



The University's campus is located within sight of the Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. This setting provides a peaceful and natural environment where you can concentrate on your studies or take time out to relax with your friends.

LONDON ON YOUR DOORSTEP

London, one of the world's greatest cities, is less than 40 minutes away by train. Whether you want to see a West End show, go on a sightseeing tour, visit a museum or enjoy a night out with friends, Guildford is an ideal base from which to explore the capital city.

EXPLORING SURREY

Surrey is rich with heritage and culture. Famous attractions such as Hampton Court, Windsor Castle and Kew Gardens are all easily accessible. Outstanding sporting venues are also close by, such as tennis at Wimbledon, rugby at Twickenham, horse racing at Epsom and Ascot and cricket at the Oval. OUR ACCOMMODATION

Living in university accommodation is a great way to meet new people, spark friendships and adjust to university life. Accommodation at Surrey is arranged in groups of self-catered housing called Courts of Residence. All accommodation has been carefully designed to provide a comfortable and safe living space you can make your own.

Prices start from £85 per week for a shared, split-level room. Prices increase depending on accommodation type, up to a studio flat option from £289 per week*.

*All accommodation is subject to availability. The cost shown is intended as a guideline and is subject to change. The cost of your room will be confirmed in your tenancy agreement.

SURREY ACCOMMODATION AT A GLANCE

- → More than half of our accommodation is on the Stag Hill campus, with a third of rooms having en-suite shower and toilet facilities.
- → Elsewhere, Manor Park is about one mile away (a 20-minute walk or a short cycle ride), with about 2,500 rooms, a café and easy access to our Olympicstandard facilities at Surrey Sports Park.
- → You will find communal areas with TV rooms, mail racks and friendly staff.
- → All residents benefit from **broadband** internet and belongings insurance.
- → All residences are non-smoking.
- → Most accommodation is mixed-gender, but you can request to live in a singlegender flat or floor if you wish.
- → Specially adapted rooms are available for students with physical disabilities.

As soon as you've received a Confirmation of Enrolment Letter from our Admissions team, you're eligible to begin your application for accommodation.

INTERNATIONAL **FOUNDATION YEAR**

The International Foundation Year is a programme of academic subjects, study skills and English language training designed specifically for ambitious international students aiming to study at the University of Surrey.

Successful completion of your International Foundation Year programme is your pathway to an undergraduate degree from one of the UK's most prestigious universities.

INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION YEAR ESSENTIALS

You can begin your International Foundation Year in either September or February. Once you have achieved the required progression criteria, you can then progress onto your chosen degree the following September.

You can choose one of three routes:

- → Business, Economics, Law and Social Sciences
- → Computing, Engineering and **Physical Sciences**
- → Life Sciences

ASSESSMENT AND COURSEWORK

You will be assessed through examinations and coursework, which could take the form of a presentation or extended essay.

PROGRESSION CRITERIA

You will need to achieve the required grades for progression to your chosen degree. A limited number of degrees may also have a selection process.

We will support you throughout your International Foundation Year to make sure you achieve your best and progress successfully to your studies at Surrey.

I think there's the common misconception of the higher you go in education, the less teachers care, but for the International Study Centre, from the very beginning to end the teachers and staff, make sure that you are okay academically, as well as emotionally. That you know they're always there to help and you should take that opportunity to reach out and get help if you need to."


