Before seeing your diabetes educator, you may need to see an endocrinologist.

Education is an essential component of the management of diabetes. While diabetes education classes alone can be the only intervention needed for some patients, many others may need to be evaluated by an endocrinologist before being seen by a diabetic nurse educator.

You may need to see an endocrinologist if you have any of the following:

- A new diabetes diagnosis
- Uncontrolled blood sugar
- Elevated hemoglobin A1c
- · An active infection or active wound
- A need for advanced equipment (pumps, sensors, etc.)
- A complicated or unusual illness
- · Obesity or are seeking to lose weight

Patients who suffer from obesity and seek to lose weight may still benefit from an endocrine evaluation but can also seek dietary education with the help of a registered dietician. There are registered dieticians available at Baptist Weight-Loss Center.

Once evaluated by the endocrinologist

Patients with diabetes seen by an endocrinologist will become part of the Baptist Medical Group – Endocrinology comprehensive program that includes medical management, diabetes education as well as dietary counseling.
