## Your future career

Prepare for the competitive graduate employment market with expertly combined employability skills and practical learning opportunities to help you succeed.

Many courses at the University offer **access to simulated real-life work environments**. You can even choose to take an embedded work placement as part of your degree.

The **careers service is also on hand to support you** with internships, job searches and work placements.

Plus, with plenty of **part-time employment opportunities on campus**, you are able to earn money and gain valuable work experience that complements your studies. The Teesside University Students' Union alone employs over 150 students every year.

## Your future experience

We offer an **integrated CAS (iCAS)\*** so you can study for your pathway programme and university degree with only one visa application. This will save you both time and money, and it means there is no requirement for you to return home between your programmes if you don't want to.

We want to make sure that you are **set up for your degree at Teesside University**. So, when you successfully complete your programme, if you go on to enrol on an undergraduate programme at Teesside University, we will provide you with digital equipment to aid your learning.

Through Teesside University Advance, you will **receive an Apple iPad and keyboard**, credit for learning materials and lecture-capture technology upon successful progression to the University (eligibility criteria apply).

## Your future plan

Planning for your future means being financially conscious. Teesside University **offers affordable tuition fees**, and the cost of living is considerably lower than other areas of the UK.

**Accommodation starts from just £75 a week**. Prices in Middlesbrough are, on average, 55% lower than London (Numbeo – September 2022).

There are also a number of **scholarships available** if you exceed your progression grades, ensuring that progressing onto your degree remains affordable.

# Where is Teesside University International Study Centre?

Teesside University International Study Centre is based on a friendly, town-centre campus in Middlesbrough, a large town in north-east England.

The campus occupies a **single site in the heart of the town**, with all university buildings within walking distance. It's very easy to explore the town too. Middlesbrough offers an interesting history, access to culture, and striking nearby scenery.

**There has been £270m invested in the University campus** over recent years, with plans to invest a further £300m. This means you will benefit from a world-class, digitally enabled teaching and learning experience while at university.

## Cost of living

As well as being close to the University, **Middlesbrough is a very affordable place to live**. Prices in Middlesbrough are, on average, 55% lower than London (Numbeo - September 2022).

- **A £13.2 million student life building** where all the university's student-facing and wellbeing services are located

- **An international Plus TATE gallery, MIMA, one of the UK's leading galleries** for modern and contemporary art which enables links between students and national and international artists and institutions.

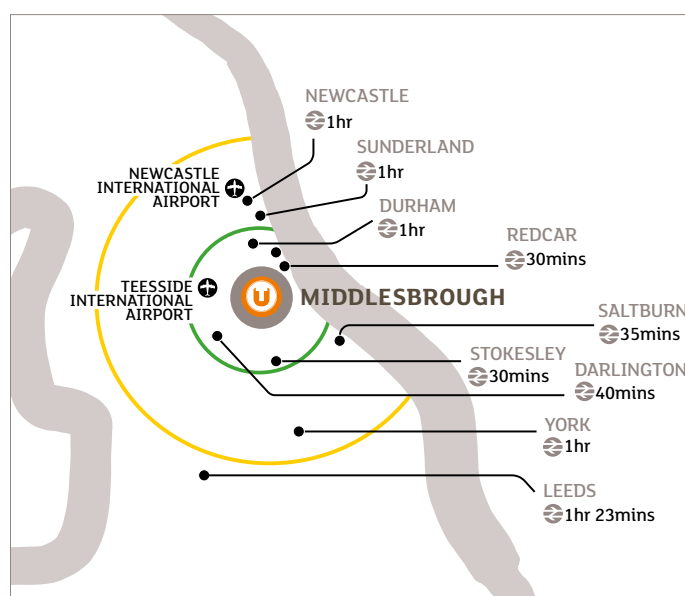
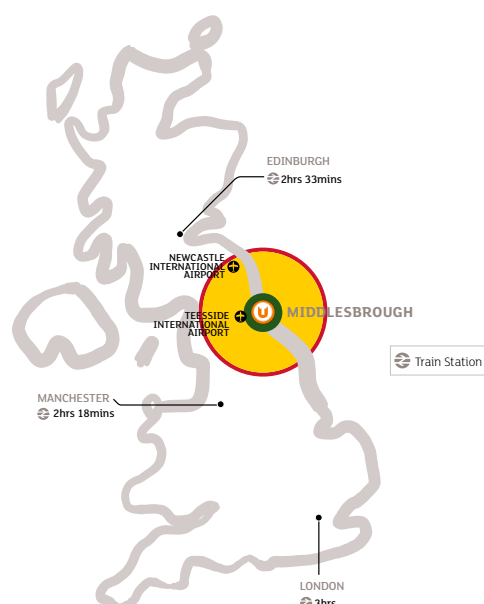
In order to arrange on-campus accommodation, please **request it on your application form** and our Central Student Support Team will contact you directly regarding the options available.

