## Gospel Reflection by Fr Michael Tate.

## Fully Grounded Humans—with relevance to the Season of Creation.

In storytelling genre, the inspired author of Genesis portrays God forming the first human creature from 'dust from the ground', which is 'Adamah' in Hebrew. The very breath of God is breathed into its nostrils. It has a soul so as to share the gift of Divine life.

But before we become too heady, we find that the human being is called 'Adam' which means 'earth creature'. Human beings are created 'earthy'.

Pope Francis says: 'We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth (cf Gen2:7); our very bodies are made up of *her* elements, we breathe *her* air and we receive life and refreshment from *her* waters.' (2 Laudato Si' italics added). Where did the recurring '*her*' come from?

Listen to St Francis of Assisi in his Canticle of the Creatures:

'Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with coloured flowers and herbs.'

This leads Pope Francis to say '... Our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us.' (1 Laudato Si').

If this way of putting it is true (as I believe it is) then the degradation and wanton destruction of the environment is surely a type of domestic violence in our common home. It is family violence.

ARCHBISHOP PETER COMENSOLI has provided a quote for The Age (last weekend) concerning many unanswered questions regarding the proposed Victorian Roadmap, especially the implications for places of worship.

"Spiritual wellbeing is as important as psychological and physical wellbeing. Lockdown has affected Victorians deeply, no less for the thousands of people of faith who have not been able to attend worship or receive the sacraments of the Church.

We have been very flexible throughout this pandemic, but are urging Government and health authorities to make clear what the end goal is after we hit 80% full vaccination status.

It would be a tragedy if two classes of citizens, the vaccinated and the unvaccinated, were to emerge and be entrenched as we look towards a COVID-normal goal. In our faith tradition, all the available vaccines in Australia are permissible to receive, and our clergy and people are strongly encouraged to be vaccinated.

We believe we can achieve ways that allow both vaccinated and unvaccinated people to worship in-person safely, and are working with other faith leaders to bring those proposals to the table."
