### Introduction

LEAs and SSAs are required to provide notification and obtain targeted parental consent before accessing a child's or parent's public benefits or insurance.

#### Parent Consent & SHARS

Why do we have to get parental consent?

Effective March 18, 2013, federal regulations required public agencies to obtain a one-time consent before it accesses the child's or parent's public benefits or insurance in the future.

#### Parent Consent & SHARS

What changed and does this impact my district?

HHSC clarifies that if a district does not have parental consent on file for a Medicaid-enrolled student, then it may not:

- submit interim claims on that student, or
- include student in SHARS Cost Report ratios

#### Parent Consent & SHARS

What happens when my district is non-compliant?

If your district does not have parental consent on file for all students the district will bill for Medicaid...

- potential reduction in IEP ratio for the cost report
- potential reduction in specialized transportation ratio for the cost report
- potential reduction in one-way trip ratio for the cost report
