its impact on programs. Separately, Congress passed a continuing resolution federal budget that expires March 14, 2025. Planning Councils (PCs) have received notices of partial funding. It was noted that programs that do not rely on Net County Costs (NCC) funds might not be as heavily impacted.
- The Committee had a robust discussion regarding ways to increase the effectiveness of meetings and being mindful of how we address each other. The Committee recommended using pronouns during roll call as a standard practice. Staff reminded the Committee to refer to the Code of Conduct to assist in running the meetings efficiently and to help mitigate uncomfortable situations.

The Committee reviewed the work plan. No changes were made.

#### b. 2025 Commissioner Training Schedule

The Committee reviewed the training schedule accessible <u>HERE</u>. C. Barrit informed the Committee that the completion of quizzes for each training is required to receive a certificate of completion. Trainings conducted by other organizations that align with commissioner training requests will be forwarded to commissioners by email. The Committee reviewed the chart highlighting the 2024 trainings completed by each commissioner in the meeting packet.

- C. Barrit reported that HOPWA will look for a replacement for Matthew Muhonen's seat vacancy and will provide monthly reports at the Commission meetings in the interim.
- The Committee discussed mandatory participation of providers at Commission meetings. C. Barrit issued a reminder that agency participation in COH meetings is being addressed in the draft MOU between DHSP and COH. DHSP contracts contain language about provider attendance at COH meetings. Audits are done to monitor compliance, and Corrective Action Plans are written for providers that are not in compliance, however, there are no punitive measures outlined. The Committee requested to have a directive in the MOU that increases provider attendance at Commission meetings in the hope of creating an opportunity for providers to receive direct dissemination of information from commissioners that can be used when assisting the clients they serve.
