How to switch to an eVisa guide

What is an eVisa and why is it required?

- The UK Visas and Immigration Service (UKVI) is moving to a digital immigration system.
- Physical visas such as Biometric Residence Permits (BRPs) and Visa vignettes will be replaced with an electronic record called an eVisa.
- Your BRP will expire on 31 December 2024. This does not affect your immigration status to stay and study in the UK.
- The expiry is set to this date because BRP's are being replaced by eVisas at that time.
- You will be able to access the details of your immigration status, such as visa expiry date, online through a UKVI account.

How do I switch to an eVisa?

- You will need to create your UKVI account first and you can access your eVisa.

- Once you've created your UKVI account you will be able to sign in to the <u>view and prove service</u> to access your eVisa. (https://www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status)

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQS)

1. How much does it cost to switch to an eVisa?

It's free.

2. What do I need to create a UKVI account?

You will need:

- 1. access to a smartphone.
- 2. a mobile phone number.
- 3. an email address.
- 4. your BRP card or a valid passport with your BRP number or visa application number.
- 3. I have switched to an eVisa, what should I do with my BRP?

The UKVI advised that you keep your BRP and continue to use it when travelling in and out of the UK until it expires.

4. When do I need to switch to an eVisa by?

The deadline for completing the switch to an eVisa is 31 December 2024.

5. I have obtained an eVisa, what should I do next?

Please let your centre staff know as we are required to have a record of your eVisa. You will be able to sign in to the view and prove service to access your eVisa and generate a Share Code so that the centre can check your immigration status.
