Where is Teesside University International Study Centre?

Teesside University International Study Centre is based on a friendly, central campus in Middlesbrough — a large town in North East England.

The campus occupies a single site in the heart of the town, with all university buildings within walking distance. It's also very easy to explore the town. Middlesbrough offers an interesting history, access to culture, and striking nearby scenery.

There has been £270m invested in the university campus over recent years, with plans to invest a further £300m. This means you will benefit from a world-class, digitally enabled teaching and learning experience while at university.

- · All bills are included.




Arranging your own accommodation

Benefits of choosing to study your progression degree at Teesside University London

- Teesside University London has its own unique teaching style. You study one module at a time in six-week blocks, meaning you can focus on one subject before moving on to the next. All of your assessments are included within these study blocks so there's no requirement to study over the holidays.
- · There are no traditional university exams.
- Contact hours are compressed into two or three days, giving you space in the week for part-time work or other commitments.
- · All courses are delivered by industry experts.
- The campus is located in a dynamic learning and enterprise heavy community. You will be surrounded not only by other students, but by industry leading professionals as well as emerging start-up operations.

Campus location

Teesside University London is based in Stratford at Here East, which is part of the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park. Here East is an innovation and technology campus, home to an array of locally owned food and coffee outlets, as well as a gym, spa, barbers and retro video-game bar.

Accessibility

- The nearest tube station is Stratford (Central, Elizabeth and Jubilee lines as well as the Docklands Light Railway and overground), which is a 20-minute walk away from the campus.
- The nearest overground train station is Hackney Wick, which is less than a 10-minute walk from the campus.
- · You can get a free shuttle bus from Stratford International or Stratford City Station to the campus.
- If you're a cyclist, the campus is well-connected to local cycle paths allowing you to easily commute and explore the local area.


How to apply
