





What is a Shirt Tag?

A tag heat applied to typically the inside neck area of the shirt

Cost effective way to brand your apparel





What Should be on a Shirt Tag?

Make sure to include the following information on the label:

- Your company name and/or logo, including your business website
- Apparel size
- Material content: Percentage of cotton, polyester, etc.
- Country of origin: Where the apparel was made
- Identification of the manufacturer: Company name or Registered Identification Number (RIN)
- Care instructions: Text and/or symbols on how to wash and dry the apparel





Care Instructions



Laundry instructions for transfers

- Do not directly iron
- Do not dry clean
- Recommend avoiding hot water/high heat dry cycles
- Independently tested through 50 wash/dry cycles
- Wash inside out optional it can't hurt, does reduce abrasion
- Fabric softener will last longer without use
- Oxy products will last longer without use
- Bleach will last longer without use



Best Ink Color for Your Shirt Tag


Two Options

- 1. Choose a neutral color such as grey that will work on dark and light shirt
- 2. Do a color change and print half in black and half in white



Best Transfer Type For Your Shirt Tag

The material of your apparel determines the transfer you should use





Best Shirts to Use

Look for apparel with a tear away tag

Suggested t-shirt styles:

- Port & Company PC54
- Gildan 5000
- Jerzees 29B





Setting Up Your Shirt Tag with All Sizes

- Create one label
- 2. Duplicate and position on sheet (Use Object/Duplicate)
- 3. Change shirt size if needed
- 4. Create a row
- 5. Use Object/Duplicate to fill the sheet
- 6. Order how many of that sheet set up you need




Sheet Sizes by Transfer Type

Screen printed: 11.25" x 14"

UltraColor™ Soft: 11.5" x 18"


Water Based: 12" x 19"

Setting Up Your Shirt Tag with All Sizes



On each sheet:

- 6 Small
- 6 Medium
- 6 Large
- 6 XL
- 6 XXL
- 6 XXXL


So if we place the order for 10 sheets, that gives us 60 of each size label for a total of 360 labels

Shirt tag layout templates in Easy View


Customize a pre-made layout with your company and apparel information

Create your shirt tag in another art program and upload your file





Applying your Shirt Tag

- Heat press is needed for application (no irons)
- Easiest to use a cap press
- Is using a flat shirt press, raise print area with a print perfect pad, or foam mouse pad, a little larger than the transfer
