July 2021 Commentary

Market conditions were more volatile in July, as growth concerns and a sell-off in the reflation/reopening trade were eventually reassured by strong company updates, and an apparent broken link between Covid-19 infections and hospitalisations. We expect markets to remain choppy as investors grapple with Delta variant angst, peak valuations, and the inflation debate. However, positive updates from many companies suggest that the second half of the year will see benefits from the ongoing reopening of European economies.

In a busy month for company results, the fund rose with the A accumulation NAV per share increasing from 112.9041p to 114.5162p. Some of our housing and reopening plays issued positive earnings releases. Cairn Homes and Aedas Homes are both seeing a pick-up in activity as housing markets continue to recover. Sales pipelines are strong and improving house prices are supportive for the second half and beyond. Fnac Darty, the French retailer, saw sales growth of c20% year-over-year despite ongoing lockdowns continuing to impact operations. Siemens Healthineers and Relx both posted solid numbers, and doValue reported that they have been awarded c€5 billion of new mandates in the first half of the year, which are an early indication of the expected growth in the non-performing loans stock triggered by the pandemic.

On the negative side, Fresenius Medical Care continues to struggle in the current environment. Encouragingly, conditions are stabilising as Covid-19 related excess mortality continues to decline and c70% of patients have now had at least one vaccine. Fagron shares were also weak in the month although we believe it should benefit from a pick-up in elective care in the second half of the year.

We initiated a new position in offshore wind turbine installation company, Cadeler, during the month. Cadeler operates in a part of the fast growing wind industry where there is likely to be a bottleneck over the medium term, and has some of the most technologically advanced installation vessels. As a result, we expect its utilisation rates to be high over the next decade and for it to generate substantial amounts of free cash flow.

About the fund

The fund aims to have approximately 30-40 holdings*. The team seeks to generate returns by identifying high quality companies that have a long term sustainable competitive advantage, with potential to generate growth over time. At the point of entry, the valuation of the company is attractive to the fund managers, either because it has fallen out of favour in the short term, or because it is "off the radar" of many other investors.

Investment objective

The investment objective of the fund is to generate income and some capital growth over the long term (5 years or more), principally by investing in transferable securities of European issuers. We aim to ensure that at least 75% of the fund's assets are invested at all times in equities issued by companies based in a Member State of the EU, in Norway, Iceland, Turkey, Switzerland, Russia or the UK. The remainder will be invested in government securities, fixed income, closed ended collective investment schemes/vehicles (which may include those managed and/or operated by the Authorised Corporate Director (ACD) and which will provide exposure to various asset classes including equities and bonds), real estate investment trusts, money market instruments, deposits, cash and near cash.

The fund will not have any particular industry or economic sector focus and as such weightings in these may vary as required.

His investment career began in 1999 as a European equity analyst at UBS Asset Management. In 2008, he moved to Franklin Templeton Investments where he managed the €3 billion Franklin European Growth Fund and related mandates. Between 2014 to 2020, he was Head of European Equities at Syz Asset Management, managing a range of Pan European and Europe ex. UK funds, including the Oyster Continental European Income Fund.
