CAREERAHEAD

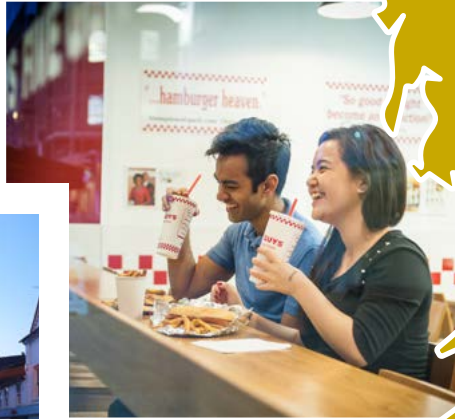
EXPLORING SURREY

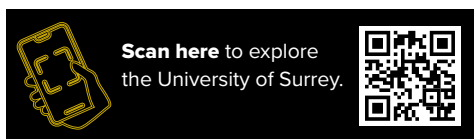
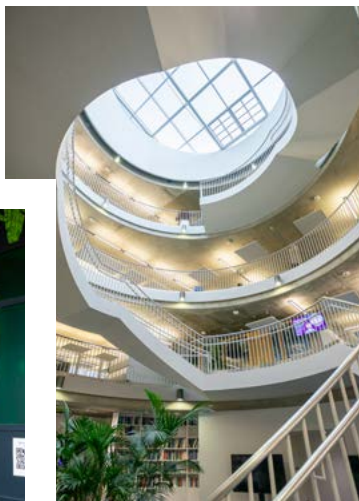

“The university campus, there are so many things. There is a nice view of the lake. If you want to just relax a bit between lectures, just go there, sit down on a bench, listen to music, take a break.

The university library is great for studying if you really want to focus on something and get it done. There’s a lot of facilities for engineering that you have access to such as a laser cutter, a 3D printer and just a whole array of different things.

There are a bunch of different restaurants on campus that provide for different dietary requirements. For example, I only eat halal because I’m Muslim. Simply Fresh, Young’s Kitchen and Wates House all offer halal options on campus. There’s also a pray room, so there’s everything you might need in a day at the university.”

We are committed to ensuring you reach your full potential and have a wonderful student experience at Surrey and the International Study Centre.

From the moment you arrive, if you need any support, information or guidance, our friendly on-site team at the International Study Centre are available to offer help every step of the way.

OUR ACCOMMODATION

Living in university accommodation is a great way to meet new people, spark friendships and adjust to university life. Accommodation at Surrey is arranged in groups of self-catered housing called Courts of Residence. All accommodation has been carefully designed to provide a comfortable and safe living space you can make your own.

Prices start from **£73 per week** for a shared, split-level room. Prices increase depending on accommodation type, up to a studio flat option from **£244 per week**.

*All accommodation is subject to availability. The cost shown is intended as a guideline and is subject to change. The cost of your room will be confirmed in your tenancy agreement.





SURREY ACCOMMODATION AT A GLANCE

- › More than half of our accommodation is on the Stag Hill campus, with a third of rooms having en-suite shower and toilet facilities.
- › Elsewhere, Manor Park is about one mile away (a 20-minute walk or a short cycle ride), with about 2,500 rooms, a café and easy access to our Olympic-standard facilities at Surrey Sports Park.
- › You will find communal areas with TV rooms, mail racks and friendly staff.
- › All residents benefit from broadband internet and belongings insurance.
- › All residences are non-smoking.
- › Most accommodation is mixed-gender, but you can request to live in a single-gender flat or floor if you wish.
- › Specially adapted rooms are available for students with physical disabilities.

As soon as you've received a Confirmation of Enrolment Letter from our Admissions team, you're eligible to begin your application for accommodation.

INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION YEAR

The International Foundation Year is a programme of academic subjects, study skills and English language training designed specifically for ambitious international students aiming to study at the University of Surrey.

Successful completion of your International Foundation Year programme is your pathway to an undergraduate degree from one of the UK's most prestigious universities.

INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION YEAR ESSENTIALS

You can begin your International Foundation Year in either September or January. Once you have achieved the required progression criteria, you can then progress onto your chosen degree the following September.

You can choose one of three routes:

- Business, Economics, Law and Social Sciences
- Computing, Engineering and Physical Sciences
- Life Sciences

ASSESSMENT AND COURSEWORK

You will be assessed through examinations and coursework, which could take the form of a presentation or extended essay.

