When words fail

We could pause for a moment to relax and to allow the Spirit to express our plea in a way which could never be put into words.

New period of lockdown. We are all conscious of the renewed difficulties and anxieties as we endure a second period of COVID-19 lockdown. Frs Martin and Shymon have been asked to prepare a letter to all parishioners acknowledging the current situation and how, as Christians, we bring to this time of trial our hope and trust in our loving God, and how we seek in faith, hope and love to reach out to those in need, especially at this time. The letter will be made available on our parish website and will be delivered to those parishioners without internet access.

<u>Parish Website.</u> The parish website remains a critical avenue of communication during this time of extended lockdown. New information is added weekly including the parish newsletter, together with many resources that enable parishioners to participate prayerfully in our live streaming Masses, as well as other opportunities for prayer and reflection. Our parish schools were invited to contribute news about the children's learning in our newsletters.

<u>A Missionary Parish.</u> The team discussed the recent video organised by the Melbourne Archdiocese in which Fr Stephen Langridge from London spoke about a missionary parish and our role as missionary disciples. The video link is available on our parish website and is highly recommended to all parishioners. Fr Stephen speaks about the missionary parish as one which is outward focussed and invites people in to the life of the parish to share in Christ's evangelising mission. The team resolved to make this a focus for our work as we move forward.
