Your dog may be at risk and require regular protection from **roundworms**, **hookworms**, **whipworms**, **ticks** and **fleas**.

As your dog loves to find all sorts of tasty treats, your dog may be at risk for **tapeworms**. Ask your veterinarian if you live in an endemic area for *Echinococcus multilocularis* or *Echinococcus granulosus*.

Depending on your geographic area, your dog could be at risk for **heartworms** and require appropriate seasonal protection.