PROGRESSION CRITERIA

You will need to achieve an overall average grade of 65 - 70% or above to progress from the International Study Centre. Some degree subjects may also require an interview with academic tutors at the University.

We will support you throughout your International Foundation Year to make sure you achieve your best and progress successfully to your studies at Surrey.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE PREPARATION

Our English Language Preparation programme provides specialist teaching and support to help you achieve the necessary English language level to start your International Foundation Year with confidence.

*A selection process is in place for students aiming for BVMSci Veterinary Medicine and Science as follows:

- Students will need to submit a UCAS application by the relevant deadline.
- 4 weeks of work experience (including one week of clinical work) is required prior to UCAS application.
- An interview is required during the International Foundation Year and offers are made based on performance at interview.
- Students will need to achieve the required academic and English grades.

If you are not offered a place on BVMSci Veterinary Medicine and Science, you can progress onto BSc (Hons) Veterinary Biosciences (subject to achieving the required academic and English progression grades).

**There are limited places on BSc (Hons) Nutrition and Dietetics and there is a selection process during the International Foundation Year:

- Students will need to submit a personal statement via the Surrey portal by the relevant deadline. Suitable applicants are invited to an interview. Offers are made based on your personal statement and performance at interview.
- Students will need to achieve the required academic and English grades.

If you are not offered a place on BSc (Hons) Nutrition and Dietetics, you can progress onto BSc (Hons) Nutrition and Food Science (subject to achieving the required academic and English progression grades).

PRE-MASTERS PROGRAMME

This course is an intensive programme of academic subjects, study skills and English language preparation. The length of your programme and your intake date will depend on your level of English. It has been designed specifically to prepare you for study at the University. Successful completion of the Pre-Masters programme is the pathway to a postgraduate degree from one of the UK's most prestigious universities.

You can begin your Pre-Masters programme at multiple points throughout the year, depending on your English language level. You can progress onto your chosen degree at the next intake date, when you have achieved the required progression criteria.

If you are starting the 3 or 2.5 semester programme, when you complete the first semester (10 weeks) or 0.5 semester (5 weeks), you will be assessed internally to ensure you have reached the required B2 level in order to progress to your final two semesters.

