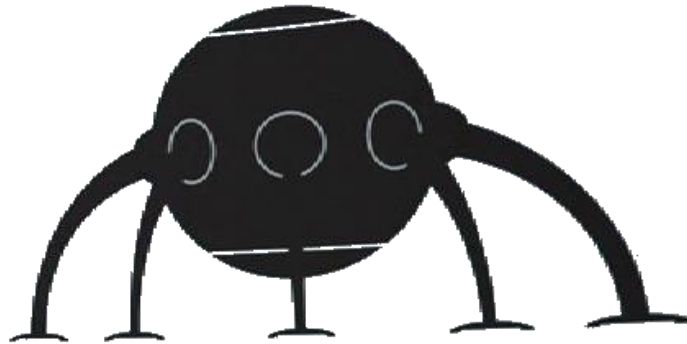


Day to Day Duties
