

UNDERGRADUATE FOUNDATION PROGRAMME IN LIFE SCIENCES — PATHWAY TO MEDICINE

This programme is designed to prepare you for a medicine degree at the University of Aberdeen[†].

Once you complete your pathway programme and follow a highly-competitive selection process*, you will then begin the first year of a five-year Medicine MBChB at the University.

Entry requirements:

Academic: Good high school graduation grades (including Chemistry plus two other sciences from either Biology, Maths or Physics)

English language: Academic IELTS for UKVI 6.0 (5.5 in reading and 6.0 in other skills)

Age: 17+

PROGRESSION DEGREES

Medicine MBChB

- † Each year there are up to 20 places available for this programme at the International Study Centre. Offers will be made on a first-come-first-served basis, subject to you meeting the English language requirements and being on track with your predicted grades/school report to meet the academic entry requirements.
- * Due to the popularity of the MBChB degree, progression is competitively awarded and is dependent on achieving the required academic and English grades, as well as performance in the online University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) and at multiple miniinterviews. You will also be required to write a personal statement as part of the application, as well as submit an academic reference from your Personal Academic Tutor. If you do not gain a place following the selection process, you will be able to select an alternative degree in the area of Life Sciences (subject to achieving the required grades).

INTERNATIONAL YEAR TWO

This programme provides an accelerated route to the third year of a four-year undergraduate degree at the University of Aberdeen.

You will join the second year of your degree at the International Study Centre. By completing this three-term programme and achieving the required grades, you are able to progress to the University of Aberdeen and complete the final two years of your undergraduate degree.

You can choose from two pathways, depending on your intended progression degree:

- Business Management and Finance
- Computing Science

How to apply


If you would like to apply to study at the University of Aberdeen International Study Centre, you will need to complete an application form and submit the relevant documentation.