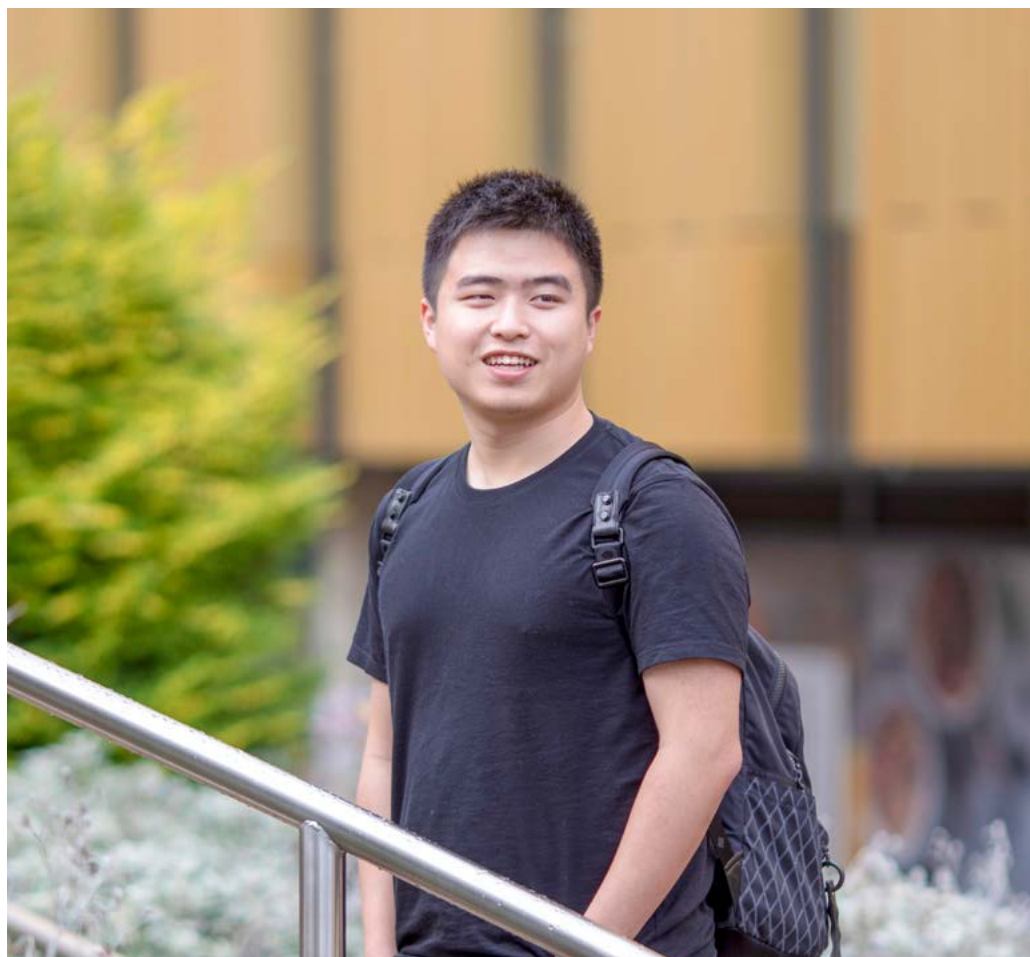

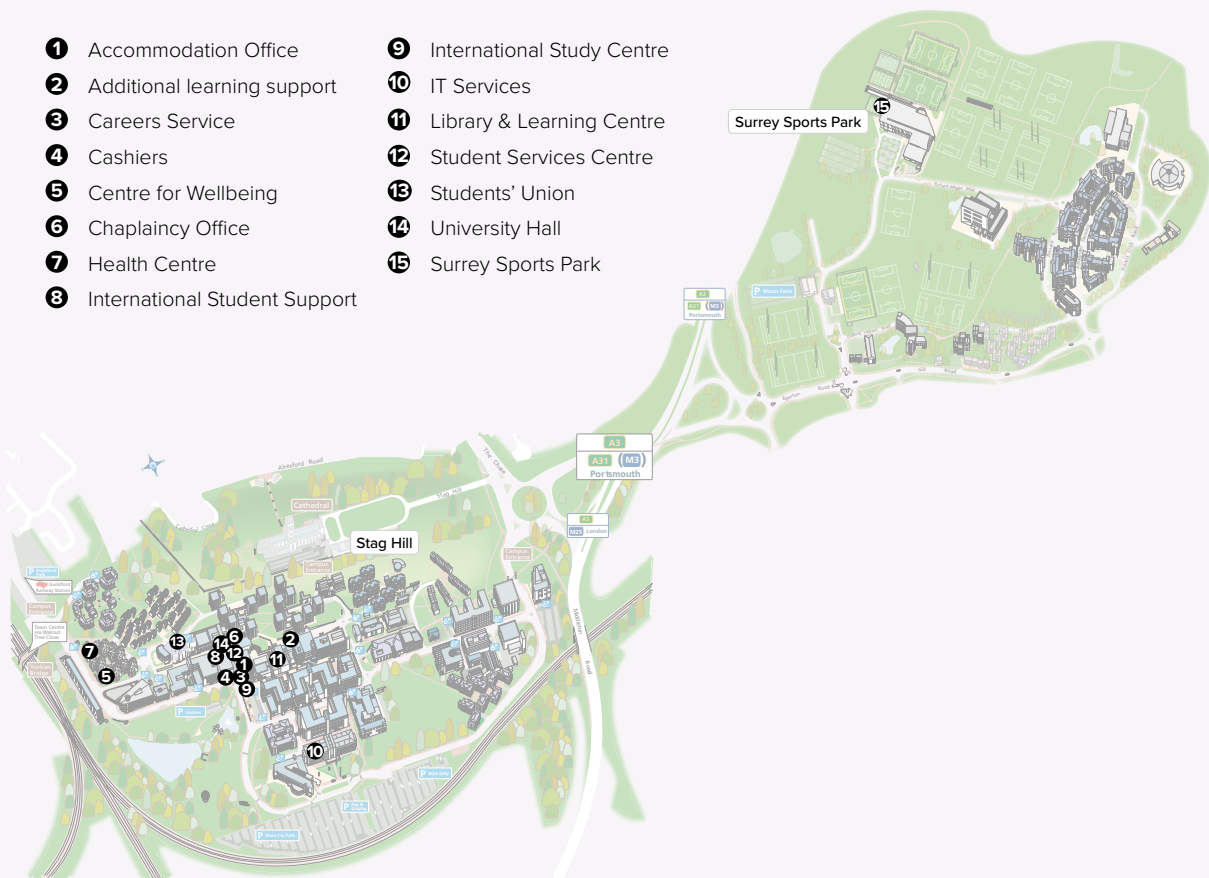
