When we launched Every Heartbeat Matters (EHM) in 2014, our bold goal was to impact the global burden of heart valve disease by the education, screening or treatment of 1 million underserved people around the world by 2020. At our all-employee event in February of 2020, we proudly recognized our 60+ charitable partners who not only made the achievement of this goal possible, they also helped us exceed it, with more than 1,700,000 underserved people impacted.

Throughout this process, our employees and charitable partners conceived of even more impactful, focused ways we could unite to help underserved patients. The result is a new commitment that is even bolder.

We will improve the lives of 2.5 million additional underserved structural heart and critical care patients by the end of 2025.

This next phase of EHM addresses each stage of the patient journey, from detection to treatment, and now through recovery. The initiative will broaden the focus from heart valve disease to all structural heart diseases and critical care support. We've also enhanced our product donation program which provides EHM partners with access to donated Edwards products to provide humanitarian treatment for underserved patients outside the U.S.





The Faces of Every Heartbeat Matters

A new future

While in grade school in rural Haiti, Emmanuel began to have trouble breathing – even a walk across a room caused pain and exhaustion. He was finally diagnosed with severe heart valve disease. Hope rose, then crashed, when a scheduled charitable surgery in the U.S. was cancelled. Fortunately, EHM partner Haiti Cardiac Alliance was able to coordinate life-saving surgery for Emmanuel in the Dominican Republic, performed in collaboration with EHM partner Mitral Foundation. Emmanuel is now back in high school studying biology, with a new dream to become a cardiologist himself, and return the gift of life to heart valve patients throughout Haiti.



The ripple effect

Dr. Li was drawn to cardiology because he believed in the noble opportunity to improve people's lives. While China has advanced medical care in many of its larger cities, more than 40 percent of the country's population has little access to life-saving surgeries. This is why Dr. Li is thankful for the training opportunities brought to China through the American College of Cardiology, a longtime charitable partner of EHM.



Dr. Li gained insights on diagnostic and surgical techniques for underserved heart valve patients and shared this newfound knowledge with peers throughout his hospital, creating a lasting ripple effect of improved care.

Back with her family

Chekki was a schoolteacher in the mountains of Nepal when she started having trouble breathing. Her condition deteriorated so fast, her husband and family had to carry her down the mountain so she could then be taken to a hospital. Unable to afford the heart surgery she needed, she took medications, and became even weaker. Fortunately, a friend told her family that EHM partner CardioStart was sending a medical team to Nepal. Her case was reviewed, and Chekki received free treatment. Today, she has returned to teaching with renewed energy. To everyone involved she says, "Because of you, I've received a new life!"

Edwards employees have long been avid supporters of Working Wardrobes, a non-profit partner in Orange County that helps men, women, young adults and veterans overcome all kinds of challenges as they work their way to successful employment.

When Working Wardrobes itself experienced a devastating fire, Edwards, together with our Orange County friends, stepped up to help. On the Edwards campus in Irvine, employees set up donation bins and gathered men's and women's apparel appropriate for job interviews and day-to-day workplace attire. Refurbished computers were donated to help Working Wardrobes' clients continue their skill-building education, and employees also donated financial support, which could be matched two dollar per one dollar by the Foundation.

In a matter of days, substantial funds were raised and employees delivered the clothing to help restock the inventory destroyed by the flames.

While it will take some time to rebuild completely, Working Wardrobes is already helping its clients find their way back to meaningful work.



A World Of Impact

GAA scores refreshed clubs

When Edwards established a new location in Ireland, we brought our commitment to giving back too. One of many ways Edwards employees have already had an impact on local Irish communities is through support of four different Gaelic Athletic Association (GAA) clubs. With deep understanding of the Irish culture, GAA clubs unite communities through Gaelic sports, Irish culture and the Irish language. A combination of financial and volunteer support resulted in the refurbishing of four different club locations. Facilities were repainted and repaired, grounds were revitalized, and when the work was done, a community fun day (including free heart screenings) celebrated everyone's accomplishments.

When the Edwards Sales and Marketing team gathered for an annual meeting, not only did the future of Edwards get a boost, so did a lucky group of underserved educators and school children in the tiny mountain village of Pedawa, Bali.



As part of the meeting, the Edwards team filled 600 backpacks with school supplies, wrote personal notes, and gathered materials for the teachers. Then, in partnership with the Bali Children's Foundation, the backpacks and supplies were donated to the enthusiastic community.

New opportunities roll in



Before receipt of their chairs, they would often have to rely on crutches or self-crafted means of support to move beyond their homes or immediate surroundings. The Other Challenge of COVID-19: Hunger

The Situation

According to World Food Program, global hunger could double as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. That's why Edwards Foundation and our volunteers worked to strengthen food banks around the world. Here are three ways Edwards and our employees united to address the need for food in our communities.



From One Home to Many

While 1 billion people in India were on lock-down, one Edwards employee found an extraordinary way to give back. From his own kitchen, he prepared and distributed food to 100 families in need each week. And dozens of animals too!

Campus Café Serves OC Community

While much of Orange County was in quarantine, including most of Edwards' Irvine-based employees, the crew at the Edwards Irvine campus Café switched from feeding Edwards employees to feeding the local community instead. Local charity partners identified those in need and arranged to pick-up and deliver more than 400 meals each day. One of the community partners, the Illumination Foundation, reported back to the café crew that the meals were, "Delicious, amazing, crazy good, and yummy!" But perhaps the best comment of all was that, "Even the kids love it!" Now that's a recipe for success.



A World of Difference

Edwards employees have provided direct assistance to those who face hunger in many ways. Some have created food drives and helped supply local food banks.



Others have organized drive-through food donation programs. Many have contributed to local relief efforts. In addition to these heartfelt acts of personal kindness, the Edwards Foundation has quickly made resources available to organizations around the world to support those who need help most. We are fortunate to have been able to help feed underserved communities in Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Costa Rica, Czech Republic, Dominican Republic, India, Israel, Japan, Puerto Rico, Singapore, and in the United States in California and Utah.