## Arranging your own accommodation

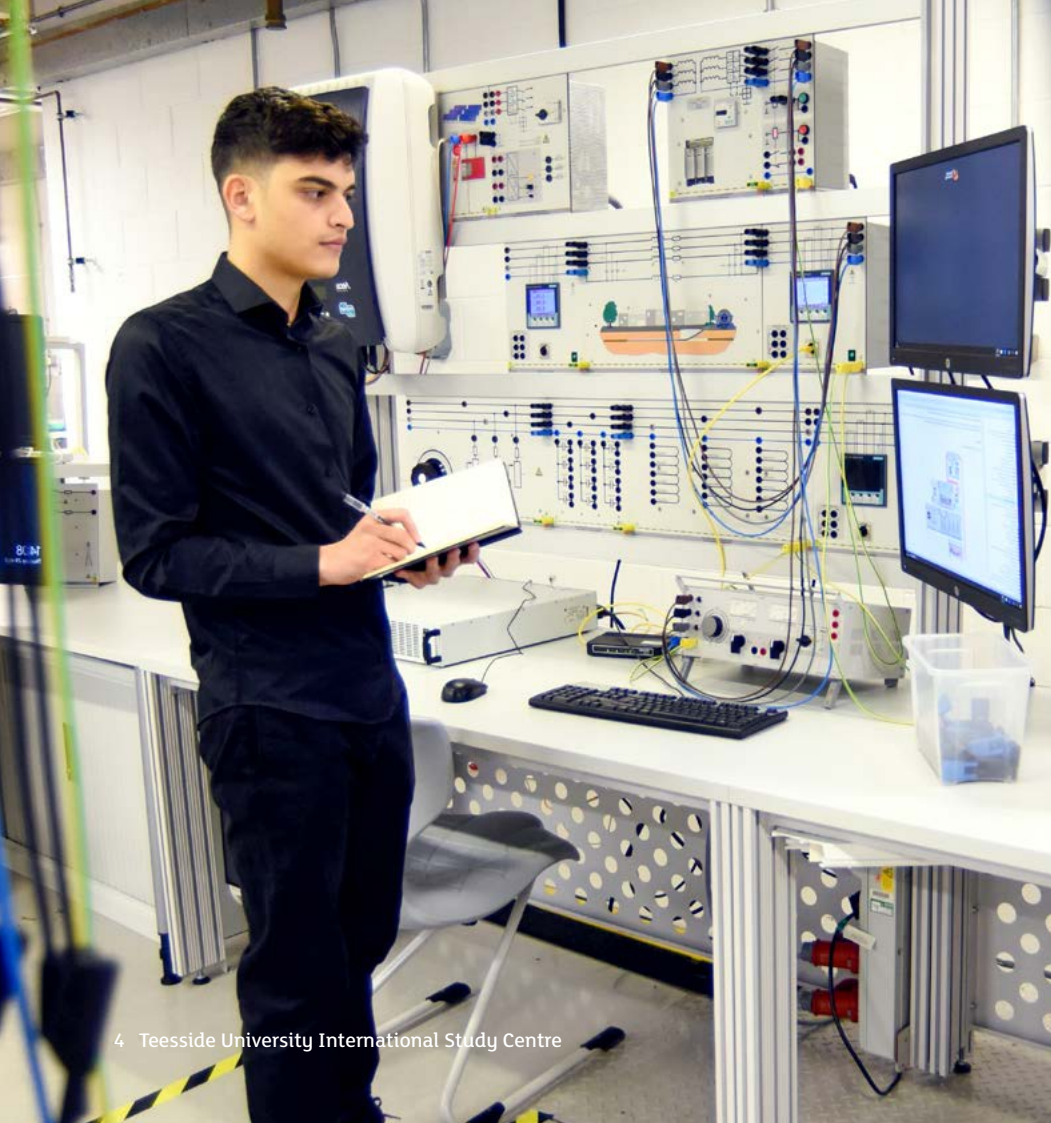
